I note receipt of:

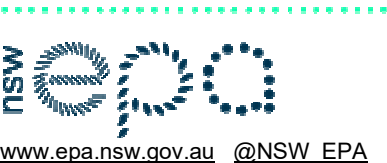
- the Stormwater Management Plan (B35) and the memo “Additional Civil Responses to Conditions of Consent” from TTW
