To Whom it May Concern

Please be advised that we are strenuously opposed to the above concept plan and application.

We are local residents in Currong Circuit, Terrey Hills located less than 1 km from the current tip.

Our main reasons for objecting to this application are:-

1. Environmental pollution in the form of odour.

The stench from the composting as it stands now is often unbearable - and it is often. Increasing the amount of waste to be composted would obviously increase the stench. This is totally unacceptable.

2. Increase in danger turning from Mona Vale Road.

The turning point from Mona Vale Road towards Kimbriki Tip is currently a local blackspot. To dramatically increase the number of trucks travelling to Kimbriki is courting danger. This is totally unacceptable

3. Increase in traffic on Mona Vale Road

The delays caused at the merging point from two to one lanes at Terrey Hills Mona Vale is currently not acceptable. To dramatically increase the number of trucks travelling to Kimbriki will obviously increase this problem. This is totally unacceptable.

4. Increase in traffic generally

Since the development of Warriewood Valley, there has been an increase in traffic and delays on Mona Vale Road yet no plans to make Mona Vale Rd into a safer dual carriageway exist. There are limited access roads leading to Mona Vale Rd from the various councils areas. The increase in truck traffic from Mosman, Manly, Pittwater & Warringah Council areas, all heading to Mona Vale Rd (as opposed to the Belrose tip) will cause bottlenecks, delays and accidents. This is totally unacceptable.

5. Noise pollution

Dramatically increasing the number of trucks travelling along Mona Vale Road will cause additional noise from diesel engines, from air brakes, etc. This is totally unacceptable.

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
