PA 07 0127 Project Approval– Rehabilitation Management Plan Revision

Dear Mr Wood,

Castlereagh Coal (CC) reviewed the Invincible Colliery Rehabilitation Management Plan (RMP) in accordance with Schedule 5, Condition 5 of the project approval following the 2024 Independent Environmental Audit (IEA). CC has engaged environmental consultants Atlantech PTY LTD to assist with the revision. In addition, consultation with the Resource Regulator (RR) following a Revegetation Targeted Assessment Program (TAP) in December 2024 noted that there is a requirement to revise the risk assessments associated with the RMP. The RMP revision submission date of 28 June 2025 was requested on the 6 March 2025 and approval granted for the on 3 April 2025.

Castlereagh Coal now seeks a further extension to the revised due date. This request is based on the following reasons:

- Recent changes in key personnel, including the departure of staff responsible for environmental planning and compliance. This has temporarily affected the continuity of project activities.
- A review of the Rehabilitation Risk Assessment is currently being completed as required by the Resources Regulator Revegetation (TAP). The outcomes of this assessment will inform the necessary updates to the RMP. These updates will be incorporated alongside the recommendations from the 2024 IEA commitments.

Castlereagh Coal respectfully request a revised submission date of 28 September 2025. This additional time will allow for the incoming team to review existing commitments, engage with relevant stakeholders, and prepare a comprehensive and compliant document.
