**Upgrades to Chatswood Public School and Chatswood High School (SSD 9483):
C50 Construction Worker and Staff Transportation Strategy Review and
Monitoring Report**

I refer to the Upgrades to Chatswood Public School and Chatswood High School approved on the 30 November 2020.

Condition C50 requires the 3-monthly review of the Construction Worker and Staff Transportation Strategy. The condition requires that the strategy be reviewed at this frequency to ensure that it is satisfactorily reducing the impacts on the availability of on-street parking for residents and visitors.

The last two reviews of this document demonstrate an increase in availability of on street parking for the residents and visitors. This coincides with the peak construction staff numbers in September 2022 (see attachment 1). It is also noted that no parking related complaints were received during September 2022.

Construction staff numbers are now declining towards the end of the project, so the requirement to continue this monitoring seems wasteful.

The Department of Education therefore will review the strategy 3-monthly but cease to undertake costly traffic monitoring and parking space counting.

Figure 1: Weekday Surveved On-Street Parking Demand – Comparison November 2021 to October 2022

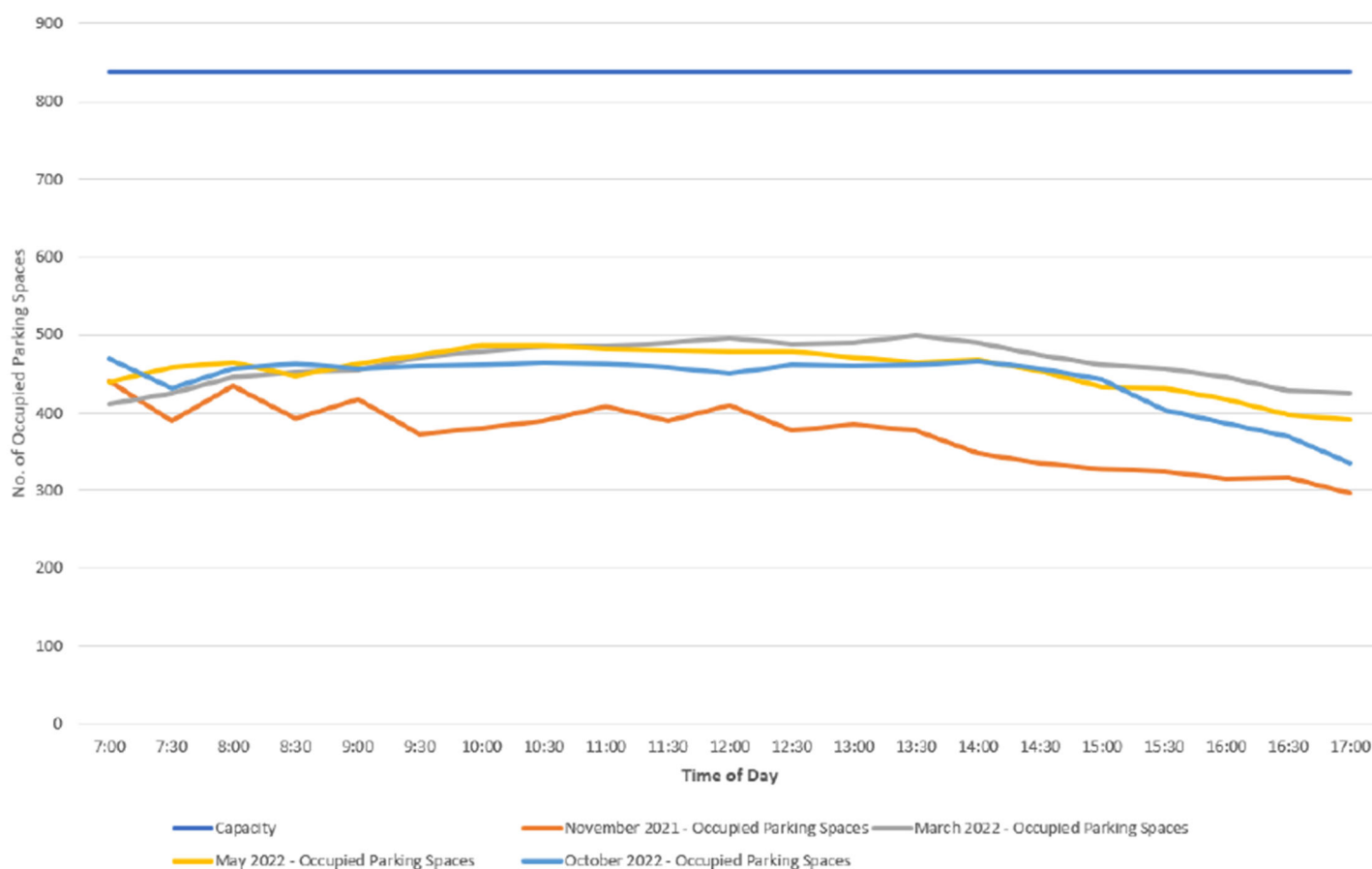


Figure 1: Weekday Surveved on-street Parking Demand November 21 - October 22

Figure 2: Saturday Surveved On-Street Parking Demand – Comparison November 2021 to October 2022

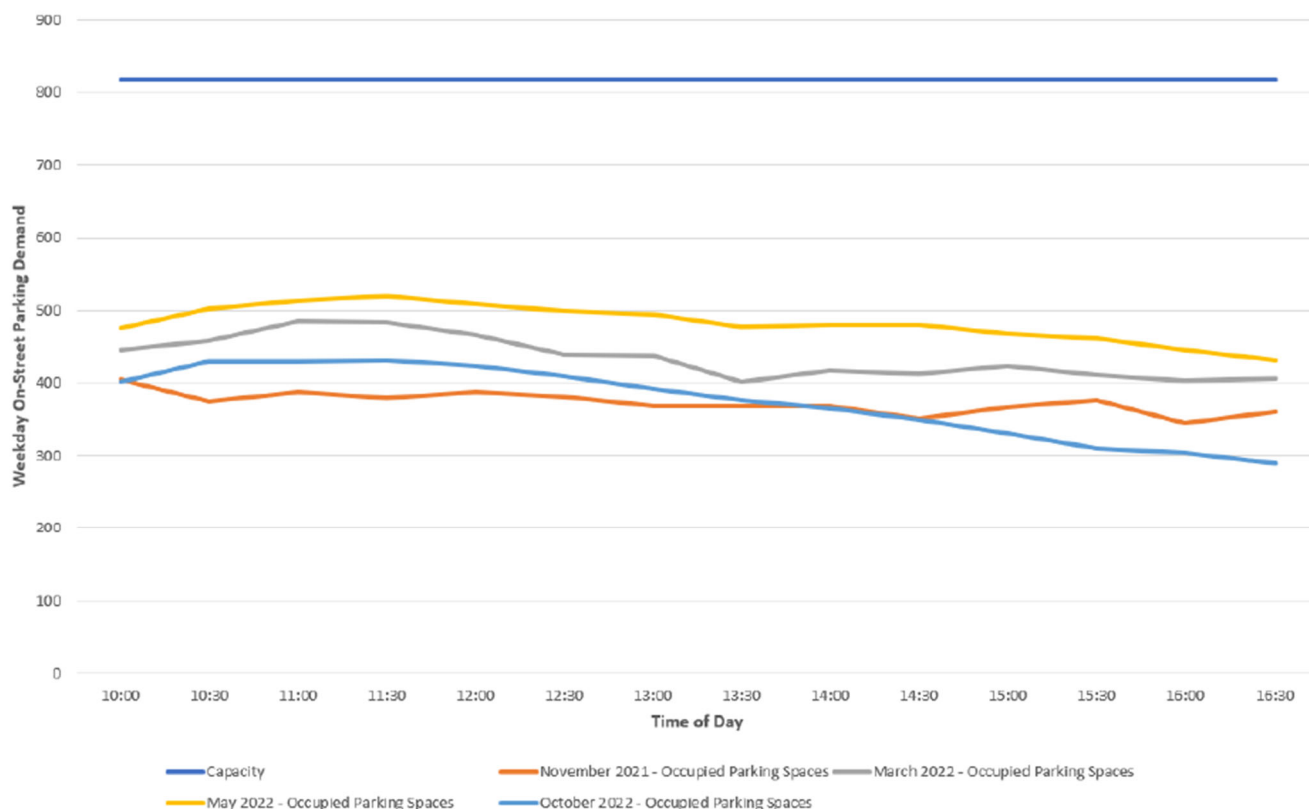


Figure 2: Saturday Surveved on street Parking Demand November 21-October 22

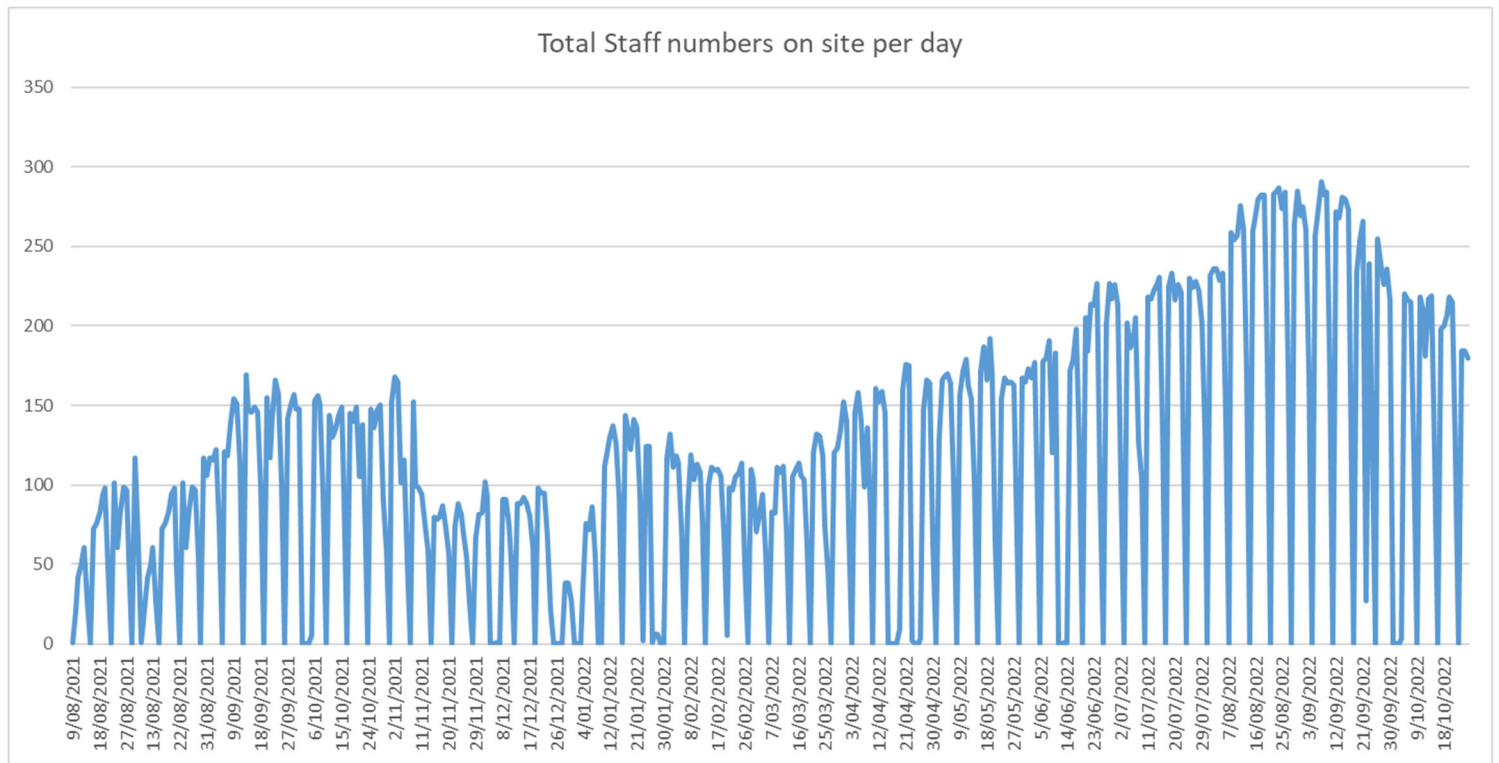


Figure 3: Data from Site Sign in Register - August 2021-October 2022
