



Response to Cumberland City Council's Modification 2 Submission

This letter is in response to the food and public health conditions relating to the notification received from Cumberland City Council regarding the matters relating to parking, cooling/warming towers and the school kitchen/canteen. Australian Turkish Maarif Foundation's response is outlined below:

Engineering Comments:

2 - It is noted that community activity and events are proposed in the Operation Management Plan submitted as part of the application. Any community activity areas shall comply with the Auburn DCP 2010 parking requirements for function centres as shown below:

Function Centre - Whichever is the greater of:

- *15 spaces per 100 square metres gross floor area or 1 space per 3 seats.*

The Traffic Impact Report shall also be prepared to ensure proposed use will not have any adverse impact on traffic. The assessing officer should verify that the proposed community activity and events are acceptable as part of the proposed modification.

Australian Turkish Maarif Foundation (ATMF) accepts and acknowledges the requirements outlined within the submission put forward by Cumberland City Council regarding the parking space requirements outlined relating to community events. ATMF does not anticipate to arrange community events during Stage 2A of the project until Stage 2B, the main building is completed. Upon completion of Stage 2 main building, the parking spaces provided as part of Stage 2 building will exceed the requirements outlined by Council and the consent conditions relating to school and community events with more than 100 people will be in force.

Notification of Food Business

Prior to the issue of any Occupation Certificate, the owner of the business must notify Council of their food business details in accordance with the Food Act 2003 and The Australia New Zealand Food Standards Code – 3.2.2 – Food Safety Practices and General Requirements, Clause 4. Registration forms are available on Council's website www.cumberland.nsw.gov.au.

Australian Turkish Maarif Foundation accepts the response submitted by Cumberland City Council and acknowledges that a response is required as part of the assessment regarding a Food Business being carried out on the school premises.

International Maarif Schools of Australia will be providing a canteen service to the students and staff at the Gallipoli Campus upon the completion of Stage 3B, and until that time there will be no canteen facilities available for students and staff. Canteen services will be outsourced to meet the requirements of students and staff during school operating hours up until the completion of Stage 3B.
