**Peppertree Quarry (06\_0074)  
Approval for Temporary Trucking Agreement**

I refer to your letter dated 19 October 2020, requesting the Secretary's Approval to dispatch additional truckloads of quarry products in accordance with Condition A10 of Schedule 2 of the approval for Peppertree Quarry (06\_0074).

The Secretary has reviewed your request and notes that Boral is seeking a temporary increase to the maximum permissible truck movements under the consent, which would involve the dispatch of approximately 8 loads in one day using a rigid truck to transport approximately 80 tonnes of material for the purposes of developing park land in Marulan. The Secretary notes that the truck loads would be covered at all times and also reported in the Annual report.

The Department recognises that Boral's initial request indicated that the above truck movements were to be undertaken on 22 October 2020, however this date has now passed. Accordingly, the Secretary has granted approval for the temporary increase in truck movements to allow Boral to undertake the described truck movements over a single one day period between 2 and 13 November 2020.

It is requested that Boral provides the Department with 24-hours notice of the date that trucking will be undertaken.
