## Attachment A - Burroway Solar Farm (SSD-55968733)

The following changes shown in **red** are recommended for draft consent condition B15.

### Heritage Management Plan

B15. Prior to commencing construction, the Applicant must prepare a Heritage Management Plan for the development to the satisfaction of the Planning Secretary. This plan must:

- (a) be prepared by suitably qualified and experienced persons whose appointment has been endorsed by the Planning Secretary in writing;
- (b) be prepared in consultation with RAPs and reviewed by Heritage NSW;
- (c) include a description of the measures that would be implemented for:
  - (i) implementing all reasonable and feasible measures to avoid harm to Aboriginal objects/sites located outside the approved development footprint, including fencing off the Aboriginal heritage items identified in Table 1 of Appendix 4 of this consent prior to commencing construction;
  - (ii) development of a surface collection and salvage methodology for the relevant Aboriginal objects and sites listed in Table 2 of Appendix 4 of this consent.
  - (iii) a strategy for the short-term and long-term management of any Aboriginal objects salvaged under approval;
  - (iv) preparing Aboriginal Site Impact Recording Form/s for all Aboriginal heritage sites following construction activities with ASIRFs to be submitted to the Aboriginal Heritage Information Management System registrar;
  - (v) participation by the RAPs in any salvage works that will be undertaken;
  - (vi) a contingency plan and reporting procedure if:
    - heritage items outside the approved development footprint are damaged;
    - previously unidentified heritage items (including non-aboriginal heritage items) are found; or
    - **Aboriginal skeletal material is discovered-Unexpected human remains are discovered;**
  - (vii) ensuring workers on site receive suitable heritage inductions **for both Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal heritage** prior to carrying out any development on site, and that records are kept of these inductions; and
  - (viii) ongoing consultation with Aboriginal stakeholders during the implementation of the plan; (d) include a program to monitor and report on the effectiveness of these measures and any heritage impacts of the project. Following the Planning Secretary's approval, the Applicant must implement the Heritage Management Plan.
