Additional Information following Response to Submission comments for Parramatta Powerhouse (SSD-10416)

Thank you for your referral dated 19 November 2020 inviting comments from the Heritage Council of NSW on the above State Significant Development (SSD) Additional information following the Response to Submissions.

The following documents were reviewed for this response:

Powerhouse Parramatta - Addendum Statement of Heritage Impact – St Georges Terrace, prepared for Infrastructure NSW by Advisian dated 2 November 2020.

The following comments are provided against the applicant's additional information submitted following the RTS stage specific to the heritage issues raised:

- The addendum SOHI advises an Option 2 as the preferred option for managing the St Georges Terrace built heritage element. This would involve a c.5.065m set back, demolition of the brick rear addition and demolition of c.1.688 metres of St Georges Terrace. As previously advised for local heritage items within the project area, Heritage NSW's recommends that the Project responds to advice of the City of Parramatta Council. We will not make a comment on the proposed impact to this locally significant heritage item.
- 2. The analysis of the impacts from Option 2 to the historical archaeological resource has been reconsidered in the addendum SOHI. It advises a lower level of impact to archaeological relics may occur as a result of the change. A reduction in impact to archaeological relics as a result of the project change is supported. No changes to the previously suggested conditions are recommended as a result of this change.
