Sorry, I have received a late comment from our environmental team.

Council would request that a condition of any modified consent requiring that any waste (including disposed wood chips from the biofilter) should be disposed of in a legal and approved manner at a facility that can legally accept it as per the legislation at the time of disposal. Where the woodchip is to be reused for another purpose such as rehabilitation of earthworks (such as within quarry sites), the material should be tested and classified to determine if it is suitable for its intended use as per the standards at the time of its removal.

It is noted that the applicant intends to operate fans at a higher capacity. Sometimes the pitch/frequency caused by fans can have more impact than the dB(A). This practice shall not cause disturbance to offsite receptors.
