The Rosehill Recycled Water Scheme

Alinta is proposing to deliver a new recycled water scheme to take pressure off Sydney's drinking water supplies. The proposed Rosehill Recycled Water Scheme involves construction of a new water recycling plant and a 20 kilometre network of distribution pipelines through the Fairfield, Bankstown, Holroyd and Parramatta local government areas.

Scheme Overview

It is proposed to construct the water recycling plant on vacant land on the corner of North Street and East Parade in Fairfield. This land is currently owned by Sydney Water and is zoned for water infrastructure. The plant would use proven technology to filter partially treated wastewater and would be operated by Veolia Water, who is a recognised world leader in water services.

A 20km network of distribution pipelines would also be constructed through road corridors and areas of public open space. The proposal involves the conversion of 5km of isolated gas mains along Woodville Road to water pipes.

The scheme would only provide recycled water to high volume industrial users and irrigators in western Sydney and would not provide recycled water to individual residential properties for drinking, cooking, gardening or other household uses.

Planning Approval Process

The Rosehill Recycled Water Scheme is classified as a major project under *State Environmental Planning Policy (Major Projects) 2005* and requires approval from the NSW Minister for Planning under Part 3A of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

An environmental assessment is currently under way to identify potential social and environmental impacts associated with the proposal and inform the detailed design process for the scheme. It is anticipated that the environmental assessment would be lodged with the NSW Department of Planning for consideration in mid - 2008.

Subject to approval, construction could commence in late 2008 and would take approximately two years to complete. Recycled water would be available for use by the scheme's customers in 2011.

Community Consultation

Alinta is committed to consulting with the community and other stakeholders regarding the proposal. A community newsletter with information about the proposal has been distributed to approximately 25,000 letter boxes in the areas around where construction would occur. A copy of the community newsletter is enclosed for your information.

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
