I wish to express my disappointment and strongest objection to Council's decision to support the proposed recycling business at Moorebank, near George's Fair. Implications for the residents health, for noise pollution, extra traffic and truck congestion and the devastation of the native environment are just some of the serious concerns Council should have considered.

As a long-time rate paying resident of Chipping Norton I am tired of waiting for responsible and future-focused decisions to be made by successive Liverpool Councils.

The area along Newbridge Road from Bankstown Airport to Nuwarra Road has been and remains an 'eyesore'. It does not need another filthy and noisy recycling plant to confirm that Council does not take pride in the entry to the city of Liverpool. Unlike Liverpool Council, the surrounding councils of Campbelltown and Bankstown have exemplary gardens and neat and tidy grassed areas along the main roads that lead and gateway their city entrances. When will that happen along Newbridge Road? Certainly not while Liverpool Council is allowing further industry like the proposed recycling plant.
