Objection

Incinerators are incompatible with a circular economy - they reduce recycling rates and simply replace waste with greenhouse gases, air pollution and contaminated ash. The NSW Government must protect the health and environment of this region and reject the proposal for a waste incinerator in Tarago. If it is so safe, then why is it not being built in western Sydney, closer to where the waste is being generated? Tarago and Bungendore are farming country that should be developed in a sustainable manner, including in its role as a satellite town to Canberra. The incinerator is incompatible with the area and the wishes of the community. Previous attempts to build an incinerator in Fyshwick were objected to and this demonstrates commercial interests continuing to look for a commercial opportunity at the expense of Community wishes.

Once Woodlawn is filled and there is no return to mining, it will be remediated and returned to a natural state. Having an incinerator on site, it will be sustained long after the rehab of the site should have occurred and it returned to a natural state. There is no need for this incinerator.
