

8.0 Workplace Interior Materials & Finishes

The workplace is defined by the qualities of texture, light and shade. The palette of finishes and overall look and feel is that of a raw, no-nonsense and substantial interior.

A polished concrete floor runs the length of the central street and defines the reception, staff breakout and a community space at the base of the atrium. Timber flooring is used to reinforce primary circulations routes on both ground and first floors. Base building elements are distinguished from the fitout insertions through the use of contrasting yet complementary materials and textures such as dark timber cladding to the amenities block and light plywood joinery.

Open plan works areas feature a neutral and timeless palette. Subtle visual stimulation is achieved through the use of workstation screens in varying scale and texture. Hot-desk, collaborative and breakout space distributed through the open plan work areas provide a diversity in materials and create visual interest through the use of resilient floors, feature ceilings, plants and screens.
