Re: Basement SSD DA (SSD-10438) – Building 3 (Southern Precinct) Student Bicycle Parking Response

This letter has been prepared in response to the item raised by the Department of Planning, Industry and Environment (DPIE) in their request for further information letter (dated 10 March 2021) with regards to student bicycle parking for Building 3. DPIE's letter stated:

Respond to the City of Sydney's further submission in respect to additional bicycle parking being provided in the basement for Building 3 (Student Housing) within the Southern Precinct.

We have previously analysed bicycle parking utilisation for eight (8) similar student accommodation facilities which we currently operate in Brisbane, Sydney and Melbourne. All of these facilities have been operational for a minimum 3 years and provide student accommodation ranging from 98 to 770 beds, with ample bicycle parking facilities. In our experience the usage of bicycle parking spaces by students are generally low given the proximity of our facilities to education facilities and/or public transport opportunities (i.e. close walking distance). This is contextually similar to our proposed Waterloo project, whereby, the student accommodation building in the Southern Precinct effectively sits above or adjacent to the future Sydney Metro station.

As illustrated in the enclosed bike parking analysis surveys (refer attached), all of the student accommodation facilities have achieved near 100% occupancy levels, typically comprising +85% international students (pre-Covid). Typically, the bicycle parking requirements or usage equates to approximately 2.5-5% of the total number of students occupying the building (total beds accommodated).

For the Waterloo project, we would anticipate a similar percentage of bicycle parking usage. As such, the proposed 87 bicycle parking spaces for the student accommodation building in the Southern Precinct of the Waterloo Metro Quarter are considered well in excess of that required, equating to approximately 20% of the beds/units proposed.
