Dear Mr Wathen

I refer to your request for advice sent on 12 August 2022 to the Department of Planning and Environment (DPE) Water about the above matter.

To assist with the design constructability of the Shoalhaven Hydro Expansion Project, the modification proposal is for geotechnical works in one new borehole location (location 9), while two investigation boreholes associated with the former cavern location (locations 4 and 5) are no longer required.

DPE Water has reviewed the Modification Report, with provision of the following recommendation:

• Should groundwater be intercepted, a Water Access Licence (WAL) under the *Water Management Act 2000* must be obtained unless an exemption under the Water Management (General) Regulation 2018 applies.

Detailed advice to DPE Planning & Assessment regarding the Shoalhaven Hydro Geotech Works MOD 1 - Adding 1 Borehole (SSI-9816-Mod-1)

1.0 Groundwater Licencing

1.1 Recommendation – Post Approval

DPE Water notes that no information on groundwater take is provided. Should groundwater be intercepted, a Water Access Licence (WAL) under the *Water Management Act 2000* must be obtained unless the take is less than or equal to 3ML of water per year for any aquifer interference activities listed in Clause 7 of Schedule 4 of the Water Management (General) Regulation 2018.

To qualify for an exemption to hold a water access licence, the proponent should:

- record the water take within 24 hours in the approved form and manner;
- provide the water take records to the Minister by no later than 28 July for the year ending 1 July during which the water was taken (e.g. included in the annual report); and
- keep the water take records for a period of five years.

Should the project be approved, the relevant management plans should reference our groundwater guidelines. DPE Water does not need to be consulted during their development or approval.

2.0 Coal Seam Gas

2.1 Recommendation – Post Approval

Should there be a risk of significant Coal Seam Gas interception, consideration of the NSW Code of Practice for Coal Seam Gas Well Integrity may be warranted.

Explanation

DPE Water notes that methane monitoring will be undertaken.
