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## 1.0 Introduction

This Biodiversity Management Plan (Biodiversity MP) has been prepared for the Kurri Kurri Power Station (KKPS) as a subplan to the overarching Operations Environmental Management Plan (OEMP) for the facility.

The objective of this Biodiversity MP is to provide a point of reference to ensure the effective implementation of KKPS' biodiversity related commitments, reporting, controls and mitigation measures specified in:

- The KKPS Environmental Impact Statement (EIS)
- Any written directions from the NSW Secretary of the Department of Planning, Housing and Infrastructure (DPHI Secretary);
- The conditions of NSW Infrastructure Approval SSI-12590060 (SSI Approval);
- The conditions of Environment Protection Licence 21627 (EPL21627);
- The conditions of the Federal EPBC Approval 2021/8888 (EPBC Approval), and;
- Applicable legislation.

As a requirement of SSI Approval Condition B33, Snowy Hydro Limited (Snowy Hydro), as the proponent of KKPS, must prepare a Biodiversity Management Plan in consultation with BCS (now the Biodiversity Conservation Division of the NSW Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water, DCCEEW), and to the satisfaction of the DPHI Secretary. Snowy Hydro must also implement the approved Biodiversity MP.

Previous versions of the Biodiversity MP have been developed and approved for construction and commissioning activities of KKPS, however as per Condition C21 of the SSI Approval (Staging of Plans) this version of the Biodiversity Management Plan is for the KKPS operations.

The Biodiversity MP is applicable to the whole KKPS site and aims to minimise potential impacts to biodiversity through:

- Identifying the key biodiversity issues that require operational control measures
- Detailing measures to manage operational impacts on biodiversity
- Assigning responsibilities for operational biodiversity impact management
- Providing sufficient information to assist with auditing the implementation of the Biodiversity MP
- Ensure KKPS workers are aware of the biodiversity values adjacent to the site to they may avoid or minimise potential impacts
- Operating KKPS in accordance with the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS), SSI Approval, and the mitigation measures identified in this Biodiversity MP.

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## 1.1 Environmental Management Framework

Snowy Hydro's integrated management system incorporates Health, Safety, Environment, Quality and Asset Management frameworks to meet business requirements. The system is referred to within Snowy Hydro as the Clean, Green and Safe (CGS) Management System, and is certified to:

- ISO 9001 Quality Management Systems
- ISO 14001 Environmental Management Systems
- ISO 45001 Occupational Health & Safety Management System
- ISO 55001 Asset Management Systems

This Biodiversity MP and the overarching OEMP are underpinned by, and align with the wider CGS Management System.

## 2.0 Overview

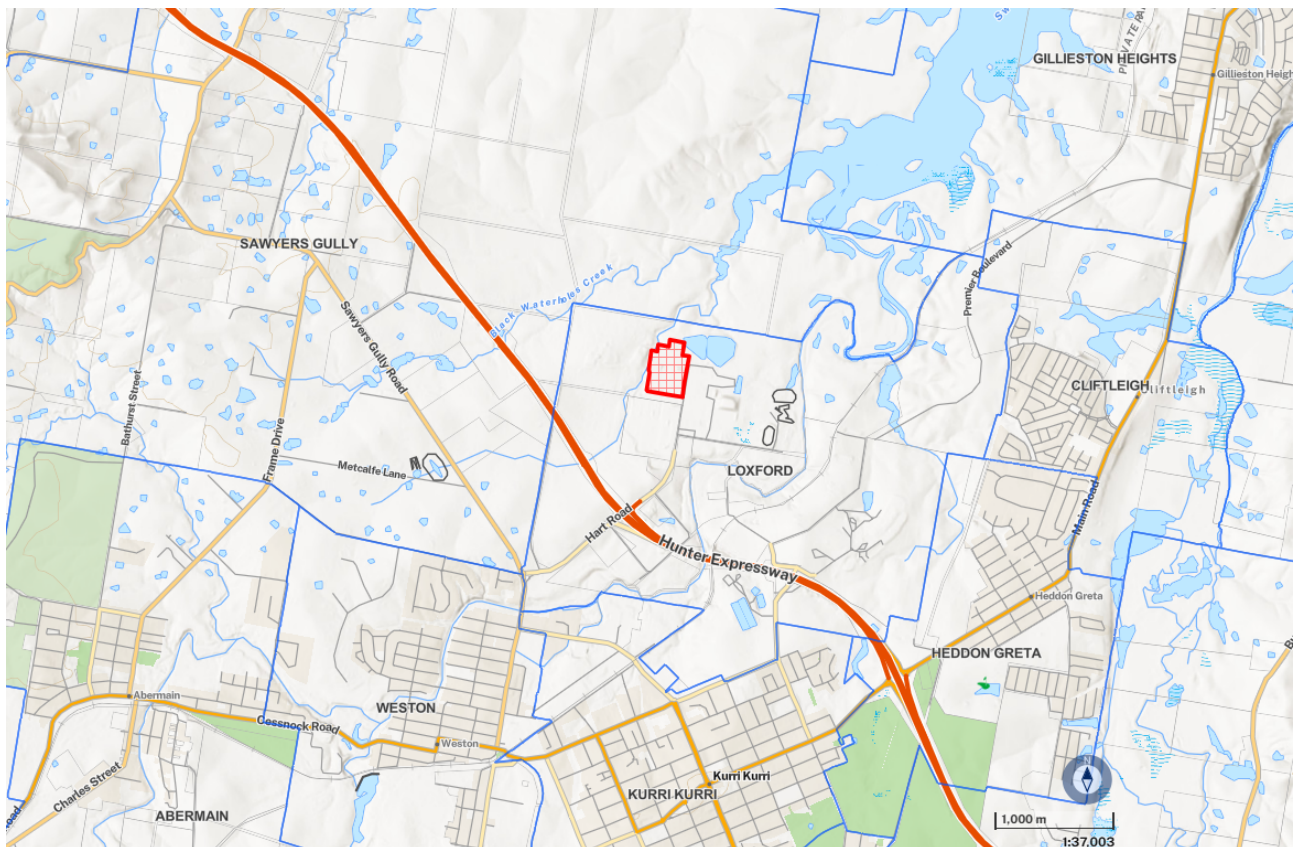
### 2.1 Location

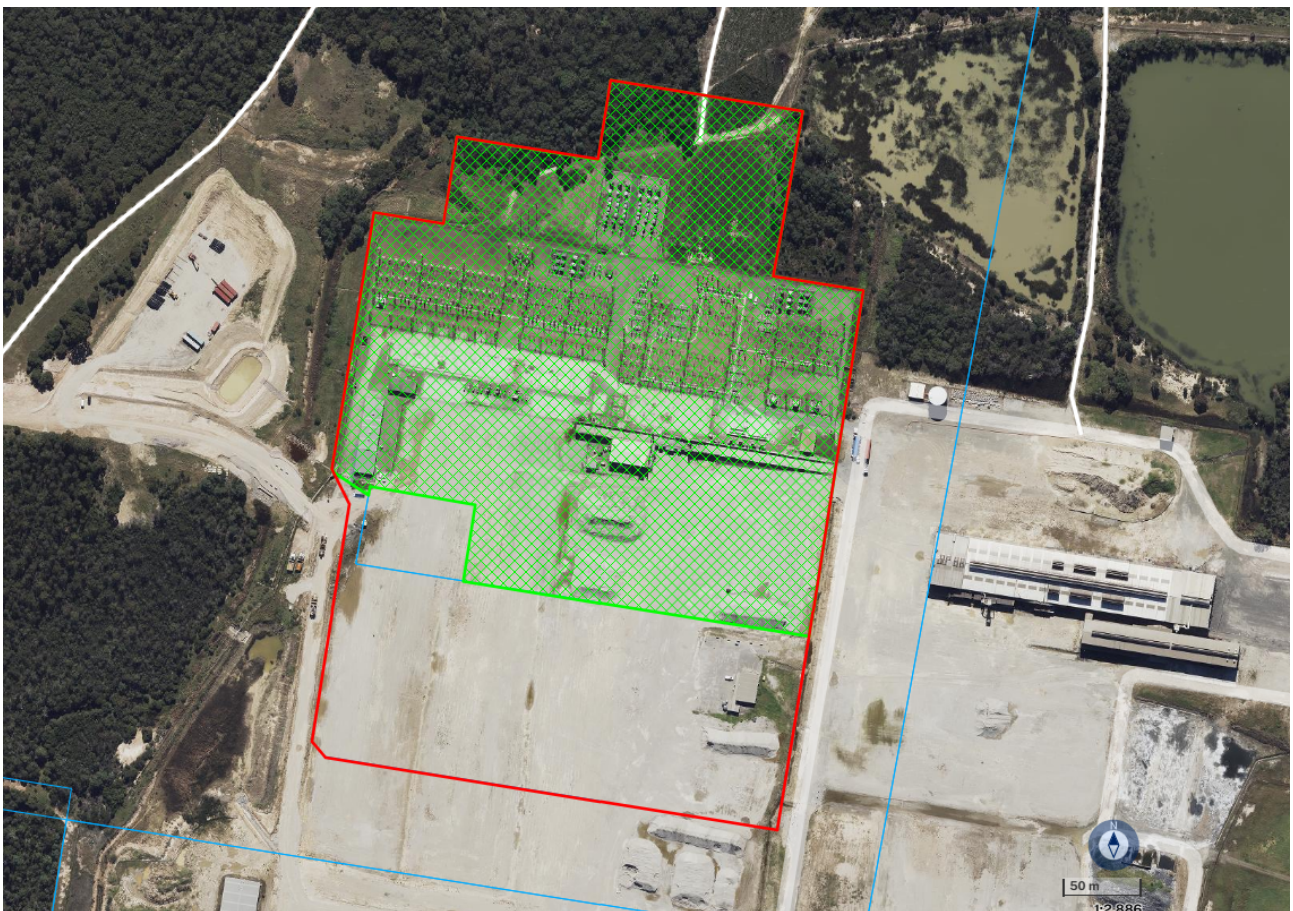


**Figure 2.1:** Location of the Kurri Kurri Power Station within the regional context (image source: NSW Spatial Services, SDT Explorer)

KKPS is located at Loxford, near Kurri Kurri, New South Wales (NSW), within the Cessnock City Council Local Government Area (refer to **Figure 2.1**, and **Figure 2.2**). The facility has been constructed on the site of the former Kurri Kurri Aluminium Smelter, which operated from 1969 to late 2012, closing in 2014.

**Figure 2.3** presents the SSI & EPBC Approval boundary for KKPS, overlaid with the EPL boundary.

The site address is 1 Hart Road, Loxford, and is approximately 1.2km from the M15 Hunter Expressway. The site is accessed via Hart Road.

## 2.3 Site Operations

KKPS is a 660MW open cycle gas fired power station that operates as a 'firming' generation facility. It is capable of supporting the transition away from fossil fuel baseload generation, through the security of supplying electricity during periods of low and intermittent generation from renewable generators to maintain a reliable and stable National Electricity Market (NEM). It can also support the NEM at short notice and during times of peak demand, including unplanned supply shortages at other baseload generation facilities.

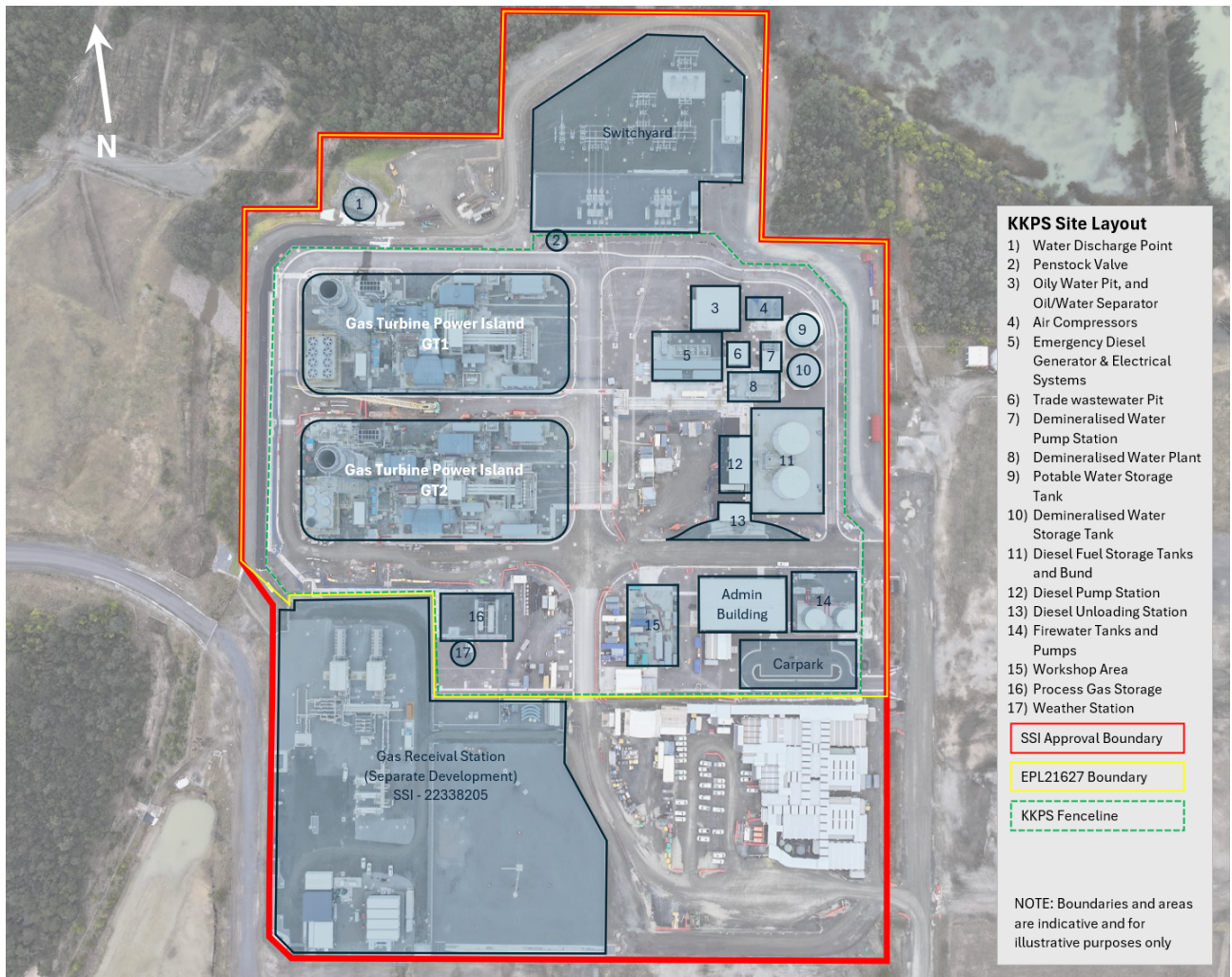

### 3.3 Consultation

The SSI Approval requires the Biodiversity MP to be prepared in consultation with the Biodiversity Conservation Division NSW DCCEEW. A summary of this consultation is provided in **Appendix A**.

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## 4.0 Biodiversity Impacts

As previously noted, this Biodiversity MP covers the operational stage for KKPS. During KKPS operations, there is a negligible level of direct impact to biodiversity due to the approved clearing of native vegetation and habitat during preconstruction activities at KKPS. It is to be noted however that these activities did not impact on land that has been declared as an area of outstanding biodiversity value in under section 3.1 of the *Biodiversity Conservation Act 2016 (NSW)*.

The majority of the KKPS Site (approx 90%) was located on previously cleared land of historical industrial land use. Of the remaining 10%, accounting for an area of 1.54 hectares, 1.09 hectares consisted of regrowth and ground layer vegetation within maintained power easements or fire asset protection zones. The construction impact to the 0.4 hectares of intact vegetation was determined as minor with the planning of KKPS to be constructed on the former Kurri Kurri Aluminium Smelter site.

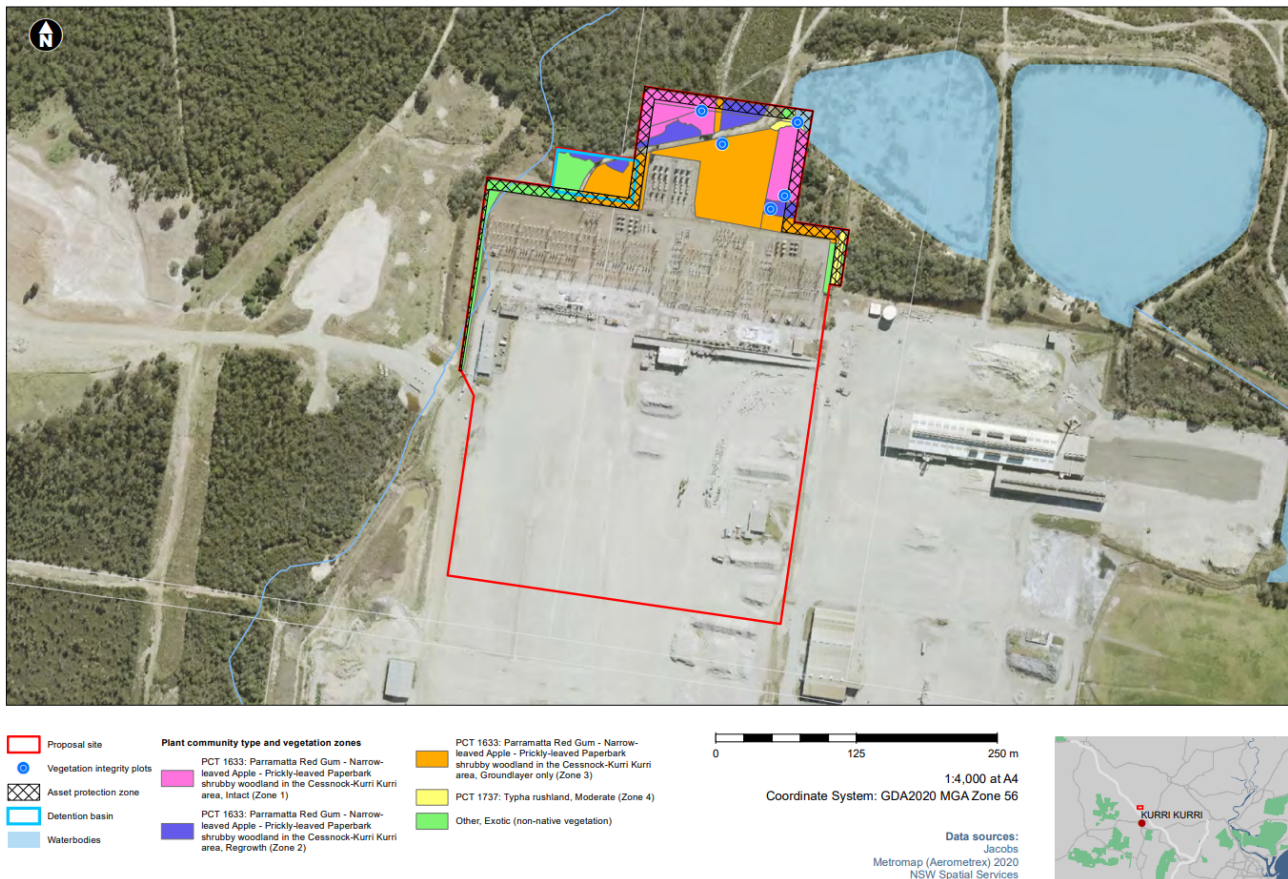
### 4.1 Plant Community Type

The construction of KKPS resulted in the removal of 1.54 hectares of native vegetation within the KKPS site, and within the required 10 metre wide Asset Protection Zone (APZ), and consisted of the Plant Community Types (PCT's) described in **Table 4.1**, and depicted in **Figure 4.1**.

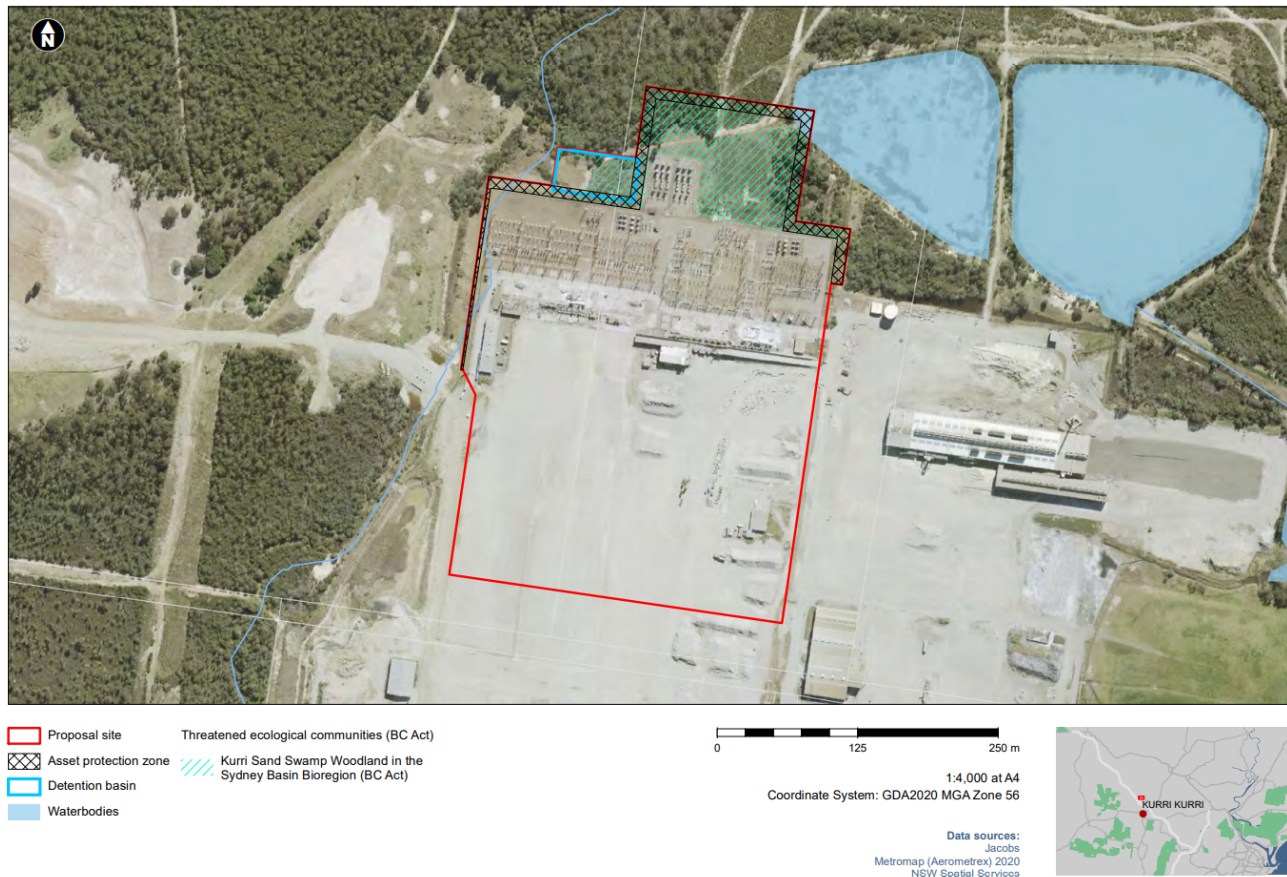

Of the 1.49 ha of PCT 1633 that occurred on KKPS, 1.09 ha occurred within existing power easements and APZ areas, and was described to be in low condition as the vegetation was regularly maintained. The intact vegetation, outside the power easement, contained the remaining 0.40 hectares.



## 4.2 Threatened Ecological Communities

One Threatened Ecological Community (TEC) listed under the Biodiversity Conservation Act 2016 (NSW) has been impacted by the construction of KKPS, which is the 1.49 ha of PCT 1633 (Parramatta Red Gum – Narrow-leaved Apple – Prickly-leaved Paperbark shrubby woodland in the Cessnock-Kurri Kurri area) described in **Section 4.1** above, and depicted in **Figure 4.2**.

## 4.3 Threatened Flora

One threatened plant species, *Eucalyptus parramattensis subsp. decadens* (Earps Gum), listed as vulnerable under both the EPBC Act (Cth) and the BC Act (NSW) occurs in proximity to the operational area of KKPS. As a result of the construction of KKPS, a total of 37 individual Earp's Gum were directly impacted.

The direct impact to Earp's Gum associated with the construction of KKPS is summarised in **Table 4.2**, and their locations indicated in **Figure 4.3**.

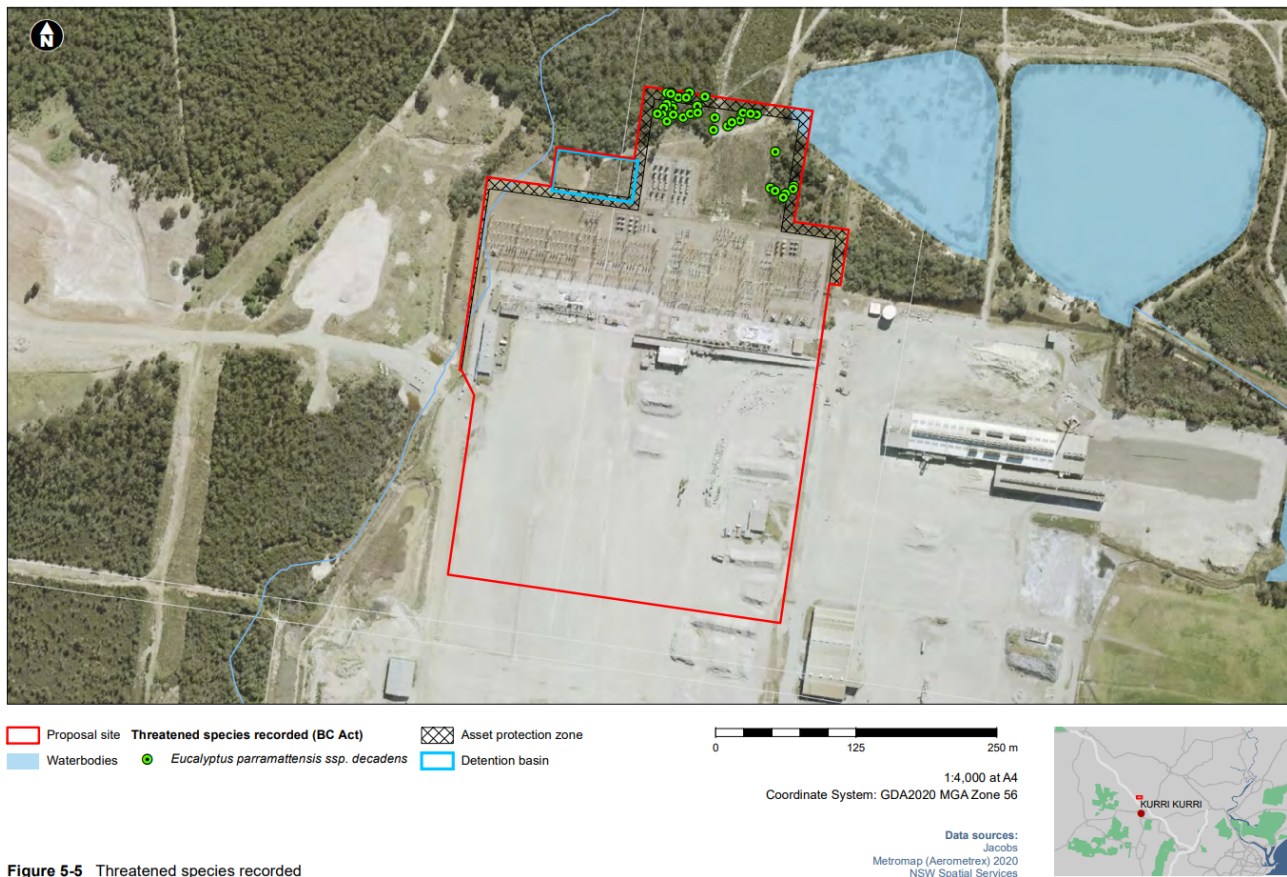

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## 4.4 Threatened Fauna

One threatened fauna species, the Southern Myotis (*Myotis macropus*), was positively identified during fauna surveys, and one threatened fauna species, the Common Planigale (*Planigale maculate*), was assumed present based on the availability of suitable habitat within the approved KKPS boundary. These species are both listed as vulnerable under the *Biodiversity Conservation Act 2016* (NSW).

In the woodland encroaching on KKPS, the Regent Honeyeater (*Anthochaera phrygia*) has mapped breeding habitat, and the Swift Parrot (*Lathamus discolor*) has mapped foraging habitat, however neither have been identified within the KKPS site. A section of identified Regent Honeyeater habitat was required to be removed during the construction of KKPS in the north west extent of the switchyard area.

The direct impact to threatened species associated with the construction of KKPS is summarised in **Table 4.3**, with locations indicated in **Figure 4.4**.

The Southern Myotis was positively identified foraging over the North Dam (surge pond) which is located to the immediate north east of KKPS. This habitat will not be removed or impacted by the Project, though mitigation techniques will be implemented. The surge pond, and a section of the Typha rushland (PCT1737), represent potential foraging habitat consisting of pools more than 3 metres wide. Vegetation within 200 metres of these suitable watercourses (including areas of PCT 1633, and PCT 1737) are associated with the Southern Myotis. There are tree hollows associated with

the intact vegetation zone (Zone 1 PCT 1633) and therefore potential for roosting by this species. The impact to the Southern Myotis habitat within the KKPS operational area is estimated at 0.40 hectares. This species breeds in early spring, having one young in November or early December, clearing of native vegetation should be avoided during this time (September to December).

For the Common Planigale, the species polygon included the area of intact woodland associated with Vegetation Zone 1 (0.40 hectares). This habitat contains microhabitat features considered important for this species, including woody debris, tall groundcover vegetation, and structural complexity including shrubs, and trees. In contrast the regrowth and ground layer vegetation has been previously cleared, there is no remaining woody debris, and very simple structural complexity. This habitat is not expected to be preferred by this small mammal species, due to the lack of shelter and cover. During the breeding period for the Common Planigale (between October to January), clearing of native vegetation should be avoided during this time.

Based on available literature and current knowledge of habitat preferences for the Regent Honeyeater in the Hunter Valley, the habitat within the KKPS operational area will not be considered important, despite overlaying a portion of the important habitat mapping, as it contains no key foraging species, with exception of a low number of Stringybark. Therefore, there are no significant impacts predicted to foraging habitat for the Regent Honeyeater as a result of the minor clearing that was required for KKPS. Approximately 0.40 hectares of habitat suitable for the Regent Honeyeater will be impacted by the Project. Breeding mostly occurs during spring and summer, from August to January for this species. Clearing of native vegetation should be avoided during this time.

## 4.5 Biodiversity Offsets

Ecosystem and species biodiversity offset credits based on clearing of all vegetation on the Project Site are shown below in **Tables 4.4** and **4.5**. All biodiversity offset credits for KKPS have been retired via payment into the Biodiversity Conservation Fund under section 6.30(1) of the *Biodiversity Conservation Act 2016*. The Department has acknowledged this payment has been made and obligations fulfilled in a letter dated 24 Jan 2022. No further credits are required to be retired.

## 4.6 Consideration of Displaced Fauna

Of the 1.54 ha vegetation removed during the construction of KKPS, only 0.4 ha exhibited complex structural elements, mature trees and logs that may have been occupied by resident or transient fauna. The Biodiversity Development Assessment Report for KKPS noted the potential for the vulnerable Common Planigale and Squirrel Glider to be present in this area, with several other fauna species confirmed to be present. All species (potential, or identified), are considered likely to disperse into adjoining habitat outside the areas directly impacted by KKPS.

Comparable habitat is available and widespread surrounding the Project Site, with expansive areas of contiguous habitat to the north. Any dispersal of a small number of native mammals into this adjoining habitat is considered unlikely to place significant pressure on existing resident fauna, due to the expanse of habitat available. The small area of habitable vegetation to be disturbed (0.4 hectares) will only be occupied by a few individuals of the species discussed. On this basis further mitigation and monitoring of resident fauna in adjacent habitats has been deemed as not required for KKPS as previously approved in earlier versions of the Biodiversity MP.

There are no further proposals to translocate threatened plant species from KKPS, therefore a licence to translocate a threatened species under Section 132 of the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974* is not required.

The likelihood of a threatened fauna species being captured on the operational KKPS site and requiring relocation is considered very low. If at all required, Snowy Hydro will engage a suitably qualified ecologist to provide the necessary advice, to ensure all appropriate actions are implemented to prevent potential harm or stress to the animal. Refer to **Appendix B**.

## 4.7 Weeds and Pathogens

Invasive weed species, including high threat weeds such as *Andropogon virginicus* (Whiskey Grass), *Cortaderia selloana* (Pampas Grass) and *Hyparrhenia hirta* (Coolatai Grass), were noted in the edges of the intact forest, regrowth forest and along cleared tracks and land, although in very low abundance within the intact forest. Future weed incursion onto the KKPS operational site and adjoining habitats is possible, although, based on observation with the intact areas of forest, this is predicted to be low.

Although operational activities will have minimal direct impact on the spread of weed species, KKPS will implement a regular program of inspection and weed management activities to minimise the risk of weeds establishing in areas of site and spreading into surrounding areas.

Removal techniques, such as hand removal, will be dependent on the identified weed species, and the appropriate management of weed disposal is to be conducted.

Wherever possible, removal or treatment of weeds will be undertaken prior to seed developing, which for most species occurs during the warmer months (summer). Therefore, early spring is generally a suitable time for weed management activities. This will reduce the likelihood of propagation material

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spreading and creating new infestations both within the site and in other areas. Where this is not possible, and weed removal must take place at a time when seed production has commenced, seeds are to be removed from plants as far as practical prior to removal of the plant.

Hand removal will be undertaken where herbicide treatment may impact on sensitive areas, such as crops or native grasses. Hand removal will be undertaken when soils are moist and must be thorough to ensure removal of all roots. Herbicide application should ideally be undertaken during the growing season, however, not during extended dry periods.

Pathogens are agents that cause disease in flora and fauna and are usually living microorganisms such as bacterium, virus, or fungus. Pathogens can be spread on footwear, vehicles and machinery. Precautions to limit the spread of pathogens will be considered if required, should these measures be determined necessary during KKPS operations.

## 4.8 Aquatic Habitat

KKPS is located on the fringe of the Hunter River floodplain. There are no watercourses that are located in or through the site. Watercourses which occur in proximity to KKPS however include:

- An unnamed ephemeral tributary of Black Waterholes Creek, located immediately to the west of KKPS, which flows from south to north.
- Swamp Creek, 900 metres to the east of the Project Site, which flows in a generally northward direction
- Both Black Waterholes Creek and Swamp Creek drain to Wentworth Swamp about 1.5 kilometres north of KKPS, which drains to the Hunter River at Maitland.

KKPS will have a minimal impact to aquatic environments via site water discharges from an EPA licenced discharge point located on the northern periphery of KKPS. No significant impacts to important waterways, wetlands and/or key fish habitats are expected. The water quality of site discharges shall be monitored as per the requirements of EPL21627, to assess ongoing water quality trends.

## 5.0 Management and Mitigation Measures

As indicated in **Section 4**, impacts to biodiversity at KKPS have primarily occurred during the construction of KKPS, with the ongoing impacts caused by KKPS operations expected to be minimal. Irrespective of the level of impact, the management and mitigation measures described in **Table 5.1** will be implemented to further ensure any potential impacts to biodiversity are mitigated appropriately.

## 6.0 Compliance Management

Specific aspects of the compliance tracking program used to provide oversight for compliance at KKPS is provided in the OEMP.

Environmental compliance at KKPS is demonstrated in Annual Compliance Reports submitted to DPHI and DECCWW addressing compliance reporting obligations in the SSI and EPBC Approvals, and the Annual Return to the NSW EPA.

Within Snowy Hydro, compliance is reported monthly to the operations executive committee and then to the Snowy Hydro Board. The reports to the operations executive include any identified non-compliances with the conditions of the SSI Approval, EPBC Approval, EPL21627, or any other applicable compliance obligation.

### 6.1 Monitoring and Reporting

Regular monitoring and inspections of the management and mitigation measures outlined in this Biodiversity MP shall occur at a regular frequencies, and will include, however not be limited to:

- General site based inspections of KKPS included as a routine task for KKPS Production Technicians to ensure the site remains free of excessive weeds. As a minimum, specific inspections are conducted on a daily basis, with numerous ad-hoc opportunities to observe site conditions by all site personnel.
- Targeted inspections conducted by Snowy Hydro personnel, or an external party to ensure existing biodiversity management measures remain effective and fit-for-purpose. These are conducted on at least a quarterly basis with additional inspections undertaken as required.
- Environmental auditing and assurance activities to assess ongoing compliance with the requirements of this Biodiversity MP, and applicable Snowy Hydro policies and procedures
- Investigation of biodiversity related incidents, to identify causes, preventative actions and improvement opportunities, as well as tracking identified actions to ensure timely and effective implementation.

Records of scheduled/formal inspections shall be retained in various systems including Ellipse (maintenance management system), Enablon (event management system), and/or AODocs (document management system).

Snowy Hydro has fulfilled the obligations to offset biodiversity impacts by permanently retiring biodiversity credits in accordance with SSI Approval condition 34(b) by electing to make payment to the NSW Biodiversity Offsets Scheme. As an outcome an ongoing biodiversity monitoring program is not warranted for KKPS operations.

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## 6.2 Auditing

Auditing and assurance activities are undertaken to assess the effectiveness of environmental controls, and ongoing compliance with the KKPS OEMP and associated subplans, applicable SSI Approval conditions, EPBC Approval conditions and EPL21627.

Audits and assurance activities at KKPS include:

- Regular site based inspections
- Internal audits
- External audits, consisting of;
  - SSI Independent Compliance Audits
  - SSI Independent Site Hazard Audits
  - EPBC Independent Audit
  - Environmental Management System Audits

Auditing and assurance activities will be undertaken in accordance with the KKPS OEMP.

## 6.3 Training

Formal training is developed in accordance with Snowy Hydro's Training and Development Procedure, and is administered in the company's Learning Management System (LMS) which maintains training requirements for individuals and completion records of training attended.

Personnel working at KKPS receive training relevant to their role and the required skills to fulfil their role in a competent manner. Environmental training and awareness activities that are facilitated include:

- Snowy Hydro Environmental Induction
- KKPS Site Induction
- Environmental Compliance Training
- Specialised Environmental Training
- Targeted Environmental Awareness Packages
- Daily Pre-start Meetings

Further detail on environmental related training and awareness packages are described in the KKPS OEMP.

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## 6.4 Biodiversity Management Responsibilities

During normal operating hours, KKPS is staffed by a Plant Manager, Planning Officer, and a team of Production Technicians. The Plant Manager holds overall responsibility for the management and safe operation of KKPS, including biodiversity management.

Local support for KKPS is provided at all times, with the KKPS Production Technicians available on a rostered on-call basis.

Environmental, Safety, Production and Engineering support is provided by the relevant Snowy Hydro teams based locally or Cooma as required.

Detail on the roles and responsibilities for environmental management, which includes biodiversity management, is provided in the KKPS OEMP.

## 6.5 Reporting and Notification Requirements

### 6.5.1 Incidents - Internal Reporting

Incidents at KKPS are managed in accordance with Snowy Hydro's Incident Management Procedure, and classified in accordance with the Safety and Environment Incident Classification Matrix. Incident management procedures are accessible on the Snowy Hydro Intranet, which provide guidance on internal notification and investigation requirements.

Any incident or near hit, including non-compliances and community complaints, should be reported in the event management system and communicated with the appropriate stakeholders.

### 6.5.2 Environmental Incidents - External Reporting

The response to a pollution incident causing or threatening material harm to the environment is detailed in the KKPS Emergency Response Handbook (ERH). The ERH serves as the KKPS Pollution Incident Response Management Plan (PIRMP), which is a document required by all holders of an Environment Protection Licence (EPL) under Part 5.7A of the POEO Act. A publicly available version of the PIRMP (internet based version) is also available on the Snowy Hydro website.

For full details on the external reporting requirements for environmental incidents, please refer to the KKPS OEMP.

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### 6.5.3 Non-compliance Notification - SSI Approval

As per Condition C7 of the SSI Approval, Snowy Hydro must notify the DPHI Secretary via the Major Projects Portal of any non-compliance with the conditions of the SSI Approval, within seven days after becoming aware of the non-compliance. The details required for this notification are provided in condition C8 of the SSI Approval.

Note that this excludes any non-compliances that have already been notified via the Major Projects Portal as an incident.

Further details on non-compliance notification requirements are provided in the KKPS OEMP.

### 6.5.4 Non-compliance Notification - EPBC Approval

As per Condition 8 of the EPBC Approval, Snowy Hydro must notify the Federal Department responsible for administering the EPBC Act (presently the Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water) in writing of any incident, as defined by the terms of the approval, non-compliance with the conditions of the EPBC Approval or non-compliance with commitments made in any plans required under the EPBC Approval as soon as practicable, but no later than two business days after becoming aware of the non-compliance. The details required for this notification and follow up requirements are provided in conditions 8 and 9 of the EPBC Approval.

Further details on non-compliance notification requirements are provided in the KKPS OEMP.

### 6.5.5 Statutory Environmental Reporting and Notifications

At KKPS, there are numerous statutory environmental reporting and notification requirements. Further detail on the statutory environmental reporting and notification requirements can be found in the KKPS OEMP.

## 6.6 Record Keeping

Records must be kept for all monitoring, investigation, communication, agreements, incidents, reports and any other matter that has the potential to be referred to in the future. Documentation and records relating to site operations shall be retained in accordance with Snowy Hydro's Information Asset Management Procedure.

Condition M1 of EPL21627 specifies the results of any monitoring required by the licence must be retained for a minimum of four years. These documents and records must be available onsite in hard copy or electronically within the Snowy Hydro Document Management System.

## 7.0 Document Review

The KKPS OEMP and associated subplans, including this Biodiversity MP, are not static documents, and are regularly reviewed and updated as required to reflect changes in environmental management requirements and/or statutory obligations. Updates to this Traffic MP may be made in response to:

- scheduled reviews of the OEMP, and/or associated subplans
- regulatory changes
- internal or external audit recommendations
- issues identified in Annual Compliance Reports or EPL Annual Returns
- staff and organisational changes
- incidents and investigation outcomes; and
- new initiatives in environmental management.

The SSI Approval specifies (Condition C5) that within three months of the following listed triggers, Snowy Hydro shall review and, if necessary, revise the OEMP, and relevant studies, strategies or plans required under the SSI Approval. If the review of the relevant document(s) leads to an updated revision, the document(s) will be submitted to DPHI Secretary for approval via the Major Projects Portal within 4 weeks of the document review.

The specified triggers listed under Condition C5 of the SSI approval to review applicable document(s) are:

- DPHI notification of an incident that has caused or threatened material harm (condition C6)
- The submission of an Independent Environmental Audit (conditions C15-C19)
- DPHI granting approval to a modification of any condition in the SSI Approval, or
- A direction from the DPHI Secretary

Notwithstanding the above triggers, Conditions C21 and C22 of the SSI Approval allows for Snowy Hydro to submit revised studies, strategies or plans required for KKPS under a condition of the SSI Approval at any time, and for the DPHI Secretary to approve these at any time.

With the agreement of the DPHI Secretary, the Proponent may also submit any study, strategy or plan required under the conditions of this approval on a staged basis. With the approval of the DPHI Secretary, the Proponent may prepare the revised or staged strategy or plan without undertaking consultation with all parties nominated under the applicable conditions in this approval.

This procedure will be communicated during the site induction, and as required during pre-start meeting or tool box meeting from time to time.

The Plant Manager and Senior Environmental Advisor, will be responsible to ensure the procedure is followed.

### 3) For Threatened Fauna Species

- b) Notify the Environment & Heritage Group (E&H Group) of the NSW Department of Climate Change, Energy, Environment & Water (DCCEEW) and consult with the E&H Group on the proposed management strategy for the species.
- c) The E&H Group will also be notified if an EPBC Act listed threatened species that was not previously identified are found.
- d) Do not recommence work that may affect the threatened species until the E&H Group have given advice to do so.
- e) Relocation of fauna species of conservation significance will be undertaken by WIRES or a suitably qualified ecologist in consultation with the E&H Group.
- f) The Plant Manager, or the Senior Environmental Advisor shall record the location, number, species, and relocation area of the threatened species.

### 4) For Venomous reptiles, or raptors, other venomous animals

- a) The animal must only be handled by an appropriately trained and registered handler.
- b) If the animal cannot be handled (i.e. venomous reptiles), the exact location of the animal is to be recorded and provided to the appropriate rescue agency and all workers to be excluded from the vicinity.

### 5) Release Process

- a) If the animal is not injured or stressed, it may be released nearby, in accordance with the following:
  - i) If the species is nocturnal, release will be carried out at dusk.
  - ii) The release area will be as close to the capture location, and outside the KKPS operational area.
  - iii) No releases are to take place during periods of heavy rainfall, unless the wildlife rescue service advises the animal is too stressed to be held any longer.
  - iv) The Plant Manager, or the Senior Environmental Advisor shall document and retain appropriate records of the release.

## Appendix C: Unexpected Finds Procedure

### About

In the event that a threatened species not previously known to occur on or around Kurri Kurri Power Station (i.e. not identified as potentially occurring during Biodiversity Impact Assessment of the EIS, or previous stages of the site), the unexpected finds procedure shall be followed.

The Unexpected Finds Procedure details the actions to be taken when any unexpected, threatened fauna or flora species is unexpectedly encountered at Kurri Kurri Power Station.

### Training & Awareness

Workers involved in site activities that may place them in a position to encounter a new threatened species, such as facilities or ground maintenance, will be trained in the requirements of this procedure. Training may incorporate inductions, toolbox talks, pre-starts and targeted awareness training as required.

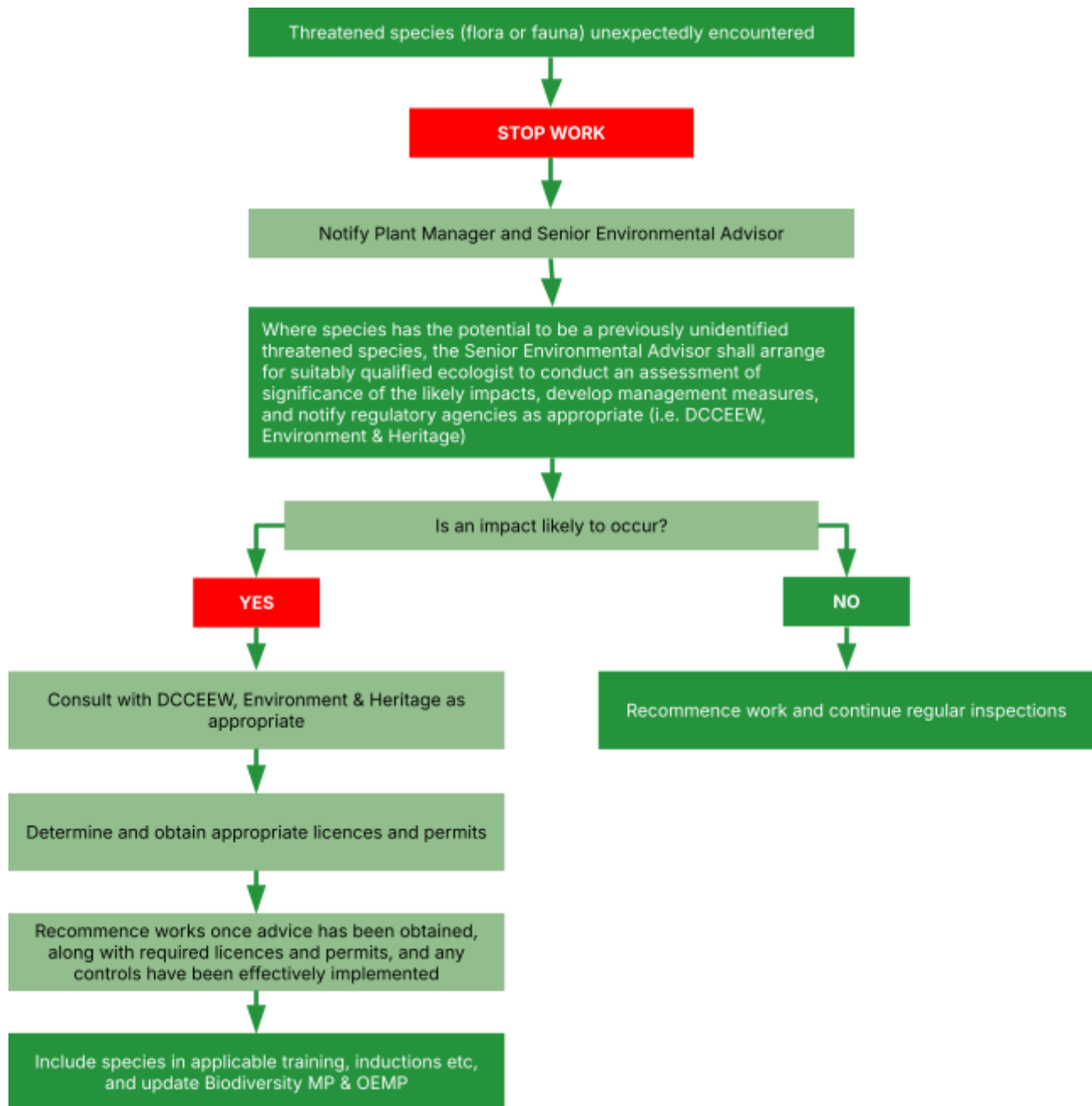
All workers shall be made aware of potential threatened species occurring on site and the unexpected threatened species finds procedure.

This procedure is applicable to all activities conducted by personnel that have the potential to come into contact with threatened species at Kurri Kurri Power Station.
