Subject: Berrima Cement Works (DA401-11-2002-i) - New Supplier of SWDF

Dear Mr Johnson

I refer to your correspondence dated 24 February 2022 notifying the Department of a new supplier of solid waste derived fuel (SWDF) for use in Kiln 6 at the Berrima Cement Facility (post approval matter DA401-11-2002-i-PA-26). It is noted the documents were submitted to the Planning Secretary in accordance with Schedule 2, condition 1.4H of the consent (DA401-11-2002-i, as modified).

The Department notes that Boral carried out an audit of the Benedict Recycling Facility at 33-39 Riverside Road, Chipping Norton, in February this year, which included completing the 'Supplier Capability Assessment' appended to the approved 'QA/QC Procedure for Receipt and Use of Solid Waste Derived Fuels' (Appendix 1 of the consent, as modified). In accordance with condition 1.4H of the consent, it is acknowledged that Boral has certified that Benedict Pty Ltd are in compliance with the requirements set out in the approved QA/QC Procedure with respect to the supply of wood waste for the use as a non-standard fuel in Kiln 6.

The Department has carefully reviewed the documentation submitted on 24 February 2022 and subsequent information submitted on 31 March 2022 in consultation with the Environment Protection Authority. The Department is satisfied that Boral has met the requirements of condition 1.4H of the consent with respect to the certification of Benedict Recycling as a new supplier of SWDF.
