Notice of Application for Modification to State Significant Development Consent 09\_0182 by Boggabri Coal Operations Pty Ltd

Boggabri Coal Operations Pty Ltd has made an application on behalf of the joint venture participants to modify the State Significant Development Consent (SSD 09\_0182) for the Boggabri Coal Mine (MOD 10). MOD 10 seeks to progress mining operations towards the north-west of the currently approved development for the purpose of mining additional known coal resource. The modification application has been made under section 4.55(2) of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 (NSW).

Pursuant to clause 98(4)(b) of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation 2021 (NSW), notice of the modification application is hereby provided.

Site Description:

The Boggabri Coal Mine is located approximately 15 km north-east of Boggabri in the North West Region of NSW and is located wholly within the Narrabri Local Government Area. Open cut mining operations are currently approved to be undertaken at Boggabri Coal Mine until 31 December 2036.

**Modification Description: Boggabri Coal Mine Modification 10**

MOD 10 seeks to extend mining operations for an additional four (4) years (i.e. out to the end of 2040) and to progress mining activities towards the north-west and outside of the approved Mine Disturbance Boundary, however remaining entirely within the Boggabri Coal Mine Project Boundary. MOD 10 will facilitate the recovery of approximately 30 Million tonnes of additional Run of Mine (ROM) coal within the existing Boggabri Coal Mine Project Boundary and mining leases. MOD will not result in any changes to the currently approved mining methods, annual ROM coal extraction rate of up to 8.6 Million tonnes per annum, the operational workforce, nor the coal seams approved to be mined. Additionally, MOD 10 does not seek to change the approved operational hours, any mining related infrastructure, coal handling and processing activities, or transport methods and rates of access to the Boggabri Coal Mine.

Blue Boars' reserve

Narrabri Rugby Club will embark on a road trip to Inverell this Saturday in round six of the 2025 Central North Rugby Union campaign.

The Blue Boars' reserve grade coach Nathan Nott is determined to bring five points home to Narrabri as his men continue to push their way up the ladder.

They will not be able to finish this weekend on top of the table, given they are sitting 11 points behind the ladder leaders Moree, who are yet to be beaten in five rounds of footy.

However, they can climb from third into second if they get the job done and the Barraba Rams slip up at home against Tamworth Pirates.

Narrabri's first grade and women's 10s teams are currently both at the top of their respective ladders, and the third grade side is also cruising in second spot.

One of the Blue Boars' goals in 2025 is to win CNRU's club championship for the first time since 2015, and they

are currently in a prime position to get that job done if they continue to fire the way they have been.

Nott's reserve grade men impressed in their last start when they took down Tamworth Pirates 27-14 on home soil at Dangar Park.

It was 17-14 in the hosts' favour at the half-time break as a penalty goal scored by Matt Bradshaw stood out as the difference after both sides scored two converted tries each in the first half.

Liam Mair and Daniel McMillan crossed for the home side and Ratu leone Rokovucago bagged a double for the visitors.

Lachlan Wright and Nott then went over for a try each in the second half for Narrabri and the hosts managed to hold the Pirates scoreless to secure a 13-point win.

For Nott, it was the perfect response after they were nowhere near their best a week earlier in a 36-14 loss away from home against Barraba.

"I'm very, very happy with how that game went," Nott said.

"We didn't start the best. We were

down 14 points in that first half there, but we rallied together and slowly built our way back into it.

"We were patient, we didn't rush things, and we ended up getting a well deserved win.

"It was a completely different story than how we played the week before against Barraba. We didn't turn up to play that day, and as the game went on, we went away from our structures and lost ourselves.

"We ended up getting flogged in that game, but then to turn around a week later and put that performance in was incredibly pleasing and I'm proud of the way the boys played.

"I think that win has set us on the right path going forward.

"We've had a couple of wins and a couple of losses.

"We weren't at our best in round one out in Quirindi, and I thought we should have won that game.

"Now, after the Pirates win, I think everyone has the belief that we belong up near the top of the table.

The 2025 season is Nott's second as the Blue Boars' reserve grade coach.
