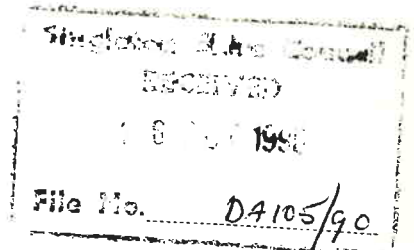

PROPOSED GLENNIES CREEK COLLIERY

We, the undersigned, are the owners of land affected by the development application lodged by Maitland Main Collieries Pty. Limited in respect of the proposed Glennies Creek Colliery in respect of which application notice was recently advertised in the Singleton Argus.

We wish to record our objection to the granting of development consent on at least the following bases:-

1. The development of the mine will sterilise the effective commercial use of our property.
2. The impact of noise and dust will severely prejudice the enjoyment of our property for both:
 - i. residential purposes;
 - ii. conduct of our existing farming activities;
 - iii. conduct of our existing grazing activities;
3. The proposed development of the mine and the associated surface facilities which are proposed to be in close proximity to our property will be aesthetically unattractive and will have a consequent deleterious impact upon our property.
4. The Environmental Impact Statement accompanying the development application does not sufficiently deal with the policy of the applicant with regard to impacted lands;
5. The Environmental Impact Statement accompanying the development application does not address our interests especially with respect to the question of the provision of adequate means of transport of both heavy equipment and employees to and from the development as we believe the existing road network is inadequate for these purposes.

6. The Environmental Impact Statement accompanying the development application does not sufficiently deal with the question of water pollution into the water-ways which run through our land and also the impact on our land of polluted run-off water.
7. The Environmental Impact Statement accompanying the development application does not sufficiently deal with the impact of light emanating from the mine, which would be in close proximity to our property and more particularly our residence and the effect this will have upon our enjoyment of our property.
8. The Environmental Impact Statement does not sufficiently deal with the impact of mines subsidence and more particularly the impact that such subsidence may have upon our property.

AND we reserve the right to raise further matters at a Commission of Inquiry.

AND we hereby formally request that there be a Commission of Inquiry in respect of this development conducted pursuant to the provisions of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act.
