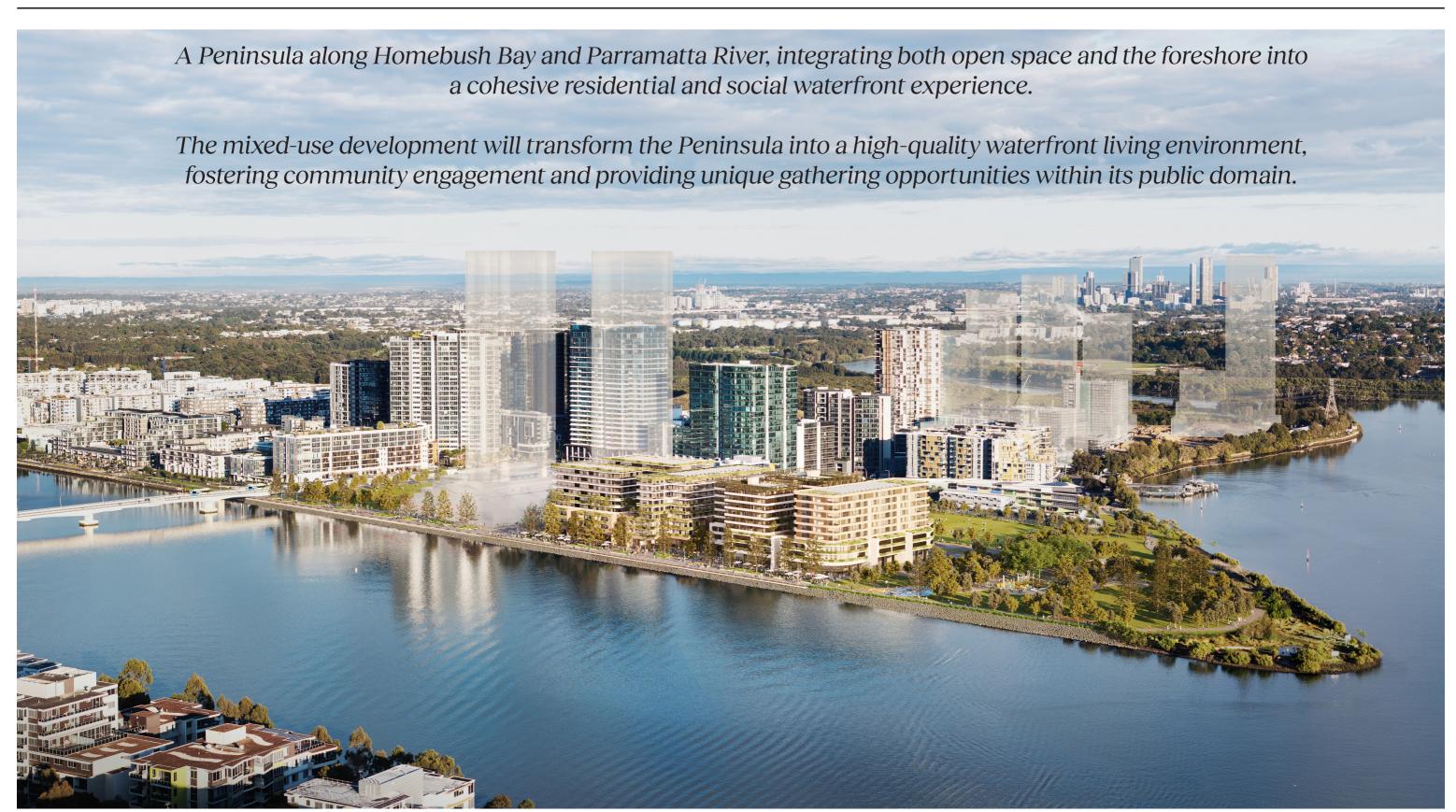

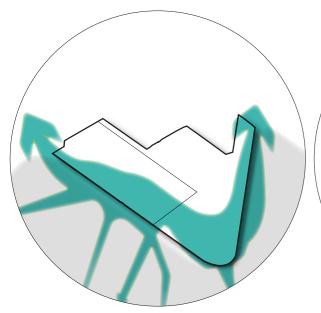


### Objectives

Design Guidelines

### Resilient and connected foreshore

- Integrate the natural features of Homebush Bay by maintaining direct views from key locations
   Ensure the protection and quality of the waterways.
   Apply Water Sensitive Urban Design (WSUD) principles in the design of links, streets, and promenades where feasible.
   Identify flood risks and incorporate design strategies that address the Probable Maximum Flood (PMF) levels.
   Assess potential future effects of climate change and develop strategies to mitigate flood risks under various climate change scenarios. change scenarios.



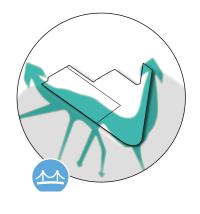












- Develop a mixed-use area that supports Peninsula Park incorporating a variety of supporting uses.
- Offer diverse housing types and apartment sizes to encourage population diversity.
- Design building envelopes to maximize solar access and
- comply with Apartment Design Guidelines (ADG). Ensure a range of dwelling sizes within the building envelope to maintain diversity.
- Design lower levels to engage with the street, including balconies that overlook streets and public spaces.

### Connected and diverse open space

- The public open space should be a connected, holistic, and permeable area, integrating the through-site link, plaza space, and waterfront promenade.
- The through-site link should provide seamless connectivity across the site, maintaining visual continuity and aligning with key pedestrian paths such as crosswalks and promenades.
- The plaza should be centrally located along the through-site link.
- Incorporate wide green setbacks along major roads like Burroway Road, with features such as bio-swales and tree pits to manage stormwater and enhance ecological value.
- Ensure that residential developments have easy access to nearby open spaces, such as Peninsula Park and the waterfront promenade, to promote outdoor activity and connection to nature for residents.
- Introduce retail uses around key public domain edges to enhance activity and interaction.
- Strategically manage site-level changes by ensuring pathways are accessible and user-friendly, utilizing ramps or gentle slopes where necessary.
- The northern edge of the development should respond to topographical levels and the design of Peninsula Park, incorporating direct connections between parking areas and the promenade.

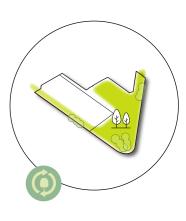












### Activated and safe streetscape

- Create a central plaza along the promenade, serving as a key community hub that links Peninsula Park to the larger Wentworth Point Precinct.
- Introduce fine-grain variations at ground level, incorporating retail and communal uses along key pedestrian spines, the waterfront promenade, and park interfaces.
- Include universal design principles to provide accessible housing options in future apartment developments.
- Support a diverse mix of retail tenants, activities, and informal spaces to encourage social interaction.
- Ensure architectural transitions and rhythm at street level to create a vibrant, dynamic environment.
- Ground-level retail and communal open spaces should support passive surveillance and align with CPTED (Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design) principles.
- Provide benches, street furniture, and informal seating areas to create inviting relief spaces.
- Limit access along the site link and promenade to emergency vehicles only

### **Safety Objectives**

- Clear signage and proper lighting in public spaces will promote good visibility and enhance safety through surveillance.
- The integration of landscaping, public art, urban seating, and water features will create an attractive environment, reducing opportunities for crime.
- Activating through-site links with adjacent retail will ensure high-quality public spaces with 24/7 access and maximum passive surveillance.
- Paving, street trees, and other visual cues will create a welcoming entry and improve safety.
- Offer diverse gathering spaces, from large plazas to smaller pockets, to accommodate various public needs and activities.
- Provide tree canopies and lightweight shelters that enhance outdoor spaces, creating calm, cool, and inviting environments.
- Design movement corridors that blend seamlessly with the landscape, creating activity nodes while maintaining clear distinctions between public and private spaces.
- High-quality public areas and strong visual connections to the waterfront are essential for creating safe, legible, and enjoyable public spaces.















### Architectural quality and building amenity

- Create a distinctive neighborhood by providing supporting uses within a mixed-use development that enhances Peninsula Park and active open space.
- Offer diverse housing types and apartment sizes to encourage population diversity.
- Design building envelopes to ensure maximum solar access and compliance with Apartment Design Guidelines (ADG).
- Ensure variety within the building envelope, offering a range of dwelling sizes.
- Interface with the street by incorporating balconies that overlook the streets and public realm.
- Provide setbacks that contribute positively to the streetscape.
- Maintain a balance between water views and visual privacy.

### **Universal Design Principles**

- The design should accommodate a wide range of individual preferences and abilities, allowing for adaptability. This includes features like adjustable seating heights and multifunctional spaces (e.g., outdoor plazas for events, gatherings,
- Incorporate clear signage and a wayfinding strategy, along with well-lit pathways, to ensure ease of navigation regardless of the user's experience, knowledge, or concentration level.
- Use visual, tactile, and auditory signals to communicate information effectively to all users, regardless of environmental conditions or sensory abilities.
- Provide appropriate size and space for approach, reach, manipulation, and use, regardless of the user's body size, posture, or mobility.
- Design spaces to be inclusive, user-friendly, and safe for everyone.





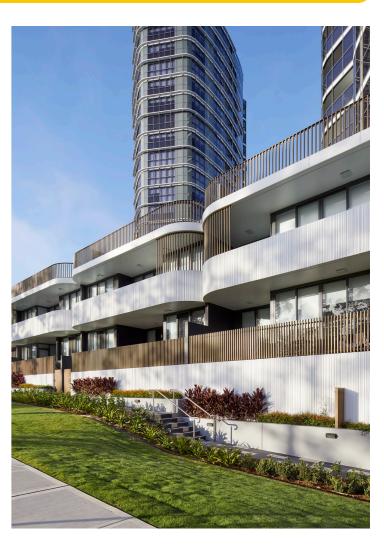


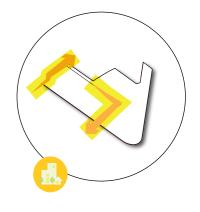












### Urban Design Approach

This concept presents a scheme with two primary building envelopes comprising rectilinear podiums with flexibility to accommodate three towers each. The ground plane is defined by a dynamic and inclusive central plaza, foreshore promenade and through-site link that enhances connectivity, accessibility, and community engagement within the site.

The through-site link transitions seamlessly and maintains visual continuity from the waterfront to the High School. The link enhances overall connection by aligning itself with the proposed pedestrian crosswalk on Ridge Road. It offers a multifaceted urban experience that integrates active uses, greenery, rest spaces, and effectively manages the site's level changes.

The plaza, situated at the annex of the foreshore promenade, creates a vibrant and inviting public space that celebrates the site's maritime heritage while integrating greenery, rain-gardens, cafes, outdoor dining, and ensures accessibility for all users.

The mixed-use development is designed with above-podium parking and residential frontages along Ridge Road. Convenient vehicular access and service entrances are located on the western edge of the site for each of the buildings. Direct access to the active open space, Peninsula Park, and waterfront promenade is maintained through various residential entries. Large green setbacks with provisions for bio-swales and tree pits are designed for the Burroway Road interface along with terrace houses.

Retail and active uses are located along the foreshore promenade, Peninsula Park, and the through-site link to create a dynamic urban corridor, activating street-level frontages for both residents and visitors.

The above podium envelope is meticulously designed to offer flexibility to each tower within the development. Positioned with ample separation to ensure optimal solar amenity and privacy, each podium hosts three towers that harmonize residential living with panoramic views of Homebush Bay and the Parramatta River.

Communal open spaces are proposed above the podium that integrates lush greenery and seating areas, promoting community interaction and enhancing the quality of life for residents. By prioritizing solar amenity, privacy, and communal open spaces with stunning waterfront views, the development not only enhances residential living but also enriches the urban fabric of the surrounding area.

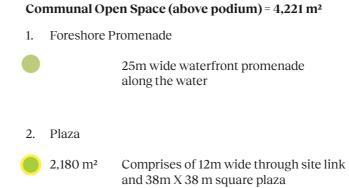
### Open Space and Public Domain





- **1. Tower Zone**: Areas designated to the development of 6 storey high structures.
- **2. Podium Zone :** Podium zones are the three storey height structures that host a variety of uses, such as parking, retail spaces on ground, residential units, and servicing.
- 3. Articulation Zone: A space of 18 metres has been designated between the towers to allow for architectural flexibility. This separation enhances the residential towers' overall amenity by providing adequate distance for privacy, aesthetic appeal, and improved building design.

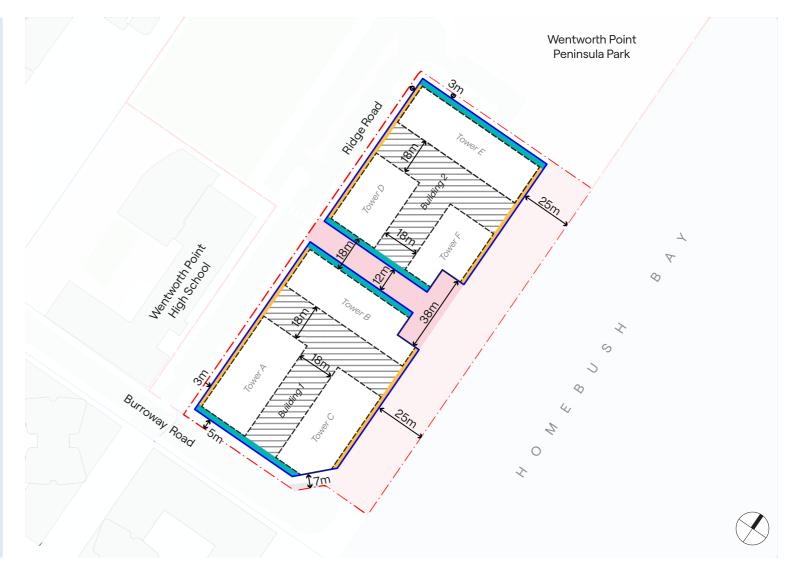
Design Guidelines

### Access and Servicing

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- I. Vehicular entries must be contained to Ridge Road interface with a maximum of two vehicular entries.
- 2. Vehicular entries should allow activation of corners along through-site link for activation.
- 3. Through-site link should be minimum 12m wide and should be aligned (approximately) to the pedestrian crossing.
- 4. Direct pedestrian connection should be provided along the northern edge of the site, connecting the promenade and the northern road
- 5. Maintain direct pedestrian connections as shown in the above diagram.
- 6. Provide 4m wide shared path for emergency vehicles.

# Setback and Separation



- 1. Minimum 3m in lot setback along Ridge Road and Wentworth Point Peninsula Park.
- 2. Minimum 5m in-lot setback along Burroway Road with ability for provision of WSUD and landscaped edge.
- 3. Minimum 25m wide foreshore setback
- 4. Minimum 12m through site link which is centrally located to the plaza and aligned with the northern connection.

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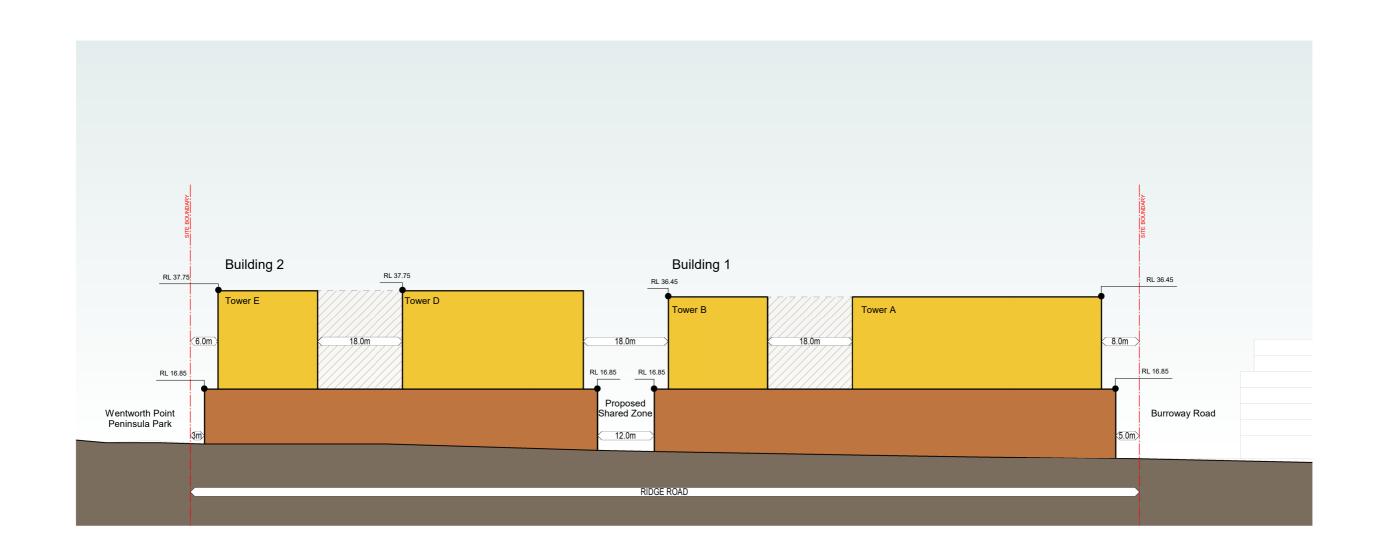
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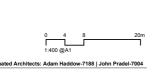


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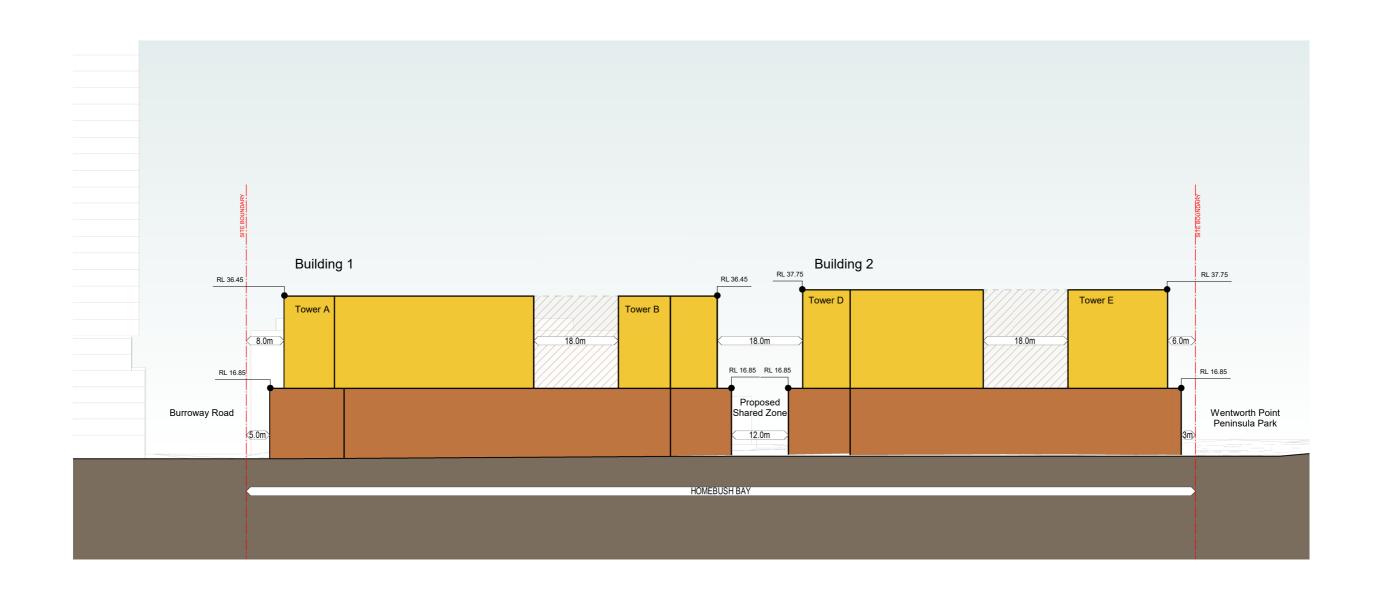
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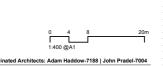




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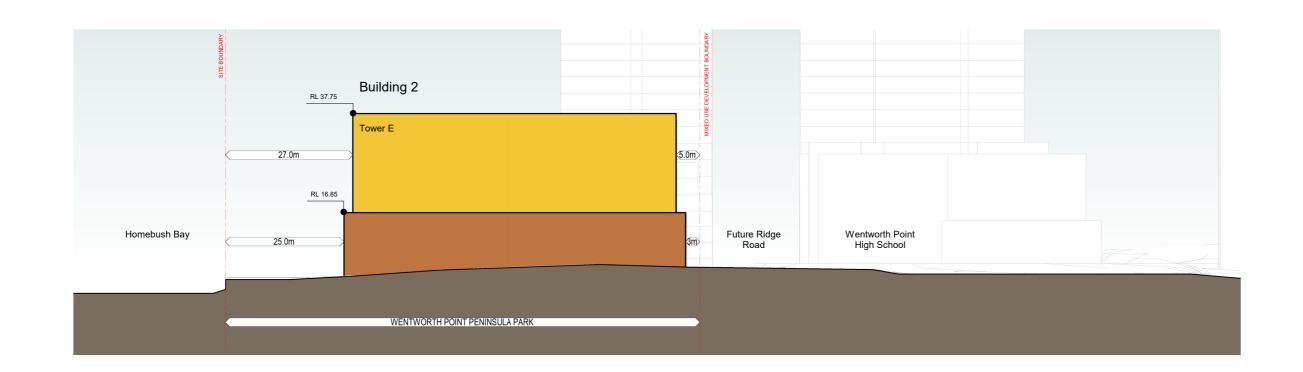


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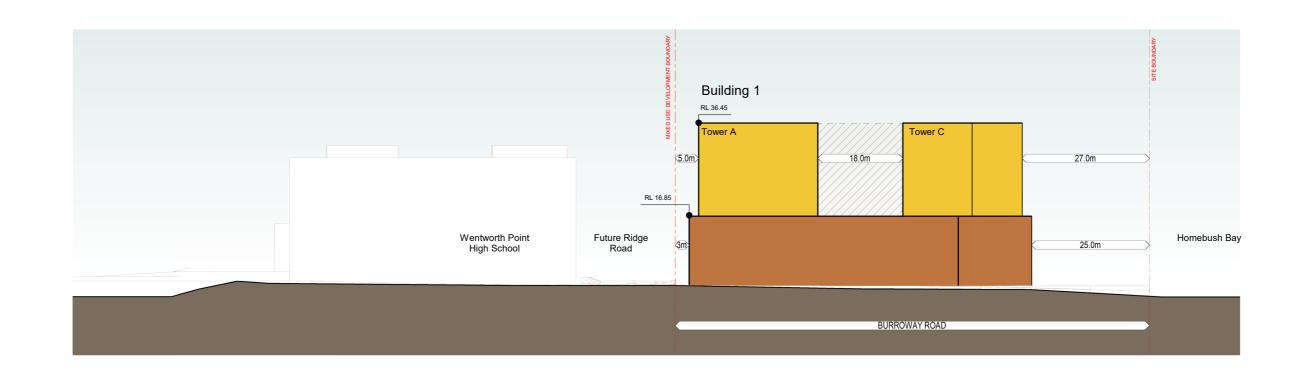


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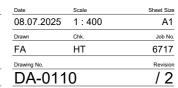
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ENVELOPE - WEST ELEVATION
