This process leaves little time to review & analyse
the material. I observe that the exhibition period is

1. In the holiday period for schools & industry &
many affected & beneficial contributors may be
away at this time.
2. The time is cut off on Friday afternoon rather
than 303 Monday 27 January that would
leave submissions unattended & rob contributors
of valuable "free time" over the weekend.
- 3 The exhibition time frame is in breach of
the Interpretations Act 1987 & amended to
notice by mail to allow 7 working days
It appears only one day has been allowed
for the 14 day exhibition period.

Any consent issued may be invalid as a consequence.

The issues that I can raise in now limited time are -

1. LOCATION

I had argued that the stadium ought to have been built at the Homebush Olympics site.

The current site offers inadequate transport for large crowds. It is adjacent sensitive established residential areas causing loss of amenity under stadium operations. - noise, street parking, disruption by pedestrians, traffic congestion.

2. PARKING.

To counter the transport impediment we now have a car park option proposal - this proposal.

That is more traffic congestion & need for clearway notifications for each event.

3. MULTIFUNCTIONALITY.

The proposal is for a car park. It ought to have other functions to counter its major dormancy periods & the need for emergency shelter in times of catastrophic event occurrence.

The location is such that it may be vital as an emergency or overflow facility

These standby facilities are needed & the opportunity to design for & provide a multi purpose space should not be lost in this instance

4. HISTORY

The Archeological Research as so far had fails to mention the use of the Moore Park Area as a swamp land with swimming holes that were well used by local children, the later city garbage tip as fill & levelling, the City Zoo before its move to Taronga & the shifting sands continuous from Botany Bay

The issue then is the ground, its alteration & its water charged nature & the presentation of the Busbys Bore shaft & tunnel to the Public Domain.

5. GROUND WATER.

It is possible that like the current M6 tragedy of "sinkholes" or tunnel subsidence this site may have to a lesser extent ground water issues for any excavation. Basement type construction, to 3m depth ought to resist any water flow & not rely on infiltration & pump out systems.

6. FLOODING.

The site is likely flood prone or subject to flooding as happened at the prior Sydney Water site opposite where a car park was flooded when a large diameter water main ruptured.

7. CONSUMPTION OF LAND.

The design of the Stadium could have incorporated a car park under the playing field to avoid the loss of more open space.

8. USE OF SLANG.

It is not at all clear what boneyard or bump-in or bump-out means & should not be used in the description of the proposal.
