CORRIMAL COKE WORKS, NSW – STAGE 2A BUILT FORM (SSD-83789711) – REPLY TO REQUEST FOR ADDITIONAL INFORMATION ON HISTORICAL ARCAHEOLOGY

This letter responds to SSD-83789711 Response to Submission (RtS) by Heritage NSW (HNSW) on the 23 March 2026 (Ref.:HMS ID 13815) in relation of the Section 60 (HMS ID: 6161) and Section 140 (HMS ID: 6162) approvals for archaeological investigations at the Former Corrimall Coke Works site at 27 Railway Street, Corrimall, NSW:

Historical archaeology

Section 1.4 of the HIS states that the scope of works for the assessment is limited to built heritage and does not include an assessment of potential archaeological impacts. Heritage NSW notes that approval under the Heritage Act 1977 has been granted for archaeological investigations within the study area associated with previous development applications (our ref: HMS ID 6161, HMS ID 6162), however the extent of impacts to areas of archaeological potential and their relationship to the current proposal are not clear in EIS documentation.

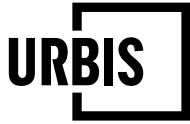
2. In order to demonstrate that the EIS has adequately considered potential impacts to historical archaeology, please provide information to clarify:

a. The identified archaeological potential within the Stage 2a Built Form study area.

b. What impacts and associated mitigation measures are currently approved.

c. The current status of archaeological investigations.

d. Whether additional impacts to any areas of archaeological potential are anticipated as a part of Stage 2a Built Form works



On-site archaeological investigations authorised by the relevant permits have been finalised and works are proceeding under the Unexpected Finds Procedure. The archaeological field work has not yet fulfilled the scope of excavation set out by the S60 and S140 approvals.

Please find short response for the above listed enquires below.

- a. Now that both test and salvage excavation are complete and the development substantially underway, the key archaeological features at the study site have been removed. Of the coke oven and flue system, all that remains are those elements intentionally conserved. Despite extensive testing, little in situ evidence of the tramway survived, it is also now considered to have nil archaeological potential. The remainder of the site may yet yield unexpected archaeological finds in the form of unmapped features related to the site's use as a coke works (please refer to attached Figure at the end of this letter).
- b. Impacts under SSD-83789711 can proceed with the unexpected Finds Procedure.
- c. Please see response to enquire 'a' above.
- d. No, as the remaining has low potential for unmapped features within the s140 boundary (HMS ID 6162 and HMS ID 6161)

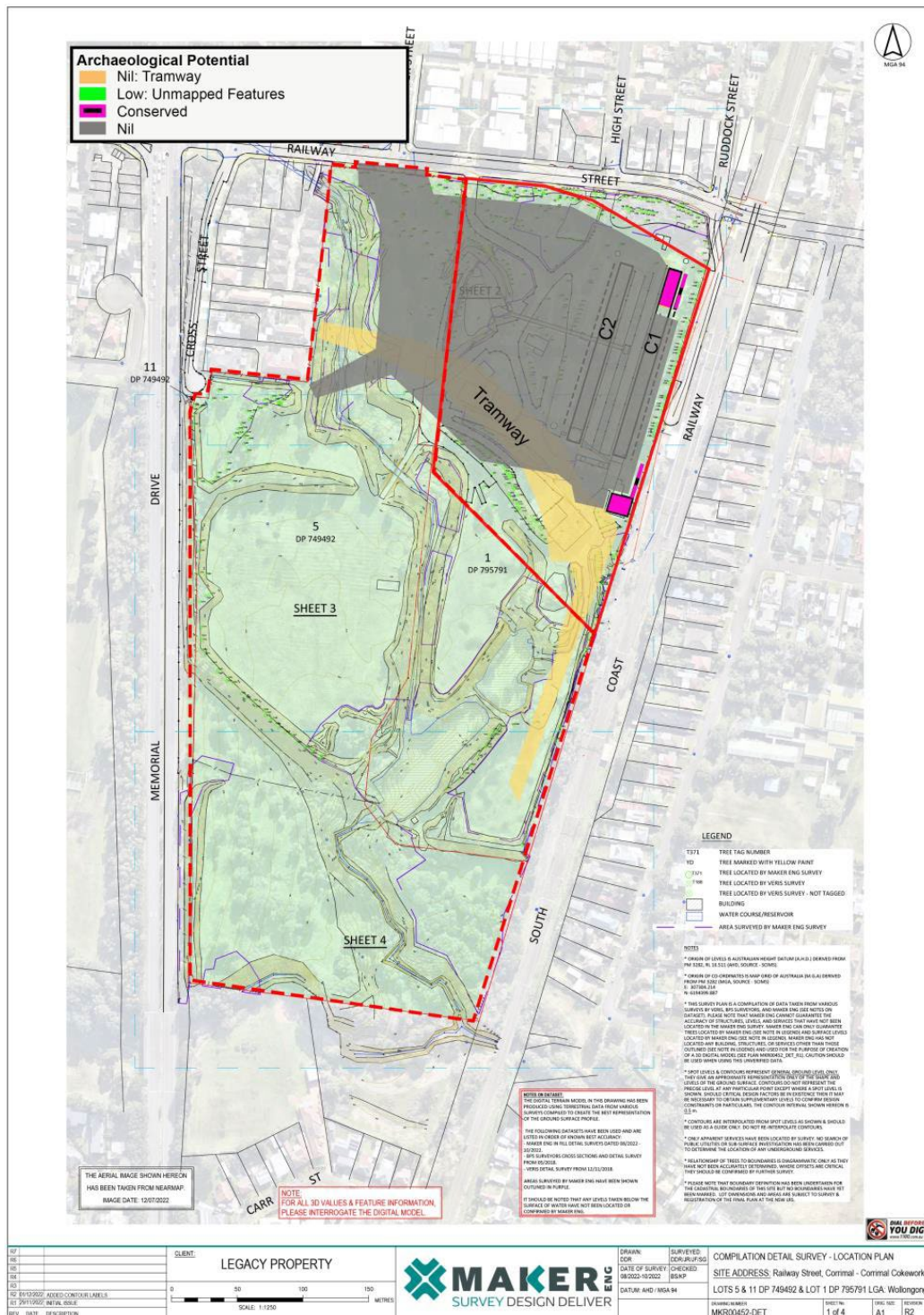


Figure 1 – Extract from Draft Excavation Report showing updated potential and conserved areas.
