Hi All,

State Transit bus services have been impacted by similar projects in the past – Paddington in 2011, Light Rail Project 2016 till now and Coogee/Randwick in 2019. In all instances, the works coordinators provided us with an overview / TCP's of works prior to commencing work to identify which parts of the works programme impacted buses or bus stops. We were also provided with at least two weeks prior to work commencing at any of these identified sites. According to attached guide this works may impact STA services around St Peter and Marrickville area.

Our requirements remain consistent as with all works:

- Minimum lane width for passing buses 3.25m (3.5m preferred)
- Any bus stops temporarily relocated done so with the assistance of traffic controllers to assist our customers. The same kerbside meterage at existing Bus Zone/associated No Stopping draw-in or out needs to be provided at the temporary location (removal of parking and kept clear).
- Bus movements prioritised.

Should a diversion around a roadway be required due to the above conditions being unable to be met, we would require 6 weeks notice in order to alter our scheduling and passenger information data.

Hope this helps.
