- 1. The Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) must document and describe the Aboriginal cultural heritage values that exist across the whole area that will be affected by the development. This needs to include outlining the Aboriginal cultural heritage assessments undertaken at the site and surrounding area to date.
- Consultation with the Registered Aboriginal Parties that have been identified as part of the broader Googong development area must be undertaken and documented in accordance with the <u>Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Consultation Requirements for Proponents</u> (DECCW 2010).
- 3. The EIS must outline the impacts, including possible impacts, of the project on Aboriginal cultural heritage values and the measures proposed to mitigate impacts.
- 4. The EIS must outline procedures to be followed if Aboriginal objects are found at any stage of the life of the project to formulate appropriate measures to manage unforeseen impacts.
- 5. The EIS must outline procedures to be followed in the event Aboriginal burials or skeletal material is uncovered during construction to formulate appropriate measures to manage the impacts to this material.
