Please help us, the wombats, and the valley. There is only one week left to try to save them.

Two weeks ago we were finally given copies of the Environmental Assessment into the proposed Dargues Reef Goldmine at Majors Creek, four kilometres directly upstream from our property and even closer to the Nature Reserve and National Park partially surrounding us. The details revealed in it had not previously been made public.

The Dargues Reef Mine proposes to remove 66.2 megalitres of water per year from the local water table, leading to a drop in ground water levels of between 1.5 and 10.5 metres. This is an extraordinary and devastating amount.

Plants take their moisture from groundwater. Without it, they die.

Animals drink from springs, fed by groundwater. Without it, they die.

The result of taking this amount of water from an ecosystem will mean that it, too, will die.

No studies have been done for the Environmental Assessment on how taking this amount of water will affect the land beyond the actual mine site. There is no mention of the endangered, critically endangered and threatened species in the gorge below the mine, ranging from the Powerful Owl to the critically endangered eucalyptus Kartzoffina.

The mine proposal also includes a 25 metre high tailings dam to just four kilometres above us and the gorge, covering nine hectares. It will contain a toxic sludge that, if the walls break, will sweep everything before it, from our house to every plant and creature in the valley. 'World's best practice' is to have a secondary wall in case the first fails. This is not the case at the proposed Dargues Reef mine.

If this mines goes ahead the animals and plants of the valley may die. The wombat of Diary of a Wombat may die. As for myself- if the bush where I have lived and loved and walked for over 30 years dies around me, then what would be left would not be the Jackie French who had walked and studied and loved the bush community for more than 30 years.

If you have loved Diary of a Wombat; if you want to save the life and environment of the real wombat on whom the story is based; if my writing has moved you in any way and if you feel the need to preserve endangered species, or an area of such rich and varied habitat please email your opposition to the mine by close of business this Friday.

I have walked this land for over 30 years. I have drawn the inspiration for my work from the bush around me. To say I love it is inadequate. I am part of it; without it, the person I am will cease to be.

But I have choices. I can leave if the water turns toxic, if the sludge descends. I can buy water and have it tanked in. The wombats, the wallabies, the Powerful Owls- already isolated by surrounding human farms and settlement and starting to be affected by the environmental impacts of climate change - have no such choice. I owe this place too much not to at least try to defend it and its inhabitants now.

If you love wombats, the bush, or justice; if you believe that animals have a right to survival despite the benefits to humans from mining gold; if you think that long term investment in the bush, growing peaches or writing books is more valuable than a short term mining gain, spend just five minutes today emailing your objection to the Dargues Reef Mine.

If this mine goes ahead the animals and plants of the valley may die. The wombat of *Diary of a Wombat* may die. As for myself — if the bush where I have lived and loved and walked for over thirty years dies around me, then what would be left would not be the Jackie French who had walked and studied and loved the bush community for more than thirty years.

If you have loved *Diary of a Wombat*; if you want to save the life and environment of the real wombat on whom the story is based; if my writing has moved you in any way and if you feel the need to preserve endangered species, or an area of such rich and varied habitat please email your opposition to the mine by close of business this Friday.

I have walked this land for over thirty years. I have drawn the inspiration for my work from the bush around me. To say I love it is inadequate. I am part of it; without it, the person I am will cease to be.

The wombats, the wallabies, the Powerful Owls — already isolated by surrounding human farms and settlement and starting to be affected by the environmental impacts of climate change - have no such choice. I would like to object to the mine proposal.

As a wildlife carer and conservationist I have grave fears to the project for the following reasons:

? No assessment has been made on the loss of ground water beyond the two square kilometre radius of the mine ? Australia is the driest continent yet plundering of groundwater continues. The amount of water required for this project: 66.2 megalitres of water per year, is enormous. This would lead to a drop in ground water levels of between 1.5 and 10.5 metres ? how can the local flora and fauna survive without access to groundwater.

- ? The limited focus of the assessment of the ecosystem below the mine? much of the ecosystem is already delicate. Projects such as this can seal the fate of threatened species. Australia has already destroyed too much of its environment? lets not continue this trend
- ? The quality of the area for those living in it ? i.e. increased noise, the concern of toxic waste contamination and reduction in ground water to name but a few
- ? The lack of a second wall on the tailings dam ? it would seem the global best practice has recommended a secondary dam wall be built in case of failure of the first.
- ? The site of the tailing dam ? just a few kilometres above a gorge which is renowned for its wildlife.

I would urge the NSW Department of Planning to extend the timeframe so that the questions raised by the Environmental Assessment can be further investigated. These issues would include:

I am extremely concerned at plans to mine at Dargues Reef. My concerns are outlined below and I would appreciate a swift and detailed reply to my concerns for this fragile environmental area.

No assessment has been made that addresses the impact of the Dargues Reef mining project on the groundwater system. A detailed assessment needs to be made to look at the effect of the mine on the groundwater beyond the 2 square kilometre radius of the mine. This assessment also needs to investigate the effect of the proposed mine on the ecosystems below the mine. These ecosystems are both fragile and threatened and need to be conserved and protected.

In order to be thorough and detailed these assessments need more time to answer the many environmental questions which pertain to this area. They would need at least a year to allow for variations in climate especially for rainfall, and to make sure that all animal species are present during the assessment period.

In addition there need to be tests to determine the impact of drilling on the groundwater. Test bores need to be drilled 2-6 kilometres down from the mine site which will test the impact on the drilling on the groundwater over at least a year in order to allow for variations in rainfall.

The endangered and critically endangered flora and fauna of the area up to 4 kilometres below the mine site need to be the focus of a detailed environmental assessment. A year or more assessment will ensure that migratory species and species such as the endangered powerful owl - which is identified by its calling in the winter season - are included in the assessment.

This area also includes heritage and Indigenous sites up to 6 kilometres below the proposed site and the tailings dam. The Dargues Reef Mine proposes to remove 66.2 megalitres of water per year from the local water table, leading to a drop in ground water levels of between 1.5 and 10.5 metres. This is an extraordinary and devastating amount.

Plants take their moisture from groundwater. Without it, they die.

Animals drink from springs, fed by groundwater. Without it, they die.

The result of taking this amount of water from an ecosystem will mean that it, too, will potentially die.

No studies have been done for the Environmental Assessment on how taking this amount of water will affect the land beyond the actual mine site. There is no mention of the endangered, critically endangered and threatened species in the gorge below the mine, ranging from the Powerful Owl to the critically endangered *Eucalyptus kartzoffina*.

The mine proposal also includes a 25 metre high tailings dam to just four kilometres above adjacent prirmary producing properties and the gorge, covering nine hectares. It will contain a highly toxic sludge that, if the walls break, will potentially sweep everything before it, from local houses to every plant and creature in the valley.

World's best practice' is to have a secondary retention wall in case the first fails. This is not the case at the proposed Dargues Reef mine. This in itself is totally unacceptable practise and must also be addressed.

I request more time for these and other questions raised by the Environmental Assessment to be investigated, including test bores 2-6 kilometres downstream from the mine site, to test the impact of drilling on the groundwater over a period of a year, to allow for variation in rainfall.

A Desperate Message from Jackie French

Please help us, the wombats, and the valley. There is only one week left to try to save them.

Two weeks ago we were finally given copies of the Environmental Assessment into the proposed Dargues Reef Goldmine at Majors Creek, four kilometres directly upstream from our property and even closer to the Nature Reserve and National Park partially surrounding us. The details revealed in it had not previously been made public.

The Dargues Reef Mine proposes to remove 66.2 megalitres of water per year from the local water table, leading to a drop in ground water levels of between 1.5 and 10.5 metres. This is an extraordinary and devastating amount.

Plants take their moisture from groundwater. Without it, they die.

Animals drink from springs, fed by groundwater. Without it, they die.

The result of taking this amount of water from an ecosystem will mean that it, too, will die. No studies have been done for the Environmental Assessment on how taking this amount of water will affect the land beyond the actual mine site. There is no mention of the endangered, critically endangered and threatened species in the gorge below the mine, ranging from the Powerful Owl to the critically endangered eucalyptus Kartzoffina.

The mine proposal also includes a 25 metre high tailings dam to just four kilometres above us and the gorge, covering nine hectares. It will contain a toxic sludge that, if the walls break, will sweep everything before it, from our house to every plant and creature in the valley. 'World's best practice' is to have a secondary wall in case the first fails. This is not the case at the proposed Dargues Reef mine

If this mines goes ahead the animals and plants of the valley may die. The wombat of Diary of a Wombat may die. As for myself- if the bush where I have lived and loved and walked for over 30 years dies around me, then what would be left would not be the Jackie French who had walked and studied and loved the bush community for more than 30 years.

If you have loved Diary of a Wombat; if you want to save the life and environment of the real wombat on whom the story is based; if my writing has moved you in any way and if you feel the need to preserve endangered species, or an area of such rich and varied habitat please email your opposition to the mine by close of business this Friday.

I have walked this land for over 30 years. I have drawn the inspiration for my work from the bush around me. To say I love it is inadequate. I am part of it; without it, the person I am will cease to be.

But I have choices. I can leave if the water turns toxic, if the sludge descends. I can buy water and have it tanked in. The wombats, the wallabies, the Powerful Owls- already isolated by surrounding human farms and settlement and starting to be affected by the environmental impacts of climate change - have no such choice. I owe this place too much not to at least try to defend it and its inhabitants now.

. If you love wombats, the bush, or justice; if you believe that animals have a right to survival despite the benefits to humans from mining gold; if you think that long term investment in the bush, growing peaches or writing books is more valuable than a short term mining gain, spend just five minutes today emailing your objection to the Dargues Reef Mine.

To whom it may concern,

I was greatly concerned to learn recently that the environmental assessment into the Dargues Reef mining project was conducted without consideration of the impact this proposal will have on groundwater beyond the immediate vicinity of the mine, and potential impact of such groundwater pollution and/or loss on protected and threatened ecosystems adjoining the mine area. Groundwater impacts cannot be adequately assessed within close proximity of such developments but require analysis on a catchment and distribution network basis in order for ecological impacts to be accurately assessed.

In the light of the absence of the required environmental data, it seems appropriate to allow more time for further investigation into the environmental impact of this proposal, including test bores some kilometres downstream to measure the impact of drilling on groundwater. Such tests need to accommodate seasonal variation in rainfall, both to assess potential groundwater pollution and reduction on overall groundwater supplies.

The narrow geographic and seasonal scope of the current assessment may not be adequate to fully assess the impact of the proposal on wide-ranging and seasonal species, such as the endangered powerful owl. A broader survey at other times of year, and for a greater distance below the mine site would be required to ensure that all potential impacts of the proposed venture have been adequately assessed. In addition, it may also be of value to further assess the heritage and Indigenous sites several kilometres down stream from the proposed mine site and the tailings dam.

There have been a number of high profile cases recently which have raised serious concerns about the current standards for environmental assessment of mining projects in New South Wales, particularly in relation to groundwater and impacts on surrounding lands outside the original impact assessment area. Groundwater loss and contamination is not an problem that can be readily rectified and the loss of threatened species and ecosystems, particularly in the current changing climate, is irreversible.

I urge you to strengthen the standards and quality of information required on the possible environmental impact of the Dargues Reef mining project, and to consider the potential environmental impact of the proposed mine on the surrounding region more broadly and rigorously to determine whether or not this proposal can adequately safeguard the surrounding environment and whether or not the project follows world best practice for such developments.

This area contains some of the most pristine and environmentally valuable waterways in the country of Australia. I have spent summer days watching platypus in the clear waterways and wombats wandering in search for feed during drought on spring nights. This area is also exremely vulnerable due to the frequent droughts that affect the fragile ecology. If the proposed Dargues Reef mining project were to go ahead, this would upset the balance and affect the populations of wildlife irreversibly.

Animals and birds drink from springs, fed by groundwater and their survival will be compromised by this un-researched proposal.

There is no mention of the endangered, critically endangered and threatened species in the gorge below the mine, ranging from the Powerful Owl to the critically endangered eucalyptus Kartzoffina.

I would like to make the point that we are NOT on the immediate groundwater table as the proposed mine.

The point I would like to make is that we are "Pitt Street Farmers" who have had this property for three years and even in that short time we have witnessed the effects of groundwater levels. We don't have a nice creek or river flowing through our property, we are spring fed. We are not at the mercy of people upstream.

We are the origin of our local creek. It starts with us.

We have a bore on our place and will only use it in desperate times because even to our untrained eyes we can see the effect it has if you use it. It may look great to have all your dams full but the surrounding land suffers.

If the land suffers the wildlife suffers, it's that simple. We didn't need a team of boffins to point that out, it is blatantly obvious even to city people like us.

We are extremely aware that we are the origins of the creek and that everyone downstream can be affected by what we do and our neighbour does and so on.

This mine is NO different.

You just can't take out the estimated 66.2 megalitres per year from this area and not have a negative effect in the immediate area as well as downstream. I'm sure the mine has promised to leave their area regenerated etc etc but what about three, four, ten kilometres downstream? Who regenerates that? If the ecosystem is run into the ground how many years will it take to bring the flora and fauna back to the same level?

Is the attitude "Who cares it will eventually come back"?

Deborah and I care. We are close to leaving the lovely Sydney. We would like to think we still have something special to go to.

It would be easy for us both not to care. We're Ok, no mine in our valley, we have clean water, no trucks thundering down our road running over the kangaroos and wombats (this WILL happen, they are small roads, there is nowhere go) but this is precisely why we are leaving Sydney. We are tired of the trucks, the dust, the cement and all the noise.

This is not just about tree hugging. We understand there will mines but the effects they have MUST be studied to the full extent using all available resources.

I would like to express my strong objection to the proposed Dargues Reef Goldmine Project. The removal of such a large amount of ground water will undoubtedly have a detrimental effect on the vegetation in the area. The vegetation in the area has managed to survive an extended period of drought thanks in a large part to the presence of groundwater. The lowering of the groundwater level will mean that most plants will be unable reach this valuable water source and die. The consequences of this are fairly obvious in that the vegetation in the area will die. This will not only have a disastrous impact on the wildlife in the area but it will also become a massive bushfire risk. Springs that provide fresh water for the wildlife will disappear.

It appears that there has not been a full Environmental Assessment on the consequences of removing this amount of water from this ecosystem. There is so much work being done at a national and international level that shows the vital necessity of preserving as much of the remaining native habitat as possible. The very idea of allowing project to go ahead without a complete and comprehensive study of the potential impact on the ecosystem is quite unbelievable.

What is even more unbelievable is that there is not adherence to best practice to contain tailings. In the light of the recent disaster in Europe with the collapse of a tailings dam wall it seems quite extraordinary that a project could be considered without secondary containment walls.

The Dargues Reef Mine porposal is particularly environmentally inappropriate and anyone who has spent any amount of time in this environmentally sensitive area would understand why such a proposal should not go be approved by Planning NSW.

The Dargues Reef MIne proposes to remove 66.2 megalitres of water per year from the local water table, leading to a drop in ground wate levels of between 1.5 and 10.5 metres. This is an extraordinary and devastating amout.

It would appear that no studies have been done for the Environmental Assessment on how taking this amount of water will affect the land beyond the actual mine site. There is no mention of the critically endangered and threatened species in the gorge below the mine, ranging from the Powerful Owl to the critically endangered *Eucalyptus kartzoffina*.

The mine proposal also includes a 25 metre high tailings dam, just four kilometres above environmentally sensitive valley and gorge. It will contain a toxic sludge that, if the walls break, will sweep everything before it, poisoning every plant and creature in the valley. World's best practice is to have a secondary wall in case the first fails. This is not the case at the proposed Dargues Reef mine.

Does Planning NSW really want to risk a flood of toxic sludge like was recently witnessed in Hungary when a dam holding higly toxic material broke and flooded an entire town and neighbourhood, eventually flowing into the River Danube?

I believe that the information provided to the Department for assessment is not adequate, and that further information is required before an accurate environmental assessment and any subsequent approval/ non-approval can be made.

Specifically, my concerns relate to the ecology component of the report. This report does not adequately address likely or potential indirect impacts of the mine and its operations.

These include;

- 1.Indirect impacts on threatened vegetation and associated faunal communities from the loss of groundwater within and adjacent to the mining site.
- 2. Impacts from the potential for the tailings dam to collapse. It is noted that there is minimal risk of this happening, however, the consequences of such an event would be high. As such, consideration of the impacts on the environment to be affected by such an incident needs to be investigated.
- 3. Indirect impacts to heritage and Indigenous sites 2-6 kilometres downstream from the proposed mine site and the tailings dam.

The proponent should provide this information before any recommendation regarding whether or not the project be approved is made.

Furthermore, I note that the proposed mine has not been referred to the Federal Department of Sustainability, Environment, Water, Population and Communities (DSEWPaC). The ecology report states that the impacts from the proposed mine will not significantly impact on any listed populations or communities. This may not, however, be the case as indirect impacts from the project have not been addressed. - 1. People living only 4 kilometres from the proposed mine have been allowed only TWO weeks to respond to the Environmental Assessment. It was finally made public two weeks ago and submissions must be received by 1 November. I think that giving such short notice must be illegal and could be successfully challenged.
- 2. The proposed mine is extremely close to the Nature Reserve and National Park in the area.
- 3. The Dargues Reef Mine proposed to remove 66.2 megalitres of water per year from the local water table. This would lead to a drop in ground water levels of between 1.5 and 10.5 metres. This is clearly a shocking level drop and is completely unacceptable.
- 4. The water table currently supplies underground springs that provide drinking water for the local native animals and also keep the native flora watered. The dramatic drop in the water table would spell doom for these native animals and plants.
- 5. NO studies have been done for the Environmental Assessment of the effect on the land beyond the actual mine site. Endangered, critically endangered and threatened species living in the gorge below the mine, ranging from the Powerful Owl to the critically endangered eucalyptus Kartzoffina never rated a mention. This is pathetic.
- 6. There is no proposed secondary wall to be constructed in case the
