Dear Ms Fu

Thank you for your email below requesting feedback from the Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA) on the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the UNSW Health Translation Hub, SSD-10822510 refers.

CASA has reviewed the Aviation Impact Assessment report by Avipro (Appendix N of the EIS) for the UNSW Health Translation Hub at Randwick Hospital and has no objections to the UNSW Health Translation Hub building.

CASA will assess the building and cranes in detail from an obstacle perspective under the Airspace Regulations on receipt of an invitation to comment from Sydney Airport.

The architectural drawings show the proposed building will be RL 126. 22m. The IASB building to the south has been approved to a height of 111m above Australian Height Datum (AHD) and the elevation of the helipad on the north east corner of the IASB building is approximately 101m above AHD. The Aviation Impact Assessment advises that the proposed building will not impact the IASB helicopter landing site, its approach and departure paths, or the Parking Position. CASA does not regulate helicopter landing sites outside an aerodrome. NSW Health Infrastructure and its specialist aviation consultant are the appropriate sources of advice regarding the helicopter landing site.

The Aviation Impact Assessment advises that construction cranes will temporarily protrude through the Sydney Procedures for Air Navigation Services – Aircraft Operations (PANS-OPS) surface in their final (higher) stage. It should be noted that any infringement of the PANS-OPS surfaces for more than three months (or less than three months without suitable mitigation) by a crane would present an unacceptable risk to the safety of air transport operations to and from Sydney Airport.

CASA does not comment on aircraft noise issues. All noise related enquiries should be directed to Airservices Australia. Further information is available at the following link:
