Thank you for your correspondence dated 26 February 2013, regarding the application to modify the Orica Villawood Soil Remediation Project to allow for construction of a 'contaminated' water storage pond and three treated water storage ponds.

Orica recently provided Bankstown City Council with a copy of the revised "Water Management Plan" (WPO4, Rev.2 dated 21.02.13) for comment. Council is aware that this revised Water Management Plan now incorporates further information and detail and addresses matters raised by the Contaminated Sites Section of the NSW Environment Protection Authority (EPA).

Therefore, as the NSW EPA has been closely involved with the review of the Water Management Plan as part of the EPA's Environment Protection Licence process, Council is confident that the documentation has been comprehensively assessed.

As a result, Bankstown City Council does not have additional comments to make with respect to the revised Water Management Plan and approves of the proposal to construction the water storage ponds subject to the requirements and approval of both the NSW EPA and Sydney Water.
