Subject: Modification 1 Report Moomba to Sydney Ethane Pipeline Repurposing

Thank you for the opportunity to provide comments in relation to the abovementioned development proposal. Council has reviewed the Modification Report prepared by Jacobs Group (Australia) Pty Ltd dated December 2024 and offers the following response.

- Council does not object to the proposal. It is understood that minimal work is required in order to repurpose the existing ethane pipeline.
- The existing ethane pipeline shares an easement with Council's Highland Source Water Pipeline (HSP) between Goulburn and Sutton Forest. Council requests that it be notified of any physical works that may occur on the pipeline within this section.

The GPS co-ordinates for the shared easement are as follows:

Start (Goulburn): -34.718063, 149.700909 End (Sutton Forest): -34.598615, 150.250816

- Council reserves the right to continue to access the easement in order to facilitate maintenance and repairs to its HSP including the use of machinery to carry out these works.
- Council also owns land upon which the easement passes through. The descriptors for this land are as follows:

Lots 1-2 DP1126788 Lot 102 DP791867 Lot 1 & 3 DP198294

• The primary access point for Sooley Dam traverses the easement. Sooley Dam is the primary water source for the City of Goulburn and therefore requires frequent access. Council needs to ensure that the ability to access Sooley Dam remains unimpeded.
