Decision

Reasons for decision

The following matters were taken into consideration in making this decision:

- the relevant matters listed in section 4.15 of the Act and the additional matters listed in the statutory context section of the Department's Assessment Report:
- the prescribed matters under the Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation 2000;
- the objects of the Act;
- the considerations under s 7.14(2) and 7.16(3) of the Biodiversity Conservation Act 2016 (NSW);
- all information submitted to the Department during the assessment of the development application and any additional information considered in the Department's Assessment Report;
- the findings and recommendations in the Department's Assessment Report; and
- the views of the community about the project (see Attachment 1).

The findings and recommendations set out in the Department's Assessment Report were accepted and adopted as the reasons for making this decision. Additional reasons for making the decision are also recorded in the Department's Assessment Report.

The key reasons for granting consent to the development application are as follows:

- the project would provide a range of benefits for the region and the State as a whole, including capital investment in public health infrastructure of over \$30 million, creation of 1,872 construction jobs and 600 operational jobs, by providing health facilities and supporting the expansion of Westmead Hospital in line with the vision for the precinct.
- the project is permissible with development consent, and is consistent with NSW Government policies including the Greater Sydney Commission's Greater Sydney Regional Plan 'A Metropolis of Three Cities', Transport for NSW's Future Transport Strategy 2056, Greater Sydney Commission's Central City District Plan, NSW's State Infrastructure Strategy 2018 2038 Building the Momentum and the Westmead Place Strategy 2036 and Councils Local Strategic Planning Strategy 2036.
- the impacts on the community and the environment can be appropriately minimised, managed or offset to an acceptable level, in accordance with applicable NSW Government policies and standards in the Department's Assessment Report. The consent authority has included conditions to ensure: public art is incorporated; parking design is in compliance with relevant Australian Standards; a loading dock management plan to manage traffic impacts; a green travel plan to manage transport methods; a Construction Pedestrian and Traffic Management Plan to manage cumulative traffic impacts; and monitoring of the existing pick-up/drop-off facility to minimise traffic disruption.
- the issues raised by the community during consultation and in submissions have been considered and adequately addressed through changes to the project and the conditions of consent.
- weighing all relevant considerations, the project is in the public interest.

Attachment 1 - Consideration of Community Views

The Department exhibited the Environmental Impact Statement for the project from Thursday 15 April until Wednesday 12 May 2021 (28 days) and received two public submissions, including one objection. Comments were also received from Council.

The key issues raised by the Council and the community (including in submissions) and considered in the Department's Assessment Report and by the decision maker include: public domain; public art; traffic and parking and the impacts on the surrounding road network; car and bicycle parking; and helicopter noise impacts. Other issues are addressed in detail in the Department's Assessment Report.

Carpark Design

Compliance with Australian Standards for the carpark layout and design.

Car parking allocation

- confirmation of the parking allocation for staff and visitors.
- provide additional accessible parking.

Assessment

- the Amended DA and RtS confirmed the allocation of parking spaces for staff and visitors on the architectural plans as well as providing six additional accessible spaces within the basement of the PSB, bringing the total accessible parking spaces to seven.
- the Department considers the parking allocation and provision of additional accessible parking spaces sufficient to meet demand.

Conditions

No specific conditions required.

Bicycle Parking

 bicycle parking facilities to be provided in the new PSB to encourage active transport.

Assessment

- 10 additional bicycle spaces are accommodated within the Kids Research Building to accommodate the PSB.
- the Applicant provided evidence that the existing storage facility is currently underutilised by hospital staff.
- the Department considers that the 10 additional spaces within the Kids Research Building are sufficient to meet staff demands and are conveniently located.

Conditions

No specific conditions required.

Helicopter Noise Impacts

 any increase in noise from a helipad would adversely impact the amenity of residential neighbours.

Assessment

 the Amended DA and RtS confirmed that approval for a helipad is not being sought under this SSD application.

Conditions

No approval is granted for a helipad.
