Fill Material 235 Martin Road, Badgerys Creek

We are writing as Traditional Custodians with cultural responsibility for the lands at 235 Martin Road, Badgerys Creek. For the Early Works Development Application, our strong preference is for all fill material to remain on site, to stay on Country.

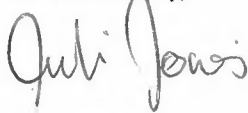
The soil and natural materials are part of the living system of Country. They hold story and memory. When material is taken away, those connections are broken and harm is done to both culture and the environment. Keeping fill on site helps protect the integrity of Country and allows it to be used in ways that restore and care for the land.

This is also the more sustainable option. Leaving material on Country avoids unnecessary trucking and disposal, reduces carbon emissions, and supports better outcomes for the environment as well as the project. It is a simple step that respects culture and looks after Country for the long term.

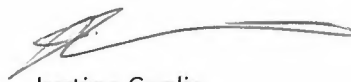
We ask that this position be recognised in the planning and approvals process, and that construction management plans reflect a commitment to keeping fill material on site wherever possible.
