The cars exiting Loreto Normanhurst consistently block Osborn Road, making it an arduous task for us to exit our driveway. Despite our attempts, we often find ourselves stuck on the road, as drivers from LN frequently fail to yield. This situation is not only inconvenient but also unfair, should not have to leave home 40 minutes before school starts.

Our predicament continues on the return journey, where LN school buses obstruct Osborn Road. We are forced to wait until opposing traffic stops, allowing us to access the opposite side of the road and reach our driveway. We believe it is our fundamental right to have unimpeded access to our residence at all times.

The proposal to restrict the left turn after stopping raises serious concerns for us. Implementing such restrictions would exacerbate the traffic situation, and it is impractical and unfair to leave an hour early for school when it is just a short distance away.

In light of these challenges, I strongly oppose any further redevelopment of Loreto Normanhurst via or on Osborn Road and reconsider and abandon the proposal to restrict the left turn after stopping.

I appreciate your prompt attention to this matter and hope for a resolution that ensures the smooth and fair use of Osborn Road for all residents.
