General Requirements	The Environmental Assessment must include • an executive summary; • a detailed description of the modification including the: – need for the modification; – alternatives considered; – various components of the modification; and – the likely inter-relationship between the proposed modification and the existing or approved mining operations in the region; • consideration of any relevant statutory provisions; • a general overview of the environmental impacts of the modification, identifying the key issues for further assessment, and taking into consideration the issues raised during consultation; • a detailed assessment of the key issues specified below, and any other significant issues identified in the general overview of environmental impacts of the modification (see above), which includes: – a description of the existing environment; and – an assessment of the potential impacts of the modification including potential cumulative impacts (particularly traffic and traffic noise) that may arise from the combined operation of the modified project, together with the other approved and existing mines in the region; • a description of the measures that would be implemented to avoid, minimise, mitigate, offset, manage and/or monitor the impacts of the modification, and how the existing environmental monitoring and management programs/plans at the Invincible Colliery would be revised to accommodate the proposed modification; • a Statement of Commitments, outlining environmental management, mitigation and monitoring measures; • a conclusion justifying the modification, taking into consideration the environmental impacts of the project, and the benefits of the project; and • a signed statement from the author of the Environmental Assessment report certifying that the information contained in the report is neither false nor misleading.
Key Issues	• Traffic and Transport – a detailed traffic impact assessment of the impacts of increased coal haulage on public roads, and the likely interactions with other approved, existing or proposed mines in the area • Noise – a detailed assessment of auger mining and road traffic noise impacts; • Surface and Groundwater; • Air Quality; • Greenhouse Gases – a full greenhouse gas assessment (including a quantitative analysis of the greenhouse emissions associated with the combustion of product coal, and a qualitative assessment of the impacts of these emissions on the environment); • Rehabilitation and Final Landform; and • Subsidence.

References	The Environmental Assessment must take into account relevant State and Commonwealth Government technical and policy guidelines. While not exhaustive, guidelines which may be relevant to the project are included in the attached list.
Consultation	During the preparation of the Environmental Assessment, you should consult with the relevant local, State or Commonwealth Government authorities, service providers, community groups or affected landowners. The consultation process and the issues raised must be described in the Environmental Assessment.
