**SUBMISSION IN RESPONSE TO THE ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENT OF THE
HUMELINK PROJECT**


I hereby submit this response to the HumeLink Environmental Impact Statement report. Our property exists within the 2 km of the lines. (lot 266 DP 754111 Dalton). Transgrid said in May 2023 they were going to contact all neighbours within 2km. It is a failure to consult with the community, because we haven't been notified about the project that is impacting our views.

We object to the HumeLink proposal on a number of grounds, as follows:

- *Increasing the risk with bushfires by undermining ground and aerial firefighting options and potentially starting fires;*
- *Impeding agricultural operations – prohibiting:*
 - *machinery over 4.3m;*
 - *spray irrigation;*
 - *aerial operations (spraying/fertilising);*
 - *the use of drones; and*
 - *precision agriculture.*
- *Undermining tourism;*
- *Destroying visual amenity;*
- *Exposing communities to noise – the noise from HumeLink, in certain weather conditions, will exceed NSW Noise Guidelines night time criteria at 65 dwellings;*
- *Undermining regional development by taking the liveability, workability and beauty from impacted regions;*
- *Causing the loss of biodiversity (HumeLink is significantly impacting matters of national environmental significance) by taking critically endangered habitat from critically endangered species]; and*

Therefore we ask that the lines go underground. Undergrounding transmission is now best practise overseas.
