

Biodiversity Development Assessment Report Waiver Request Powerhouse Parramatta (SSD 10416)

I refer to your correspondence received on 2 September 2020 seeking to waive the requirement to submit a biodiversity development assessment report (BDAR) with the above State significant development (SSD) application under section 7.9(2) of the Biodiversity Conservation Act 2016 (BC Act).

I note that the requirement for a BDAR was waived on 2 June 2020, however as the Environmental Impact Statement accompanying your SSD application sought approval to remove additional trees, the Department requested you submit a revised BDAR waiver request.

I have reviewed your revised BDAR waiver request having regard to Sections 1.5 and 7.3 of the BC Act and Clause 1.4 of the Biodiversity Conservation Regulation 2017, and have determined that the proposed development (SSD 10416), as described in your waiver request, is not likely to have any significant impacts on biodiversity values.

The delegated Environment Agency Head in the Energy, Environment and Science Group has also determined that the proposed development is not likely to have any significant impacts on biodiversity values in a letter dated 10 September 2020 and a copy of that letter is attached.

Therefore, a waiver under section 7.9(2) of the BC Act is granted for the proposed development and a BDAR is not required to accompany the SSD application.

If there are any further amendments to the proposed development, this BDAR waiver determination will not be valid. You will need to either prepare a BDAR or lodge a new request to have the BDAR requirement waived.

Determination under section 7.9(2) of the Biodiversity Conservation Act 2016

I, Anthony Witherdin, Director Key Sites Assessments, of the Department of Planning, Industry and Environment, under section 7.9(2) of the *Biodiversity* Conservation Act 2016, determine that the proposed development is not likely to have any significant impact on biodiversity values and therefore a Biodiversity Development Assessment Report is not required.

Proposed development means site preparation works including demolition; construction, operation and use of the Powerhouse Parramatta; public domain works; infrastructure works; and signage and as detailed in the BDAR waiver application dated 2 September 2020.

I refer to the request to waive the requirement for a biodiversity development assessment report (BDAR) to be submitted with the above State Significant Development Application for New Powerhouse Parramatta, at 34 – 54 and 30B Phillip Street and 338 Church Street, Parramatta.
