The sections of the guide relate to the parts of the development application (DA) form where you may need to attach additional information. If you need additional help in completing your application, please contact the Department of Planning.

2. Describe what you propose to de

You need to include a brief description of the proposed development, detailing the major

components of the development. e.g. 'Construct and operate a solid waste landfill at the former [name] quarry. The proposal includes a private access road and administrative and support infrastructure. The proposed capacity of the site is 5 million tonnes of waste, and ABC Pty Ltd seeks approval to accept 100,000 tonnes per annum of inert putrescible and industrial waste from the [name] area.

3. Plants of the lacid and development Gaissist in DA 6 ml

You need to include a site plan of the land and the plans or drawings of the proposal to show what you intend to do.

The site plan is to be drawn to scale and show:

- the location of the land, the measurements of the boundaries of the land, the size of the land and which direction is north
- existing vegetation and trees on the land
- the location and uses of buildings that are already on the land
- the existing levels of the land in relation to buildings and roads
- the location and uses of buildings on sites adjoining the land.

The plans or drawings are be to drawn to scale and show, where relevant:

- the floor plans of any proposed buildings showing layout, partitioning, room sizes and intended uses of each part of the building

- the level of the lowest floor, the level of any yard or unbuilt area and the level of the ground
- the arrangements you have made for parking, where vehicles will enter and leave the site, and how vehicles will move about the site
- proposed landscaping and treatment of the land (indicating plant types and their height and maturity)
- proposed methods of draining the land
- in the case of development to which clause 2A of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation 2000 applies or if the development application is accompanied by a BASIX certificate (despite there being no obligation under clause 2A for it to be so accompanied), such other matters as any BASIX certificate for the development requires to be included on the sketch.

You will need to attach these additional plans, if applicable:

- an A4 size plan of the proposed building and other structures on the site if you propose to erect, alter or add to a building, and your development does not need to be advertised to the public. The Department can tell you if your development must be advertised. The plan is to indicate the height and external shape of the proposed building as it will be erected on the site and include details of other buildings or structures on the
- a plan of an existing building, drawn to scale, if your application involves building work to alter, expand or rebuild the building. The plan will allow the Department to assess whether any existing buildings must be upgraded for safety reasons.
