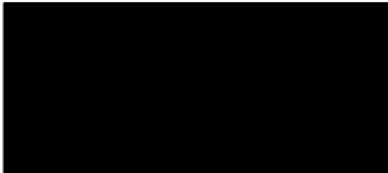


**SUBMISSION FROM J G BAILEY WITH REGARD TO THE PROPOSAL TO
REMEDiate THE THE MINING DAMAGE TO THE VITAL ENVIRONMENT OF THE
TOWNSHIP OF HORNSBY.**

1. THE PROPOSAL AS INDICATED ON THE CARD PLACED IN MY LETTERBOX OUTLINES A MINIMUM STANDARD, THAT IS, A REHABILITATION, OF THE MINE SITE RATHER THAN A **RESTORATION** OF THE AREA. THE QUARRY IS LOCATED IN THE CENTRE OF A FUTURE CITY. IT IS NOT PART OF THE HUNTER VALLEY.
2. THE LEVEL OF FILL SHOULD BE RAISED BY AT LEAST ANOTHER TWELVE METRES SO THAT THE LOCATION CAN BE SATISFACTORILY PLANNED TO BE COMMUNITY FRIENDLY.
3. SPOIL WILL BE GENERATED IN THE HORNSBY AREA FOR MANY YEARS TO COME. IF ENOUGH SPOIL CANNOT BE GENERATED FROM THE CONNEX PROJECT TO PROVIDE THE EXTRA FILL THEN IT MUST COME FROM OTHER LOCAL PROJECTS.
4. THE FILLED AREA MUST BE WELL DRAINED HAVING REGARD TO THE NATURE OF THE LOCAL GEOLOGY AND GROUNDWATER REGIME (PERMEABILITY AND POROSITY ETC).
5. PLANNERS MUST REMEMBER THAT HORNSBY PEOPLE BOUGHT THE QUARRY BECAUSE OF WRONGLY INTERPRETED STATE GOVERNMENT LEGISLATION OF THE TIME. THEIR FORCED PURCHASE IS VIRTUALLY THEIR CONTRIBUTION TO THE PUBLIC FACILITIES THAT ARE BEING PROMISED. THEIR CONTRIBUTION IS SIGNIFICANT.
