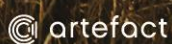

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Ramsay Health Care propose to construct a new building to house wards and consulting rooms on its existing facility at Northside West Clinic, Wentworthville. The clinic is located at 23-27 Lytton Street Wentworthville, 2145.

The clinic is located within Lot 1, DP 787784 on Lytton Street in the suburb of Wentworthville. Lytton Street Park and Finlayson Creek run along the western boundary of the site; access to the Finlayson Creek Parklands is located on the southern side of the clinic and residential housing on the northern boundary.

The study area is located within the Cumberland Local Government Area (LGA) and within the boundaries of the Deerubbin Local Aboriginal Land Council (LALC).

While the proposed building will provide an additional wing in a three storey building with 84 additional rooms and new consulting areas, the development will be undertaken within the current footprint of the site. The proposed building will be constructed on an existing open air carpark.

The proposal will be submitted by Erilyan, on behalf of the Ramsay Health Care, for assessment as a State Significant Development (SSD) under part 4.1 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*. While the Secretaries Environmental Assessment Requirements (SEARs) have not been issued, standard SEARs for Aboriginal heritage require the following (Department of Planning, Industry and Environment in December 2020):

Artefact Heritage has been engaged by Erilyan to provide an Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment Report (ACHAR) to support the EIS. The aim of this ACHAR is to identify Aboriginal cultural heritage values within the study area, conduct consultation with Aboriginal stakeholder groups and to assess impacts to Aboriginal heritage that may result from the proposal.

Consultation with registered Aboriginal parties (RAPs) is currently ongoing for the proposal.

Overview of findings

The following results and recommendations are based on consideration of:

- The requirements of Aboriginal heritage guidelines including:
 - *The Code of Practice for Archaeological Investigation of Aboriginal Objects in New South Wales* (DECCW 2010a) – known as *The Code of Practice*
 - *Guide to investigating and assessing and reporting on Aboriginal Cultural Heritage in New South Wales* (OEH 2011) – known as ACHAR guidelines.

- *The Aboriginal Cultural Heritage consultation requirements for proponents 2010* (OEH 2010b)- known as Consultation Guidelines)
- Standard SEARs (Department of Planning, Industry and Environment in December 2020).
- The results of the Due Diligence assessment completed by Artefact in April 2021 which included background research and an archaeological survey

The assessment found that:

- No previously unrecorded Aboriginal sites or objects were identified within the study area during the site inspection.
- After physical examination of the study area and examination of historical aerial photography the study area has been assessed as having nil to low potential to retain intact archaeological deposits
- The result of the consultation supports the archaeological assessment of the study area as holding nil-low potential for the preservation of Aboriginal heritage.

1.1 Recommendations

Based on the results of this assessment and in accordance with Aboriginal heritage guidelines mandated in the SEARs for the proposal, the following recommendations are made:

- As the study area was found to be disturbed and to have a nil-low potential for Aboriginal objects to be located within it, it is recommended that further assessment is not required.
- As the results of the consultation indicate that there are no sites of places of significance in the study area, no further consideration is required.
- Consultation supports the view of the Deerubbin LALC representative during the site inspection who did not identify any particular cultural significance associated with the study area.
- If changes are made to the proposal that may result in impacts to areas not assessed by this ACHAR further assessment would be required.
- Unexpected Aboriginal objects remain protected by the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974*. If any such objects, or potential objects, are uncovered in the course of the activity, all work in the vicinity should cease immediately. A qualified archaeologist should be contacted to assess the find and Heritage NSW and Deerubbin LALC must be notified.
- If human remains, or suspected human remains, are found in the course of the activity, all work in the vicinity should cease, the site should be secured, and the NSW Police and Heritage NSW should be notified.

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2.0 INTRODUCTION

2.1 Project background

Ramsay Health Care propose to construct a new building to house wards and consulting rooms on its existing facility at Northside West Clinic, Wentworthville. The clinic is located at 23-27 Lytton Street Wentworthville, 2145. While the proposed building will provide an additional wing in a three-storey building with 84 addition rooms and new consulting areas, the development will be undertaken within the current footprint of the site. Consultation with registered Aboriginal parties (RAPs) is currently ongoing for the proposal.

2.2 Location

The study area measures 2066m² and comprises the footprint of the site, including the both the open-air car park and covered car park under the building on the north side of the facility. The study area is illustrated in Figure 1.

The study area is located within Lot 1, DP 787784 and located on Lytton Street in the suburb of Wentworthville. Lytton Street Park and Finlayson Creek run along the west boundary of the site; access to the Finlayson Creek Parklands is located on the south side of the clinic and residential housing on the northern boundary.

2.2.1 Local context of the project

The study area is in a residential area, approximately 22 kilometres (km) west from the Sydney Central Business District (CBD), and 0.4 kilometres from Wentworthville train station and shops. The nearest watercourse is Finlayson Creek, an ephemeral creek located 20 meters to the west of the study area. While the area lies within the Cumberland Plain, the land has been transformed through clearing for grazing cattle during the early to mid-nineteenth century and followed by the development of the township in the late nineteenth century. The area is now suburban residential.

2.3 Overview of the project

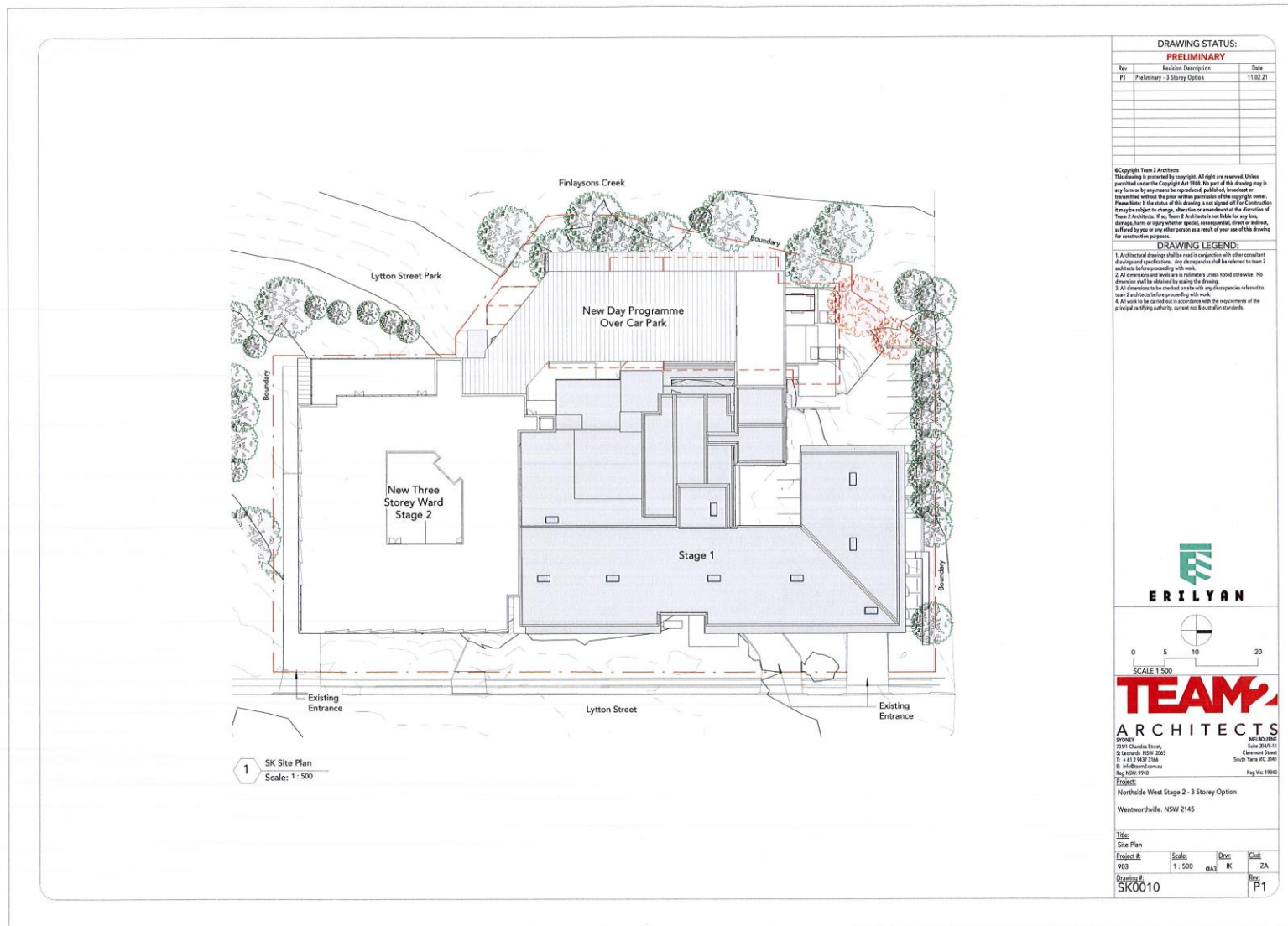
Ramsay Health Care is seeking to expand its facility through the construction of new wards and parking over 2 stages (Stages 1 and 2). Stage 2 of the development comprises a three-story building providing new wards accommodating 84 new rooms, new consulting rooms and provision of undercover parking on the ground floor. This part of the development will be constructed on top of an existing open air car park. Stage 1 consists of expansion of the facility to provide 11 additional rooms on level 1. This assessment includes the footprint of both Stage 1 and Stage 2. In addition, landscaping and planting of trees is planned on the north, south and eastern perimeter of the proposed building (Figure 2).

These works will impact on ground surfaces and subsurface deposits. This assessment is not concerned with the architectural structure or features of the building and focuses solely on potential impact on the ground and potential impact on any indigenous object on or below the surface.

The development application includes:

- Redevelopment of the car park area
- Additions to the existing facility

2.4 Purpose and scope of the report

Artefact Heritage has been engaged to prepare an ACHAR for inclusion in the proposal EIS. This technical paper considers the construction impacts on Aboriginal cultural heritage and potential archaeological resources within the study area and includes:

- Assessment of the Aboriginal cultural heritage values of the study area and identification of any specific areas of cultural significance
- Assessment of archaeological potential for the study area
- Aboriginal stakeholder consultation
- Preparation of a methodology for archaeological management including test excavation and salvage where required.

2.5 Secretary's Environmental Assessment Requirements

The SEARs have not yet been issued for this proposal. However, the standard SEARs for the investigation of Aboriginal heritage require that the following is undertaken (Department of Planning, Industry and Environment in December 2020):

3.0 LEGISLATIVE CONTEXT

3.1 Introduction

There are several pieces of legislation that are relevant to the assessment of Aboriginal cultural heritage for the proposal. This chapter provides a summary of these Acts and the potential implications for the proposal.

3.2 NSW National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974

The *National Parks and Wildlife Act* (NPW Act) provides statutory protection to all Aboriginal places and objects. An Aboriginal Place is declared by the Minister, under Section 84 of the NPW Act in recognition of its special significance with respect to Aboriginal culture. Under Section 86 of the NPW Act Aboriginal objects and Aboriginal Places are protected. An Aboriginal object is defined as:

any deposit, object or material evidence (not being a handicraft made for sale) relating to the Aboriginal habitation of the area that comprises New South Wales, being habitation before or concurrent with (or both) the occupation of that area by persons of non-Aboriginal extraction and includes Aboriginal remains.

The protection provided to Aboriginal objects applies irrespective of the level of their significance or issues of land tenure. However, areas are only gazetted as Aboriginal places if the Minister is satisfied that sufficient evidence exists to demonstrate that the location was and/or is of special significance to Aboriginal culture.

There are no gazetted Aboriginal places in the study area. All Aboriginal objects, whether recorded or not, are protected under the NPW Act.

However, as the proposal is subject to assessment under Section 4.1 of EP&A Act, Schedule 2 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation 2000, permits allowing harm to Aboriginal objects issued under the NPW Act.

3.2.1 National Parks and Wildlife Regulation 2019

Under the authority of the NPW Act, the National Parks and Wildlife Regulation 2019 provides regulations for Aboriginal heritage assessment and consultation with registered Aboriginal parties.

Part 5 (Division 2) of the National Parks and Wildlife Regulation sets out the requirements of a due diligence assessment process and provides requirements for more detailed assessment and consultation with registered Aboriginal parties for activities that may result in harm to Aboriginal objects. This includes:

- Clause 60 – consultation process to be carried out before application for Aboriginal heritage impact permit
- Clause 61 – application for Aboriginal heritage impact permit to be accompanied by cultural heritage assessment report.

In order to comply with Clause 60 and 61 of the National Parks and Wildlife Regulation 2019, preparation of an ACHAR and consultation with RAPs must be in accordance with the following guidelines:

- Code of Practice (DECCW 2010a)
- ACHAR guidelines (OEH 2011)
- Consultation guidelines (DECCW 2010b).

The current assessment has been carried out in accordance with the above guidelines in order to meet the SEARs which refer to them.

3.3 NSW Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979

The EP&A Act provides planning controls and requirements for environmental assessment in the development approval process. The EP&A Act consists of three main parts of direct relevance to Aboriginal cultural heritage: Part 3 which governs the preparation of planning instruments; Part 4 which relates to development requiring consent; and Part 5 which relates to activity that does not require consent.

The project is subject to assessment and approval by the NSW Minister for Planning and Public Spaces under Part 4 Section Division 4.7 of the EP&A Act, which establishes an assessment and approval regime for SSD.

An EIS supported by the current assessment has been prepared to assess the impacts of the proposal, in accordance with SEARs.

Section 4.12(8) of the EP&A Act provides that environmental planning instruments (such as local environmental plans and SEPPs) do not, with some exceptions, apply to SSD projects. Notwithstanding, the environmental planning instruments that are relevant to the proposal have been considered for consistency, as described below.

3.3.1 Cumberland City Council Local Environmental Plan 2010

Local Environmental Plans (LEPs) are prepared by councils in accordance with the EP&A Act to guide planning divisions for LGAs.

The aim of LEPs in relation to heritage is to conserve the heritage significance listed within this schedule.

The study area falls within the boundaries of Cumberland City Council LGA. Currently the Cumberland City Council has three LEPs, one each for Auburn, Parramatta and Holroyd. Wentworthville falls into the Holroyd LEP 2013. The Cumberland LGA is currently unifying these three separate plans to form a single strategy, currently known as the Draft Cumberland Environment Plan, anticipated for publication during the 2020/2021 financial year.

No Aboriginal places of heritage significance were identified on in Cumberland City Council's Holroyd Local Environmental Plan 2013 within the study area.

3.4 NSW Aboriginal Land Rights Act 1983

The *Aboriginal Land Rights Act* 1983 is administered by the NSW Department of Human Services - Aboriginal Affairs. This Act established Aboriginal Land Councils (at State and local levels). These bodies have a statutory obligation under the Act to:

- Take action to protect the culture and heritage of Aboriginal persons in the council's area, subject to any other law

- Promote awareness in the community of the culture and heritage of Aboriginal persons in the council's area.

The study area is located within the Deerubbin LALC boundaries.

3.5 NSW Native Title Act 1994

The *Native Title Act 1994* was introduced to work in conjunction with the Commonwealth Native Title Act. Native Title claims, registers and Indigenous Land Use Agreements are administered under the Act.

A search of the Native Title Vision mapping service, provided by the National Native Title Tribunal by Elizabeth Bonshek on 18 May 2021 did not identify any Native Title claims in or around the study area.

3.6 Commonwealth Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999

The *Environment and Heritage Legislation Amendment Act (No. 1) 2003* amends the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* (EPBC Act) to include 'national heritage' as a matter of national environmental significance and protects listed places to the fullest extent under the Constitution. It also establishes the National Heritage List and the Commonwealth Heritage List.

The *Australian Heritage Council Act 2003* establishes a new heritage advisory body – the Australian Heritage Council – to the Minister for the Environment and Energy and retains the Register of the National Estate.

The *Australian Heritage Council (Consequential and Transitional Provisions) Act 2003* repeals the *Australian Heritage Commission Act 1975*, amends various Acts as a consequence of this repeal and allows the transition to the current heritage system.

Together the above three Acts provide protection for Australia's natural, Indigenous and non-Indigenous heritage. The new framework includes:

- A new National Heritage List of places of national heritage significance
- A Commonwealth Heritage List of heritage places owned or managed by the Commonwealth
- The creation of the Australian Heritage Council, an independent expert body to advise the Minister on the listing and protection of heritage places
- Continued management of the non-statutory Register of the National Estate.

3.6.1 National Heritage List

The National Heritage List is a list of places with outstanding heritage value to our nation, including places overseas. So important are the heritage values of these places that they are protected under the EPBC Act. This means that a person cannot take an action that has, will have, or is likely to have, a significant impact on the national heritage values of a national heritage place without the approval of the Australian Government Minister for the Environment.

There are no items listed on the National Heritage List located within the study area for this assessment.

3.6.2 Commonwealth Heritage List

The Commonwealth Heritage List is a list of places managed or owned by the Australian Government.

There are no items listed on the Commonwealth Heritage List located within the study area for this assessment.

4.0 ABORIGINAL COMMUNITY PARTICIPATION

4.1 Aboriginal consultation

Aboriginal community consultation has been conducted in accordance with the Consultation Requirements.

A consultation log has been maintained which details all correspondence with the registered Aboriginal parties for the project.

4.2 Identification of stakeholders and registrations of interest

The consultation for this ACHAR commenced in anticipation of SEARs for the development of the new building at the Northside West Clinic. The consultation follows the Consultation Requirements of the Department of Environment, Climate Change and Water (DECCW 2010a).

Documentation of the consultation process is provided in the Appendix.

In accordance with step 4.1.2 of the Consultation Requirements, Artefact Heritage corresponded with the following organisations by email on the 21 April 2021 requesting the details of Aboriginal people who may hold cultural knowledge relevant to determining the Aboriginal significance of Aboriginal objects and/or places within the local area:

- Cumberland Council
- Deerubbin Local Aboriginal Land Council (Deerubbin LALC)
- Greater Sydney Local Land Services
- Heritage NSW
- National Native Title Tribunal
- Office of the Registrar, Aboriginal Land Rights Act 1983
- Native Title Service Corporation (NTSCorp)
- Heritage NSW – Parramatta Office

In addition to this, and in accordance with Step 4.1.3 of the Consultation Requirements, an advertisement was placed in the *Parra* on 27 April 2021, inviting the participation of Aboriginal people who may hold cultural knowledge relevant to determining the Aboriginal significance of Aboriginal objects and/or places within the local area.

In accordance with Step 4.1.3 of the Consultation Requirements, between the 13 and 17 May 2021, emails or letters were sent to all Aboriginal persons or organisations identified through advertisement or through responses from agencies contacted as part of Step 4.1.2. In accordance with Step 4.2 the letters provided details about the location and nature of the proposal, as well as an invitation to register as an Aboriginal stakeholder.

As a result, 14 groups and individuals registered their interest (Table 2). A copy of the assessment methodology was sent to registered Aboriginal parties (RAPs) by email on 22 June, requesting comments by 21 July 2021. At the end of this period 4 RAPs had responded. These RAPs supported

the findings of the methodology and of the Archaeological Survey. Their comments are presented below (Table 3).

5.0 ENVIRONMENTAL CONTEXT

5.1 Geology and soils

The study area is located within the Cumberland Plain. The underlying geology of the study area consists of late Triassic period Bringelly shale deposits belonging to the Wianamatta Group (Clark and Jones 1991). These deposits consist predominantly of claystone and siltstone with thin laminate horizons. The soils within the study area would have originally consisted of the residual Blacktown soil landscape (Bannerman and Hazleton 1990). The Blacktown soils are shallow (<1000 millimetres [mm]) hard setting mottled red and brown podzolic soils on crests and yellow podzolic soils on lower slopes and along drainage lines (Bannerman and Hazleton 1990). The Blacktown soil landscape is generally associated with gently undulating rises. The soils are primarily poorly drained with very little erosional activity. However, the study area, has been disturbed by the encroachment of urban development and transport infrastructure. Remaining soils have been disturbed by human activity to a depth of at least one meter, and the original vegetation cleared.

5.2 Landforms and hydrology

The study area is located in an area, which, prior to development, would have been characterised by rolling plains and undulating hills of the Cumberland Plain. The nearest watercourse is Finlaysons Creek, an ephemeral watercourse which lies some 20 m to the west side of the study area. This second-order tributary feeds into Toongabbie Creek some 1.4 kilometres to the north and subsequently joins the Parramatta River 0.8 km further on. The Finlayson watercourse has been realigned and concreted to form a flood water channel (Holroyd City Council 2004:10).

5.3 Vegetation

The region would have originally featured the Cumberland Plain Woodland, which formerly vegetated much of Western Sydney. This vegetation was characterised by mixed Grey Box (*Eucalyptus moluccana*), Forest Red Gum (*E. tereticornis*) and Narrow-leaved Ironbark (*E. crebra*) woodland with a grass and shrub understory (Benson and Howell 1995:70). The current landscape has been largely modified for industrial development and cleared of native vegetation. The study area lies adjacent to the Lytton Street Park, which forms part of the Finlaysons Creek Linear Park Network. The area is not regarded as natural open space (Holroyd City Council 2004:25), but small remnant trees remain, and these were physically protected in the 1990s to encourage regrowth (2004:10). Native trees in these areas include *Eucalyptus eugenioides*, *Casuarina glauca* (Swamp Oak), and *Eucalyptus tereticornis*. Native shrubs include *Acacia decurrens* (Black Wattle) and *Bursaria spinosa* (Blackthorn) (Holroyd City Council 2004:10).

5.4 European history and land use

The first European activity in the area was exploratory; however, this was shortly followed by settlement. The first land grants in the Blacktown region (Blacktown is 7.45 km from the study area) were at Prospect Hill (some 5.5 km from the study site). Governor Phillip granted a total of 13 plots, ranging in size from 30 to 70 acres, to emancipated convicts in 1791 (Historical Records of NSW 1978). As European settlement expanded across Aboriginal land, conflict increased in the mid-1790s. In the period 1797 to 1805, events in the districts of Parramatta-Toongabbie, the Hawkesbury and Georges River included theft from farms, and killings on both sides (Comber Jan 2015: 22). In 1797, a violent confrontation took place on the outskirts of Parramatta (approximately 2.5 kms from the study area), resulting in the deaths of five Aboriginal men and the wounding of their leader Pemulwuy (Comber Jan 2015: 22). After a further outbreak of hostility in 1816, the colonial government

introduced tighter restrictions on the movement of Aboriginal people in and around settlements, and then also on their movement between Sydney and Parramatta (Comber Jan 2015: 23). Military detachments were deployed to enforce these restrictions.

The colonial history of Wentworthville is briefly described by the City of Parramatta (2020). The suburb was named after the colonial surgeon D'Arcy Wentworth. In 1796, as assistant and then later principal surgeon at Parramatta, Wentworth first leased land in Parramatta and then an additional 6 acres in the same area in 1799. A successful businessman, Wentworth increased his holdings to 17,000 acres through grants and purchases by 1821. He grazed livestock on his estate, known as Fitzwilliam Place. His home was called Wentworth Wood House.

Between 1818 and 1920 the area along the M4 Western Highway between Prospect and South Creek was granted to ex-convicts and free settlers. Taking advantage of the heavy traffic along the Western Road (now the Great Western Highway) William Fullagar leased a portion of the Wentworth's estate in 1841. He opened an Inn offering a staging post for graziers transporting cattle (some 2-3 km from the current study site) and in 1845 opened cattle yards which become the main sale yard for the colony. In 1881, Thomas Richard Smith purchased 500 acres from Fitzwilliam Wentworth (D'Arcy Wentworth's grandson) which was sold as subdividable land to create a township, which was named the Wentworthville Estate. Because all the plots did not sell, a second subdivision was made which included the land used by the Fullagars Cattle Yard, which had ceased trading by then. In 1885 the Wentworthville Estate Lands and Building Company was established and in the same year roads and new houses were constructed. The size of the proposed township was increased with the addition of the remaining land held by Thomas Richard Smith. It was in this year that the area was named Wentworthville. In the 1890s a post office and public school opened (City of Parramatta, 2020).

The fields around Finlaysons Creek, part of Darcy Wentworth's original grant, were used for market gardening and poultry farming in the 1920s and 1930s (Holroyd City Council 2004). In the 1920s George Allen Bond moved from Redfern to Wentworthville, expanding his hosiery and underwear business, Bonds Manufacturing Ltd., establishing a factory there. The business continued until 2010. A fire station and theatre and electricity were established by 1935 (City of Parramatta, 2020).

The history of the suburb reflects deforestation for the development of cattle grazing followed by subdivision of the land for residential housing. Aerial photographs from 1930 show the residential block on which the facility now stands was denuded and has been subject to regrowth. In 1930 the block on which Northside West Clinic now stands, with Jordan Street appearing in the top right corner and Haig Street located in the bottom right corner) three houses are visible with trees located to the west Figure 3. By 1956 the water course has been defined and buildings cover the entire block (Figure 4). By 1961 a long building has been constructed along the width of the block (

Figure 5) and only 4 years later the block is almost denuded of trees (

Figure 6). While the resolution of the 1989 image is poor, the long building centrally located has gone, and the current footprint of the facility is becoming discernible, and the open-air carpark is in place. Tree growth also appears (Figure 6). In 1994 the car park is clearly visible and tree growth apparent (Figure 7).

6.0 ARCHAEOLOGICAL AND ETHNOGRAPHIC CONTEXT

6.1 Ethnographic and historical evidence

The language spoken on the Cumberland Plain is known as Darug (Dharruk – alternative spelling). This term was used for the first time in 1900 by Matthews & Everitt (Mathews & Everitt 1900: 265). The Darug language group is thought to have extended from Appin in the south to the Hawkesbury River, west of the Georges River, Parramatta, the Lane Cove River and to Berowra Creek (Attenbrow 2010:34). The area was home to a number of different groups. However, traditional boundaries have primarily been reconstructed based on surviving linguistic evidence and are therefore only approximations: it is difficult to describe social interaction, tribal boundaries and linguistic evidence and any simple way, and it is also that boundaries and interaction across them varied over time.

It is likely that the Darug people enjoyed a subsistence lifestyle moving across the landscape in response to changing seasons and the availability of food and other resources. No doubt trade too affected where and when people travelled (Attenbrow 2010: 78).

Subsistence activities also varied throughout the different regions of the Cumberland Plain, particularly between coastal and inland groups (Brook & Kohen 1991: 3). Coastal groups were observed to rely on resources such as fish and shellfish, whereas inland groups relied more on small animals, plants and freshwater fish and eels (Tench 1793: 230; Kohen 1986: 77). There are many accounts by Europeans of Aboriginal people in canoes on rivers and the ocean, fishing and cooking their catch on small fires within the vessels (e.g. Collins 1798). Banksia flowers, wild honey, varieties of wild yam and Burrawong nut were recorded as important food sources (Collins 1798; Kohen 1985: 9), particularly for inland groups. Small animals such as bandicoots and wallabies were hunted through traps and snares (Kohen 1985: 9). Captain Tench observed the prowess of Darug men in carving footholds into trees in order to swiftly climb while hunting possums, sometimes supplemented by smoking the animals out with fire (Tench 1793:82).

Plants were an important source of nutrition: common edible species included *Macrozamia*, a cycad palm with poisonous seeds requiring processing to remove toxins and then ground into a paste; and *Xanthorrhoea*, also known as the grass tree. The nectar of the grass tree is a high-energy food: in addition, the resin acts as a strong glue for hafting tools while the flower spikes were used for spear barbs. From observations of early European colonists, about 20 species of plant were identified as being used by Aboriginal people of the Sydney region for food or for manufacturing various items (Attenbrow 2010: 41). It is likely this is only a fraction of what was actually used.

British colonisation had a profound and devastating effect on the Aboriginal population of the Sydney region, including Darug speakers. In the early days of the colony, Aboriginal people were disenfranchised from their land as the British claimed areas for settlement and agriculture. The colonists, often at the expense of the local Aboriginal groups, also claimed resources such as pastures, timber, fishing grounds and water sources. But the devastation of Aboriginal culture did not come about through war with the British, but instead through disease and forced removal from traditional lands. It is thought that during the 1789 smallpox epidemic over half of the Aboriginal people of the Sydney region died. The disease spread west to the Darug of the Cumberland Plain and north to the Hawkesbury. It may have in fact spread much further afield, over the Blue Mountains (Butlin 1983). This loss of life meant that some of the Aboriginal groups who lived away from the coastal settlement of Sydney may have disappeared entirely before Europeans could observe them or record their clan names (Karskens 2010: 452).

It was not until rural settlement began in the western Cumberland Plain, around 1791 however, that the colonists and Aboriginal people came face to face. Relations quickly disintegrated, and tensions

over land and resources spilled over. Governor King sanctioned the shooting of Aboriginal people in a General Order made in 1801. Intermittent killings on both sides continued for over 15 years, including the Appin massacre and attacks at South Creek in 1816 (Karskens 2010: 225).

Although tensions existed between Aboriginal people and colonialists on the Cumberland Plain, a number of Aboriginal families continued to live semi-traditional lives in the area. In 1805, a meeting was held near Prospect Hill (5.5 km away) to discuss an end to the conflict in the local area. The meeting was arranged by Reverend Samuel Marsden, on the suggestion of local Aboriginal groups, and was mediated by a group of Aboriginal women and John Kennedy, a free settler. Marsden's efforts appear to have been seen by some local Aboriginal people as duplicitous, and recent research has shed light on the ongoing war for freedom from colonisation waged by local Aboriginal people (Gapps, 2018).

The government policy of removal of Aboriginal children from their parents in order to assimilate them into white society began fairly early on in the colony's history and was epitomized by the development of the Native Institution at Parramatta in 1814. This facility was moved to the Black Town settlement in 1823, about 7 km northwest of the current study area. It was closed in 1829 and the land subsequently used for farming (Norman 2015).

An Aboriginal population of considerable size remained in Parramatta and the surrounding locality well into the 1830s. Aboriginal people continue to live in the area and retain cultural associations with their Country.

6.2 Archaeological evidence

Aboriginal people have lived in the Sydney area for more than 36,000 years. The oldest dated site in the greater Sydney region is Cranebrook Terrace which was dated at approximately 41,700 years Before Present (BP) with an error range of 5,000 years (Attenbrow 2010: 18; Karskens 2020). Evidence of Aboriginal occupation has been found dated to 50-60,000 BP at Lake Mungo in NSW, so it is likely that Aboriginal people have lived in the Sydney region for even longer than indicated by the oldest recorded dates we have at present. The archaeological material record provides evidence of this long occupation, but also provides evidence of a dynamic culture that has changed through time.

The existing archaeological record is limited to certain materials and objects that were able to withstand degradation and decay. As a result, the most common type of Aboriginal objects remaining in the archaeological record are stone artefacts. Archaeological analyses of these artefacts in their contexts have provided the basis for the interpretation of change in material culture over time. Technologies used for making tools changed, along with preference of raw material. Different types of tools appeared at certain times, for example ground stone hatchets are first observed in the archaeological record around 4,000 BP in the Sydney region (Attenbrow 2010). It is argued that these changes in material culture were an indication of changes in social organisation and behaviour.

After 8,500 BP silcrete was more dominant as a raw material, and bifacial flaking became the most common technique for tool manufacture. From about 4,000 BP to 1,000 BP backed artefacts appear more frequently. Tool manufacture techniques become more varied and bipolar flaking increases (McDonald 2006). It has been argued that from 1,400 to 1,000 years before contact there is evidence of a decline in tool manufacture. This reduction may be the result of decreased tool making, an increase in the use of organic materials, changes in the way tools were made, or changes in what types of tools were preferred (McDonald 2006). The reduction in evidence coincides with the reduction in frequency of backed blades as a percentage of the assemblage.

Further detail on the archaeological record in the surrounds of the study area will be provided in Section 6.4 below.

6.3 Registered Aboriginal sites

NOTE: The location of Aboriginal sites is considered culturally sensitive information. It is advised that this information, including the AHIMS data appearing on the heritage map for the proposal be removed from this report if it is to enter the public domain.

A basic search of the Aboriginal Heritage Information System (AHIMS) was undertaken on 6 April 2021 (Client Service ID 581261) to determine the location of Aboriginal sites in relation to the current study area. The search included the study area and a surrounding 1 kilometre buffer. The parameters of the search were as follows:

The search determined that there are no registered Aboriginal sites within the search area. The AHIMS database records sites using a list of twenty standard site types, none of which were found within the basic search (Office of Environment and Heritage (OEH) 2012):

- Artefacts: Objects such as stone tools, modified glass or shell showing evidence of use by aboriginal people.
- Potential archaeological deposit: An area where Aboriginal objects may exist below the ground surface.

No recorded sites were located within the study area or with one kilometre of the study area.

Aboriginal occupation covered the whole of the landscape, though the availability of fresh water and resources was a significant factor in repeated and long-term occupation. Certain site types, such as culturally modified trees, are particularly vulnerable to destruction through historical occupation. As a result, more resilient site types, such as stone artefacts, are predominant in the archaeological record. Because of this, the nature and location of registered Aboriginal sites is an imperfect reflection of past Aboriginal occupation. Furthermore, the surviving archaeological record is also a reflection not only of historical land-use, disturbance, and the post-depositional events, but also reflects the sampling bias of previous archaeological investigation.

6.4 Previous archaeological investigations

There have been no previous archaeological assessment of the study area and no Aboriginal heritage objects or sites were recorded in the basic AHIMS database search.

While there has been considerable archaeological assessment in the Cumberland region generally, there has been little assessment in the vicinity of the study area. An Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment of the Wentworth Public School (Hardy 2018) roughly one kilometre away discovered no Aboriginal objects and low archaeological potential for the school site because of the disturbed nature of the ground surfaces. While the site held general cultural significance for Aboriginal communities the ACHAR did not result in specific requirements for the management of heritage values.

There have been extensive assessments of the Parramatta area including the Parramatta Park Precinct (including Artefact 2015a and 2015b) which lies 2 kms to the east. Artefact (2015) listed 80 sites in the vicinity of the park distributed in a northwest / southeast corridor along the path of the Parramatta River. The distribution of these sites is associated with the Parramatta Sand Sheet which

has provided a fertile area in regard to finding Aboriginal objects. However, the Parramatta Sand Sheet does not extend to the study area.

6.5 Predictive model

Archaeological assessments of Aboriginal sites have resulted in the development of several predictive trends.

Key findings of these studies include:

- Archaeological evidence of Aboriginal occupation is likely to be focussed on higher order watercourses, which is reflected in the predominance of PADs and artefacts surrounding these resources. Lesser order watercourses are less likely to contain evidence of prolonged or frequent Aboriginal occupation.
- Minimally disturbed lower slopes or ridgelines overlooking water courses are highly sensitive. These areas have the potential to contain evidence of more permanent or frequent occupation by Aboriginal people; these may be reflected by higher density artefact assemblages. Areas which are a significant walking distance from water or within a flood plain are not considered to be desirable places for camping. Furthermore, flooding can also reduce the potential for intact archaeological material in these areas.
- Historical development is a major factor in reducing the potential for archaeological deposits. Historical development includes quarrying, the construction of dams, and the establishment of road networks.

The predictive modelling suggests that areas subject to flooding are less likely to retain evidence of past Aboriginal activity while areas with access to permanent water sources, minimally disturbed ground surface and lower slopes and ridge lines are highly sensitive.

The study area is in a highly disturbed area and in close proximity to what was an ephemeral water course.

7.0 SITE SURVEY METHODOLOGY

7.1 Aboriginal site definition

An Aboriginal site is generally defined as an Aboriginal object or place. An Aboriginal object refers to any deposit, object or material evidence (not being a handicraft) relating to Aboriginal habitation of the area that comprises New South Wales (DECCW 2010). Aboriginal objects may include stone tools, scarred trees or rock art. Some sites, or Aboriginal places, can also be intangible and although they might not be visible, these places have cultural significance to Aboriginal people.

The Code of Practice states, in regard to the definition of a site and its boundary, that one or more of the following criteria must be used when recording material traces of Aboriginal land use:

- The spatial extent of any visible Aboriginal objects, or direct evidence of their location
- Obvious physical boundaries where present, for example mound site and middens (if visibility is good), a ceremonial ground
- Identification by the Aboriginal community on the basis of cultural information

7.2 Archaeological survey methodology

7.2.1 Site inspection

Elizabeth Bonshek and Michael Lever (Artefact Heritage) carried out a site visit on 12 April 2021 accompanied by Steve Randall (Deerubbin LALC). The perimeter of the site was inspected as well as the open air carpark, adjacent to the facility.

A photographic record was made of the study area.

The study area did not have any undisturbed ground surfaces. All areas have been built upon, surfaced or landscaped. There was no ground surface visibility. In addition to the front of the building (Figure 9) - the east side of the study area - all remaining perimeters have landscaped areas (for example Figure 10 to

Figure 12). The open-air carpark located on the southern side of the study area (Stage 2) has been surfaced throughout (Figure 10). The loading bay located in Stage 1 has been excavated below ground level (

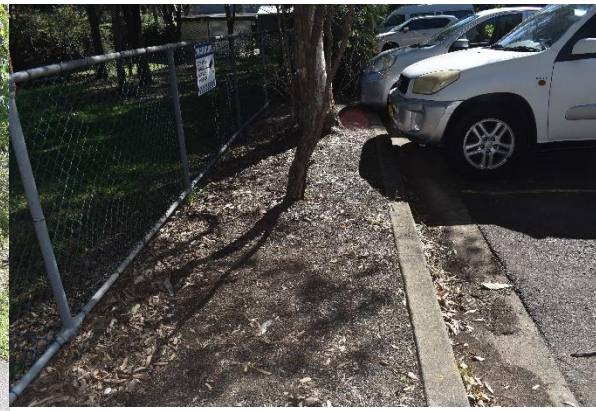


Figure 13. Entrance from Lytton Street into loading area below ground surface

Figure 13 and

Figure 14) and the undercover carpark has been excavated to form a partial split level towards the rear of the parking bays (Figure 15 and Figure 16). The ground has been further reshaped towards the northwest corner (

Figure 17).

The ground in the study area has been extensively impacted by the construction of the existing facility and car park.

7.2.2 Aims of archaeological survey

The aims of the archaeological survey were to:

- Inspect the perimeter of the site and car park, with focus on the latter as the central location for the proposed works
- Record any surface or potential subsurface Aboriginal sites that have not been recorded in AHIMS
- Identify areas of PAD that may be present in areas that have had no or minimal disturbance
- Engage with Deerubbin LALC regarding the proposed works and the archaeological potential of the study area
- Collect information to ascertain whether further archaeological investigation is required.

7.3 Archaeological survey coverage

The study area is located on land that would have been a gentle slope prior to the construction of the current facility. The perimeter of the study area is located on land that has been disturbed, excavated and levelled. However, the perimeter does provide sight of uncovered soil along edgings and boundaries, although these areas are likely to contain soils that have been transported onto the site.

The perimeter of the study area was examined, both from within the area of the site and also from the outside of the study area, which was easily viewable through an open chain link fence. The surface of the open air and undercover car parks were also investigated. However, all of the study area has been built over or landscaped.

A summary of the survey coverage of all survey units, according to the methodology outlined in the Code of Practice, is provided in Table 5 and Table 6.

8.0 SIGNIFICANCE ASSESSMENT

8.1 Significance assessment methodology

An assessment of the cultural heritage significance of an item or place is required in order to form the basis of its management. *The Guide to investigating, assessing and reporting on Aboriginal cultural heritage in NSW* (OEH 2011) provides guidelines for heritage assessment with reference to the *Burra Charter* (Australia ICOMOS 2013). The assessment is made in relation to four values or criteria (Table 7). In relation to each of the criteria, the significance of the subject area should be ranked as high, moderate, or low.

Cultural heritage consists of places or objects, that are of significance to Aboriginal people. Cultural heritage values are the attributes of these places or objects that allow the assessment of levels of cultural significance.

Assessing the cultural significance of a place or object means defining why a place or object is culturally important. It is only when these reasons are defined that measures can be taken to appropriately manage possible impacts on this significance. Assessing cultural significance involves two main steps, identifying the range of values present across the study area and assessing why they are important.

Social/cultural heritage significance should be addressed by the Aboriginal people who have a connection to, or interest in, the site. As part of the consultation process the Aboriginal stakeholders were asked to provide information on the cultural significance of the study area. Information on consultation with Aboriginal stakeholders for the project is provided in Section 0.

In addition to the four criteria, Heritage NSW (OEH 2011; 10) requires consideration of the following:

- Research potential: does the evidence suggest any potential to contribute to an understanding of the area and/or region and/or state's natural and cultural history?
- Representativeness: how much variability (outside and/or inside the subject area) exists, what is already conserved, how much connectivity is there?
- Rarity: is the subject area important in demonstrating a distinctive way of life, custom, process, land use, function or design no longer practised? Is it in danger of being lost or of exceptional interest?
- Education potential: does the subject area contain teaching sites or sites that might have teaching potential?

8.2 Socio/cultural significance

Socio/cultural heritage values should be addressed by Aboriginal people who have a connection to, or interest in, the area.

The RAPs who provided feedback did not make any specific comments regarding socio/cultural heritage significance.

8.3 Historic significance

Historic values refer to the association of place with aspect of Aboriginal history. Historic values are not necessarily reflected in physical objects, but may be intangible and relate to memories, stories, or experiences.

The RAPs who provided feedback did not make any specific comments regarding historical significance.

8.4 Scientific significance

Scientific values refer to a site's potential to contribute to our current understanding and information. As there are no archaeological values in the site, there is no scientific significance.

8.5 Aesthetic significance

Aesthetic values refer to the sensory, scenic, architectural, and creative aspects of the place. These values may be related to the landscape and are often closely associated with social/cultural values.

The RAPs who provided feedback did not make any specific comments regarding aesthetic significance.

8.6 Statement of significance

In summary, the RAPs who provided feedback did not make any specific comments regarding the social/cultural, historic or aesthetic significance of the study area. The significance of the study area is therefore assessed to be of low.

9.0 AVOIDING AND MINIMISING HARM

9.1 Proposed works

Ramsay Health Care is seeking to expand its facility through the construction of new wards and parking over 2 stages (Stages 1 and 2). Stage 2 of the development comprises a three-story building providing new wards accommodating 84 new rooms, new consulting rooms and provision of undercover parking on the ground floor. This part of the development will be constructed on top of an existing open air car park. Stage 1 consists of expansion of the facility to provide 11 additional rooms on level 1.

These works will impact on ground surfaces and subsurface deposits through:

- Excavation of ground surfaces, including in the open air car park
- Additions to the existing facility
- Landscaping and planting trees.

9.2 Impact assessment methodology

The definition of harm to an object or place under the NPW Act includes any act or omission that 'destroys, defaces or damages the object or place or in relation to an object –moves the object from land on which it had been situated.'

Direct harm may occur as a result of activities which disturb the ground surface including site preparation activities, earthworks and ground excavation, and the installation of services and infrastructure.

Indirect harm for Aboriginal heritage refers to impacts that may affect sites or features located immediately beyond or within the area of the proposed works. Indirect harm may include impacts from vibration, increased visitation, or increased erosion, including ancillary project activities (construction and/or operation) that are not located within the study area.

9.3 Aboriginal heritage impact assessment

There were no Aboriginal objects identified in the survey area, and no sites identified in the AHIMS database. This report has assessed that intact archaeological deposits are not likely to be present below the ground surface. Therefore, the proposal is unlikely to impact any Aboriginal heritage items or places, or potential Aboriginal archaeology (Table 9).

9.4 Ecologically Sustainable Development principles

In accordance with the *Guide to Investigating, Assessing and Reporting on Aboriginal Cultural Heritage in New South Wales*¹, the principles of ecologically sustainable development have been considered in preparation of this Aboriginal heritage assessment, including options to avoid impacts to Aboriginal cultural heritage, assessment of unavoidable impacts, identification of mitigation and management measures, and taking account of Aboriginal community views. The principles of ecologically sustainable development are detailed in the NSW *Protection of the Environment Administration Act 1991*. Principles of ecologically sustainable development relevant to the assessment of the project as it relates to Aboriginal cultural heritage are considered below.

9.4.1 The integration principle

Decision making processes should effectively integrate both long term and short term economic, environmental, social and equitable considerations (the 'integration principle'). The preparation of this ACHAR demonstrates regard for the integration principle by considering Aboriginal heritage values and impacts to these from the proposal during its planning phase. The nature of the proposal is in itself one that contributes to the long term economic and social needs of current and future residents of the area.

9.4.2 The precautionary principle

If there are threats of serious or irreversible environmental damage, lack of full scientific confidence should not be used as a reason for postponing measures to prevent environmental degradation (the 'precautionary principle').

As no archaeological sites were identified in the study area, no further archaeological investigation is recommended.

9.4.3 The principle of intergenerational equity

The proposed works would adhere, as close as possible, to the principle of intergenerational equity by collating scientific and cultural information on former Aboriginal occupation of the study area through the previous investigations and this ACHAR.

This report has assessed that no further archaeological investigations through test excavations need be conducted. However, see Unexpected Finds below.

9.5 Cumulative impacts

A cumulative impact is an impact on Aboriginal cultural heritage resulting from the incremental impact of the action/s of a development when added to other past, present and reasonably foreseeable future actions.

As no archaeological finds have been discovered in the study area, the impact of the proposed development has been assessed as having no harm or cumulative impacts to the Aboriginal heritage of the region.

A draft of the ACHAR was provided to RAPS for commentary and feedback on July 23 July 2021. The RAPS did not provide additional information.

10.0 MANAGEMENT AND MITIGATION MEASURES

10.1 Ongoing consultation with registered Aboriginal parties

Consultation with the registered Aboriginal parties is continuing. Following the Unexpected finds policy below, consultation with Aboriginal parties will continue at completion of the ACHAR and also according to the results of the consultation process which is currently ongoing.

10.2 Unexpected finds

An unexpected finds policy would be implemented in the event of any unexpected finds of Aboriginal sites, objects, or archaeological deposits being identified during construction.

An unexpected archaeological finds policy would involve the following actions:

- Stop work within the affected area, protect the potential archaeological find, and inform environment staff or supervisor
- Contact a suitably qualified archaeologist to assess the potential archaeological find
- If Aboriginal archaeological material is identified, works in the area should cease, and NSW Heritage should be informed. Further archaeological mitigation may be required prior to works recommencing
- If human remains are found:
 - Immediately cease all work at the particular location
 - Notify site manager and project archaeologist
 - Notify NSW Police
 - Notify Heritage NSW on the Environment Line 131555 as soon as practicable and provide details of the remains and their locations
 - Notify the Deerubbin LALC
 - Do not recommence any work at the location until cleared

11.0 CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

11.1 Conclusions

The following results and recommendations are based on consideration of:

- The requirements of Aboriginal heritage guidelines:
 - The ACHAR guide (OEH 2011)
 - The Code of Practice (DECCW 2010a)
 - Consultation Requirements (DECCW 2010b)
- Standard SEARS (Department of Planning, Industry and Environment 2020)
- The results of the Due Diligence assessment completed by Artefact in April 2019 which included background research and archaeological survey results
- The likely impacts of the proposed development
- Consultation with RAPS resulted in establishing that there were no socio/cultural, historical or aesthetic values associated with the study area.

11.2 Recommendations

Based on the results of this assessment and in accordance with Aboriginal heritage guidelines mandated in the SEARs for the proposal, the following recommendations are made:

- As the study area was found to be disturbed and to have a nil-low potential for Aboriginal objects to be located within it, it is recommended that further assessment is not required.
- The result of the consultation with RAPs indicates that there are no sites or places of significance in the study area, and no further action is recommended.
- Consultation supports the archaeological assessment of the study area as holding nil-low potential for the preservation of Aboriginal heritage. No further action is recommended.
- Consultation with the RAPs supports the view of the Deerubbin LALC representative during the site inspection who did not identify any particular significance associated with the study area.
- If changes are made to the proposal that may result in impacts to areas not assessed by this ACHAR further assessment would be required.
- Unexpected Aboriginal objects remain protected by the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974*. If any such objects, or potential objects, are uncovered in the course of the activity, all work in the vicinity should cease immediately. A qualified archaeologist should be contacted to assess the find and Heritage NSW and Deerubbin LALC must be notified.
- If human remains, or suspected human remains, are found in the course of the activity, all work in the vicinity should cease, the site should be secured, and the NSW Police and Heritage NSW should be notified.

Thank you for registering as a stakeholder for the proposed development of the Northside West Clinic (the proposal). I am looking forward to working with you on this project. Included below are details of the project, and the proposed assessment methodology for your review.

1.1 Proposed Development

Ramsay Health Care propose to construct a new building to house wards and consulting rooms on its existing facility at Northside West Clinic, Wentworthville. The clinic is located at 23-27 Lytton Street Wentworthville, 2145 (Lot 1, DP 787784 see figure 1)

The clinic fronts onto Lytton Street. Access to the Finlayson Creek Parklands lies to the south side of the clinic and the parkland extends the length of the site at the rear. Residential housing is located on the northern boundary.

The project will be submitted by Erilyan, on behalf of the Ramsay Health Care, for assessment as a State Significant Development under part 4.1 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979. While the SEARs (Secretaries Environmental Assessment Requirements) have not been issued, standard SEARs for Aboriginal heritage require (Department of Planning, Industry and Environment in December 2020) that an Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment Report (ACHAR) be prepared in accordance with the *Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Consultation Requirements for Proponents* (DECCW 2010) for inclusion in the EIS.

1.2 Background

A due diligence assessment was completed for the study area on 16 May 2021. The aim of the Due Diligence assessment was to assist Erilyan to exercise due diligence when carrying out activities that may harm Aboriginal objects and to determine whether they should apply for consent in the form of an Aboriginal Heritage Impact Permit (AHIP) or State Significant Development (SSD) approval.

A due diligence assessment should take reasonable and practicable steps to ascertain whether there is a likelihood that Aboriginal sites will be disturbed or impacted during the proposed activity. If it is assessed that sites exist or have a likelihood of existing within the activity area and may be impacted by the proposed activity, further archaeological investigations may be required. If it is found to be unlikely that Aboriginal sites exist within the study area and the due diligence assessment has been conducted in accordance with the Due Diligence Code of Practice, work may proceed without additional archaeological investigations.

The Due Diligence assessment found that there were no recorded Aboriginal sites within 1km of the study area (see Figure 1). Further, no previously unrecorded Aboriginal sites or objects were identified within the study area during the site inspection. After physical examination of the study area and examination of historical aerial photography of the study area, the site was assessed as having nil to low potential to retain intact archaeological deposits because the site had been disturbed by previous construction activity.

An ACHAR is now sought to establish whether the site has any Aboriginal heritage significance.

1.3 Proposed Assessment Methodology

The ACHAR will be completed in accordance with the relevant guidelines:

- *Guide to Investigating, Assessing, and Reporting on Aboriginal Cultural Heritage in NSW* (OEH 2011)
- *Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Consultation Requirements for Proponents* (DECCW 2010)
- *Code of Practice for Archaeological Investigation of Aboriginal Objects in New South Wales* (OEH 2010)

As part of the ACHAR, comprehensive consultation is being undertaken in accordance with Section 80C of the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 2009*. The initial stages of the consultation process have been completed, and a list of Registered Aboriginal Parties (RAPs) has been compiled. The present letter provides project information and the proposed assessment methodology for review.

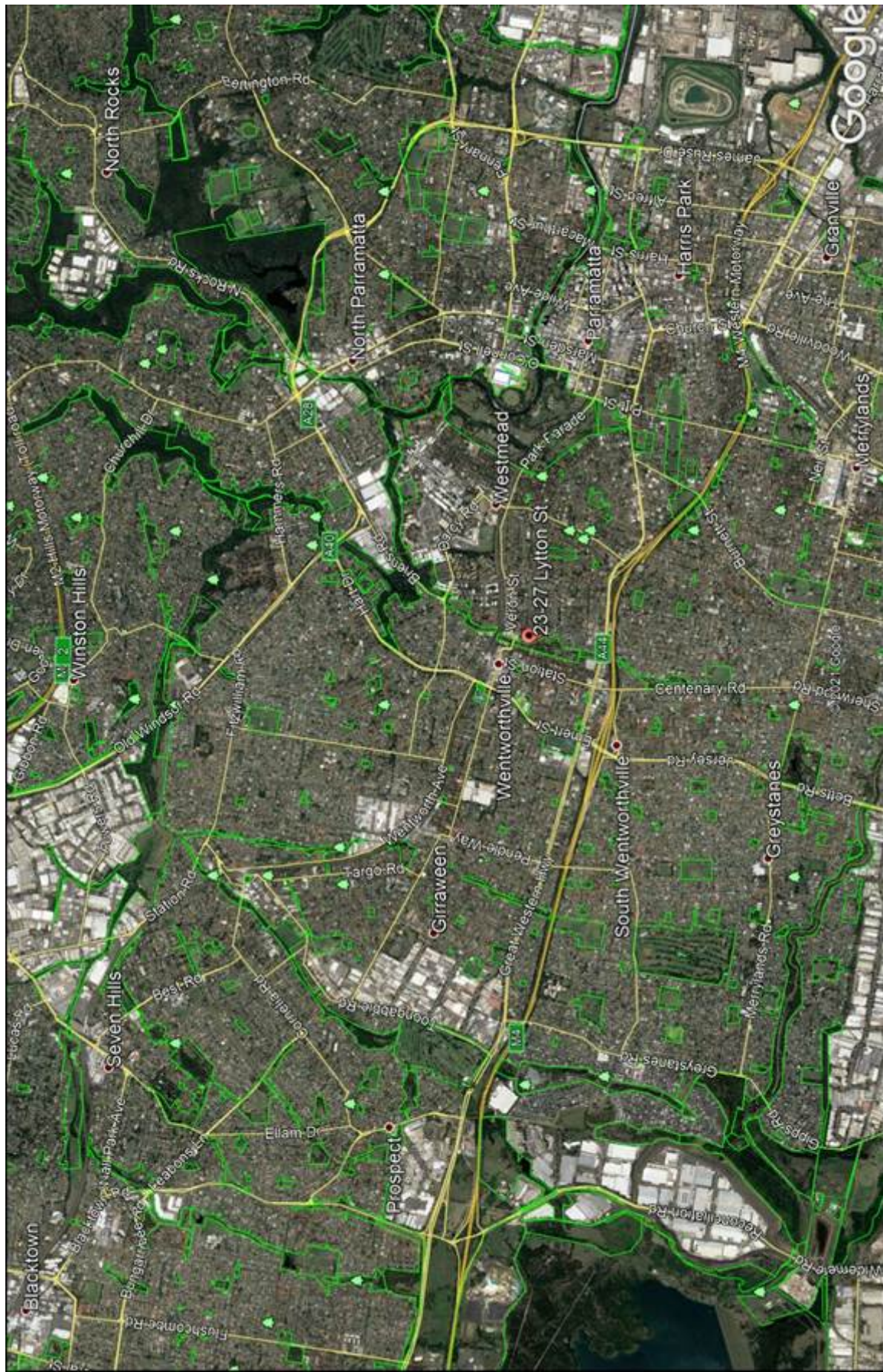

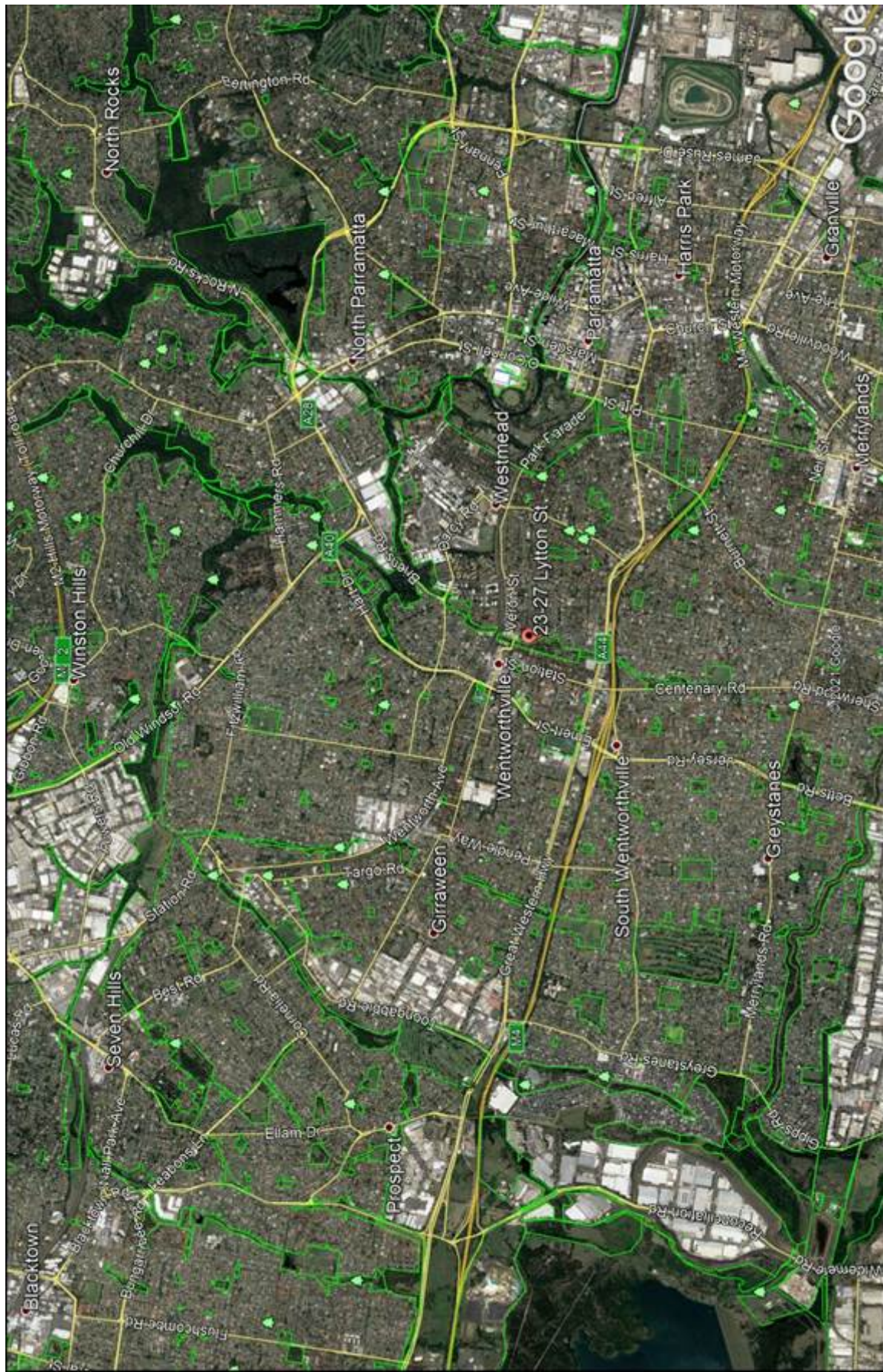

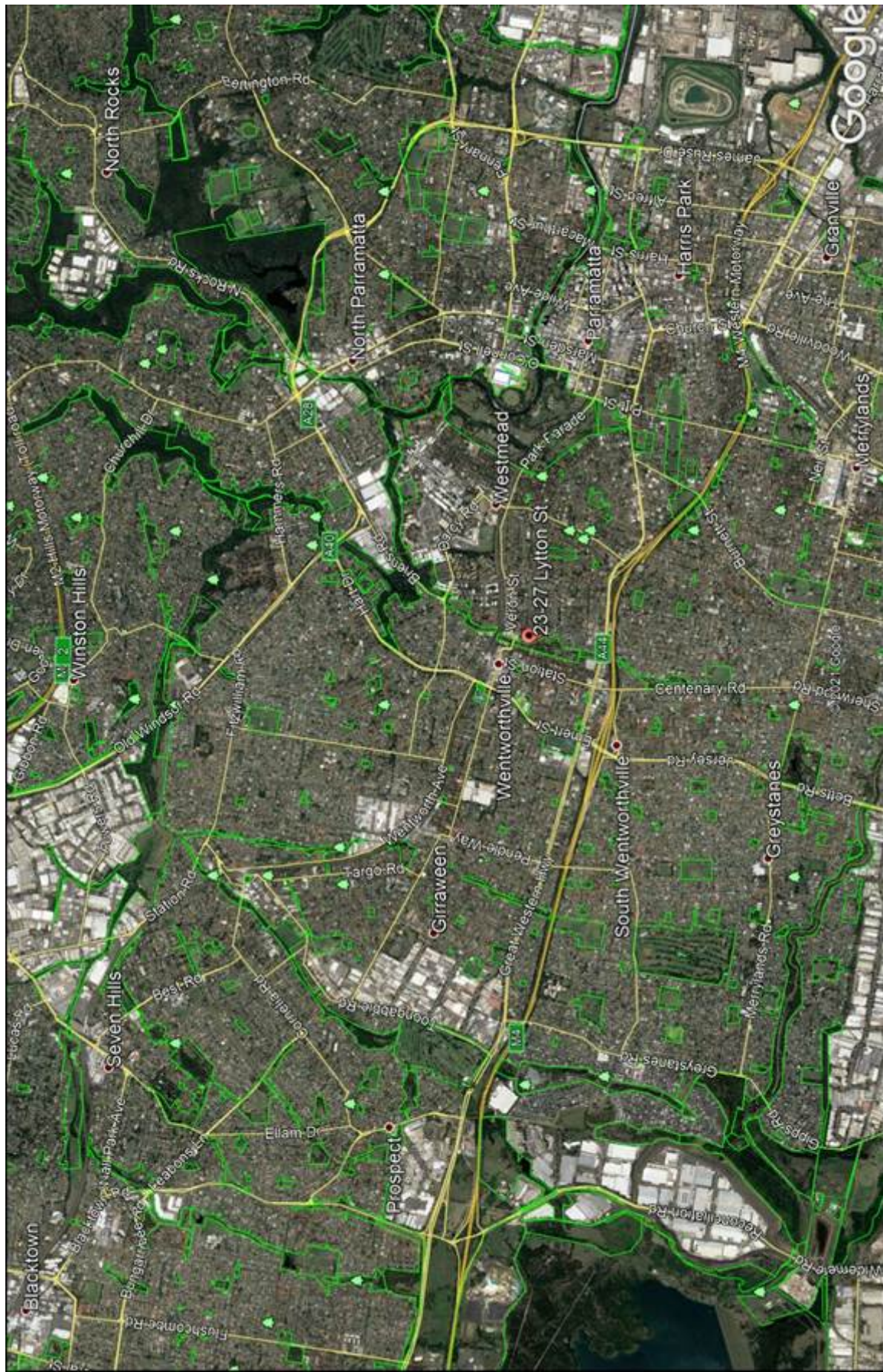

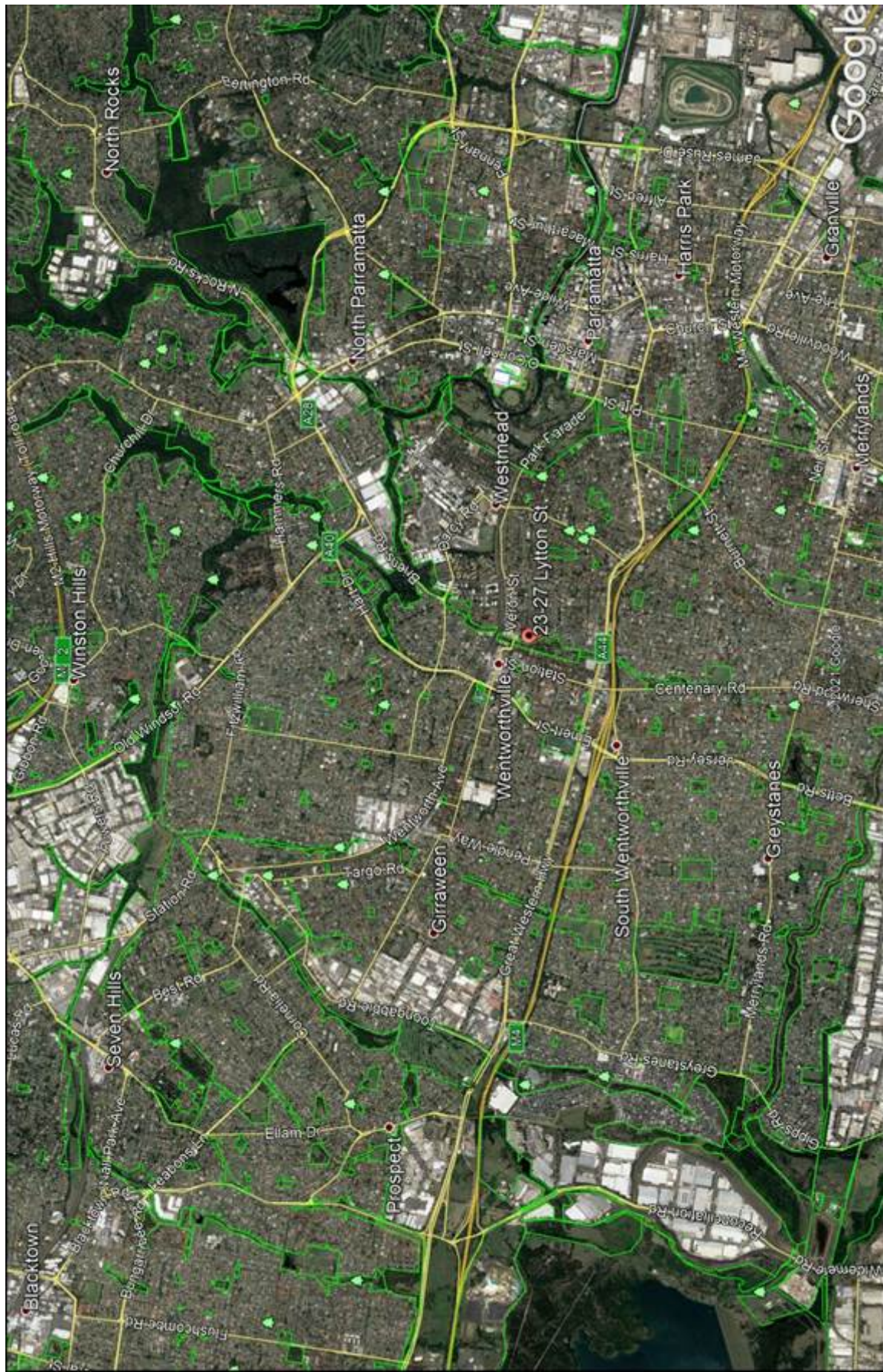

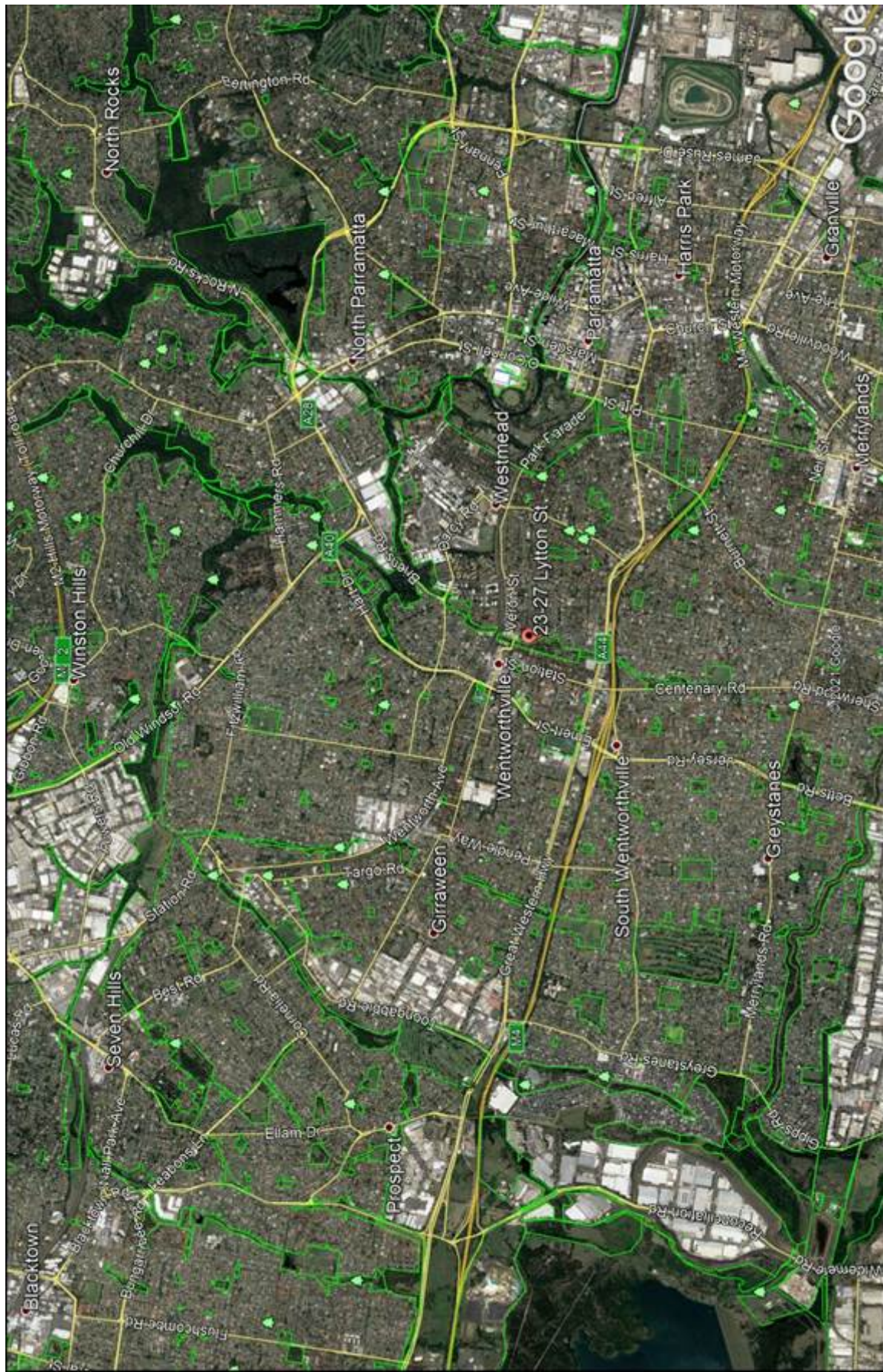

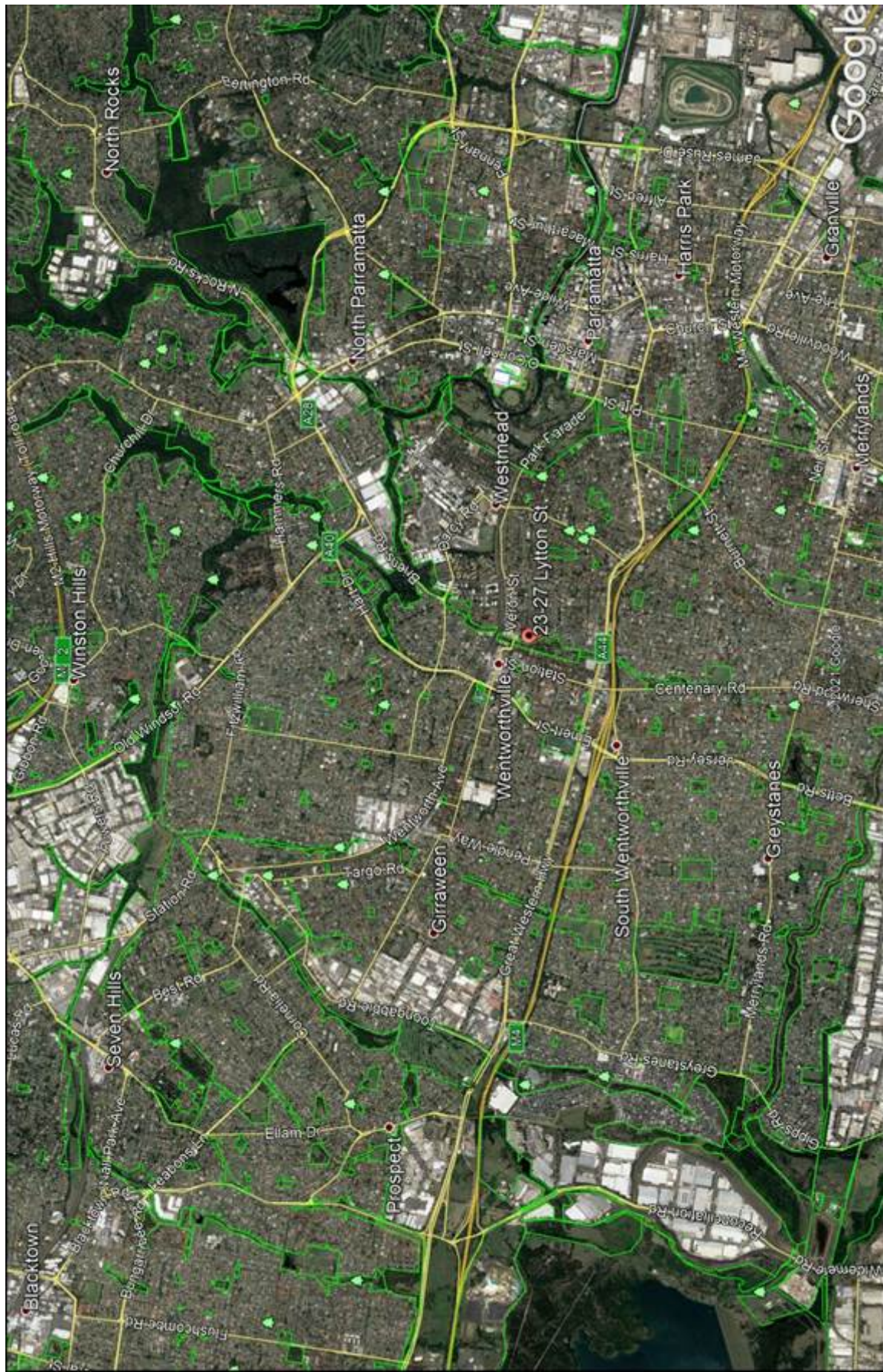

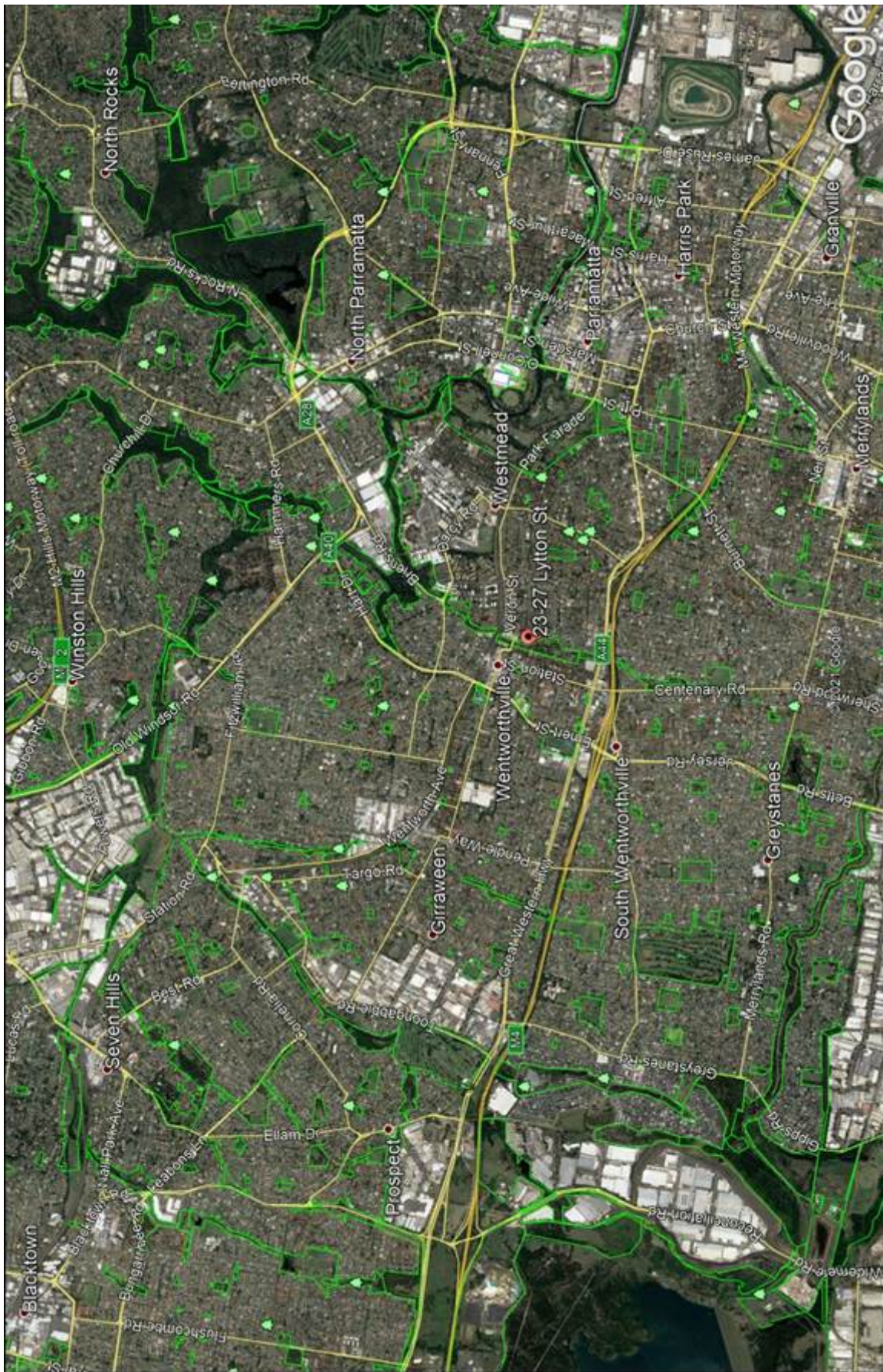

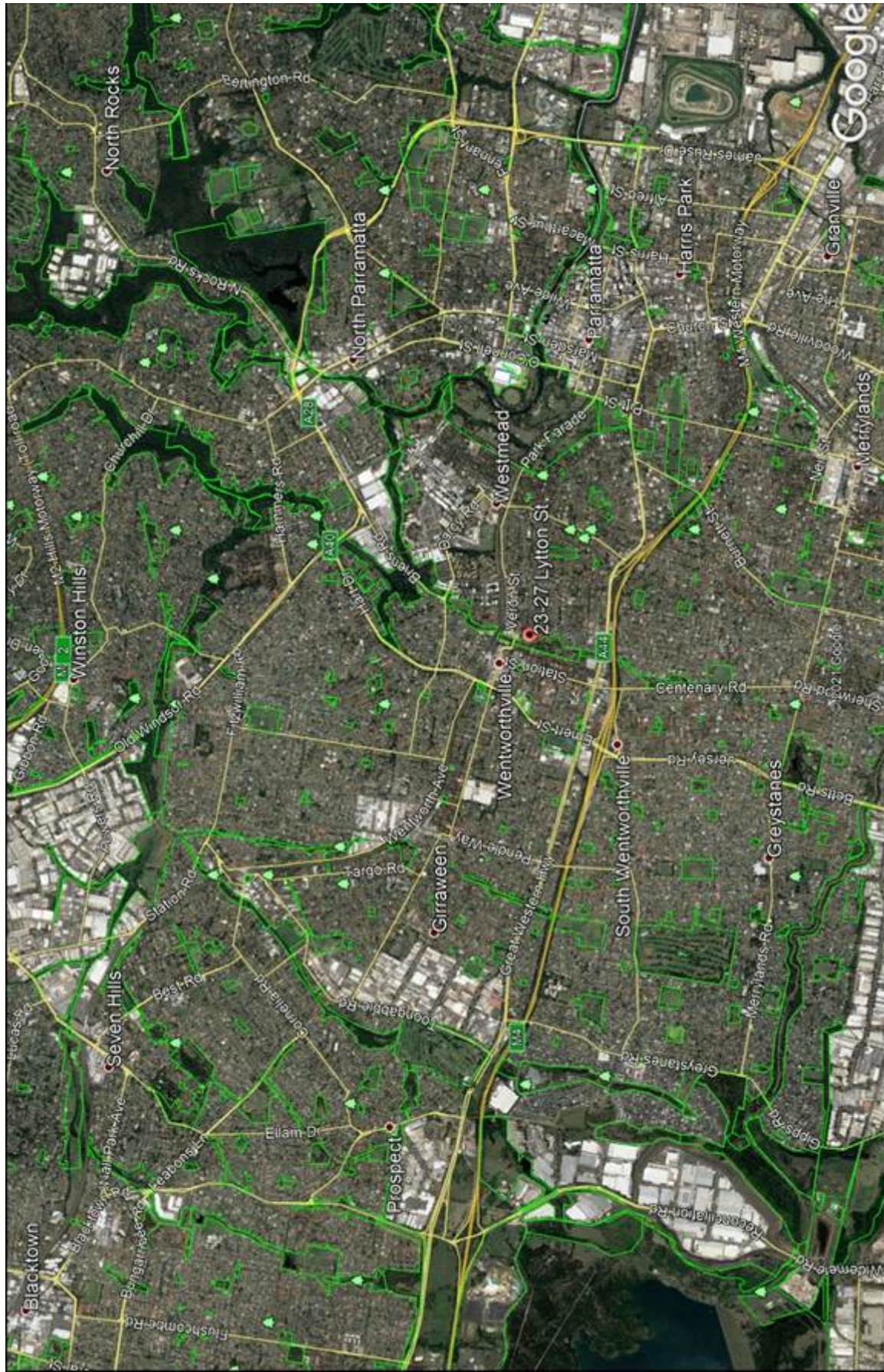

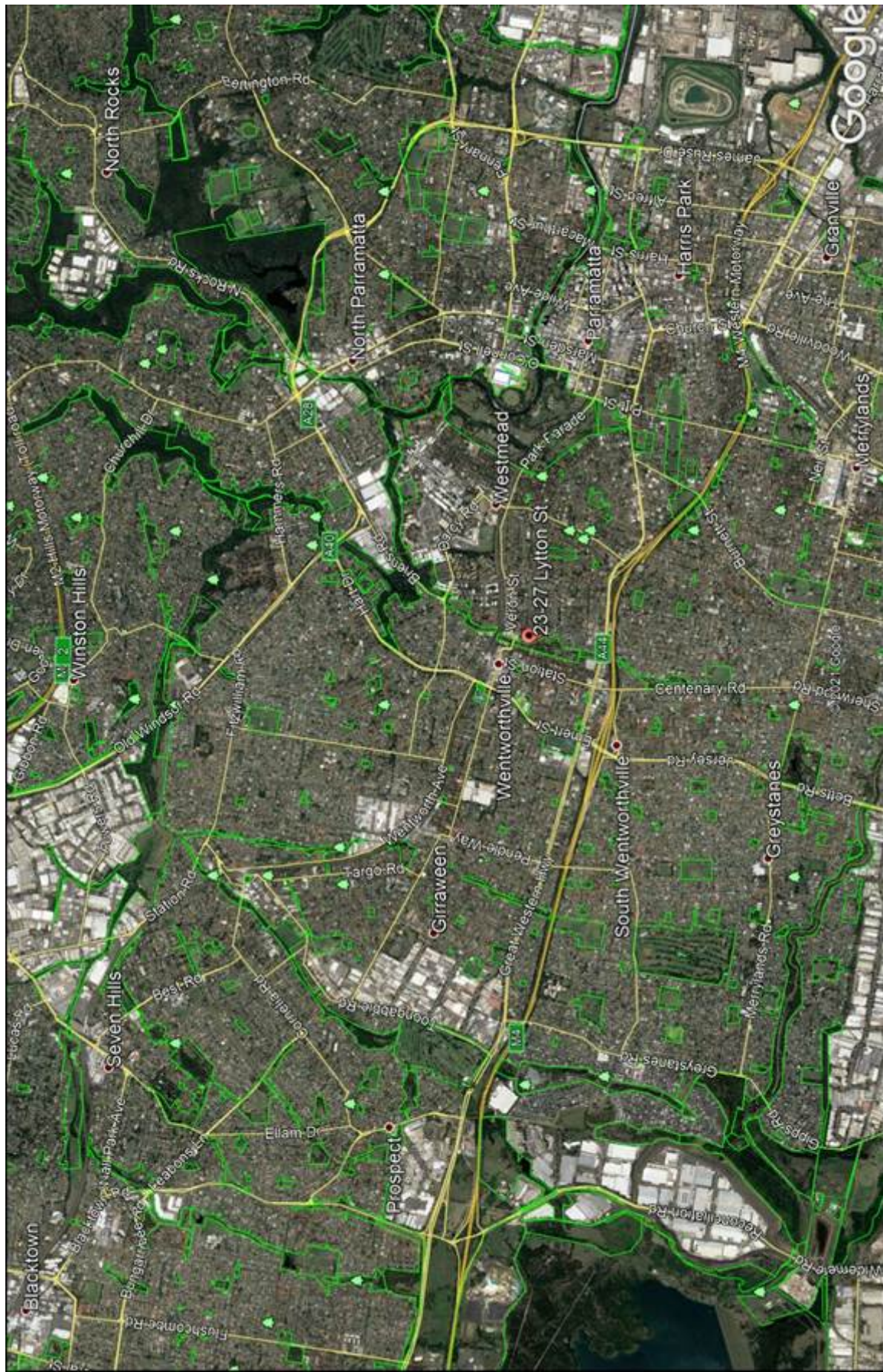

Our group is a non- profit organisation that has been active for over forty years in Western Sydney, we are a Darug community group with over three hundred members. The main aim in our constitution is the care of Darug sites, places, wildlife and to promote our culture and provide education on the Darug history.

Our group promotes Darug Culture and works on numerous projects that are culturally based as a proud and diverse group. It has been discussed by our group and with many consultants and researches that our history is generic and is usually from an early colonists perspective or solely based on archaeology and sites. These histories are adequate but they lack the people's stories and parts of important events and connections of the Darug people and also other Aboriginal people that now call this area home and have done so for numerous generations.

This area is significant to the Darug people due to the evidence of continued occupation, within close proximity to this project site there is a complex of significant sites.

Landscapes and landforms are significant to us for the information that they hold and the connection to Darug people. Aboriginal people (Darug) had a complex lifestyle that was based on respect and belonging to the land, all aspects of life and survival did not impact on

the land but helped to care for and conserve land and the sustenance that the land provided. As Darug people moved through the land there were no impacts left, although there was evidence of movement and lifestyle, the people moved through areas with knowledge of their areas

and followed signs that were left in the landscape. Darug people knew which areas were not to be entered and respected the areas that were sacred.

Knowledge of culture, lifestyle and lore have been part of Darug people's lives for thousands of years, this was passed down to the next generations and this started with birth and continued for a lifetime. Darug people spent a lifetime learning and as people grew older they passed through stages of knowledge, elders became elders with the learning of stages of knowledge not by their age, being an elder is part of the kinship system this was a very complicated system based on respect.

Darug sites are all connected, our country has a complex of sites that hold our heritage and past history, evidence of the Darug lifestyle and occupation are all across our country, due to the rapid development of Sydney many of our sites have been destroyed, our sites are thousands of years old and within the short period of time that Australia has been developed pre contact our sites have disappeared.

The Aboriginal cultural heritage consultation requirements for proponents Section 4.1.8 refers to "Aboriginal organisations representing Aboriginal people who hold cultural knowledge". Recent consultation meetings have revealed that many of these Aboriginal organisations and individuals do not hold cultural knowledge of the Western Sydney area. The increasing involvement of such parties in cultural heritage management means that genuine local Aboriginal organisations are unable to properly care for our cultural heritage.

Many Aboriginal organisations listed in the OEH response letter do not contribute to the Aboriginal community of Western Sydney. Individuals listed in the OEH response letter do not represent the community and while they may be consulted with, should not be employed for their own personal financial benefit.

Our organisation is committed to providing benefits back to our local Aboriginal community through such measures as funding the local Aboriginal juniors' touch football team, painting classes for the local children and donating money to various charities. Employment in cultural heritage activities is source of income that organisations such as ours can use to contribute to beneficial activities and support within the community.

Darug custodian Aboriginal Corporation's site officers have knowledge of Darug land, Darug Culture, Oral histories, landforms, sites, Darug history, wildlife, flora and legislative requirements. We have worked with consultants and developers for many years in Western

Sydney (Darug Land) for conservation, site works, developments and interpretation/education strategie.

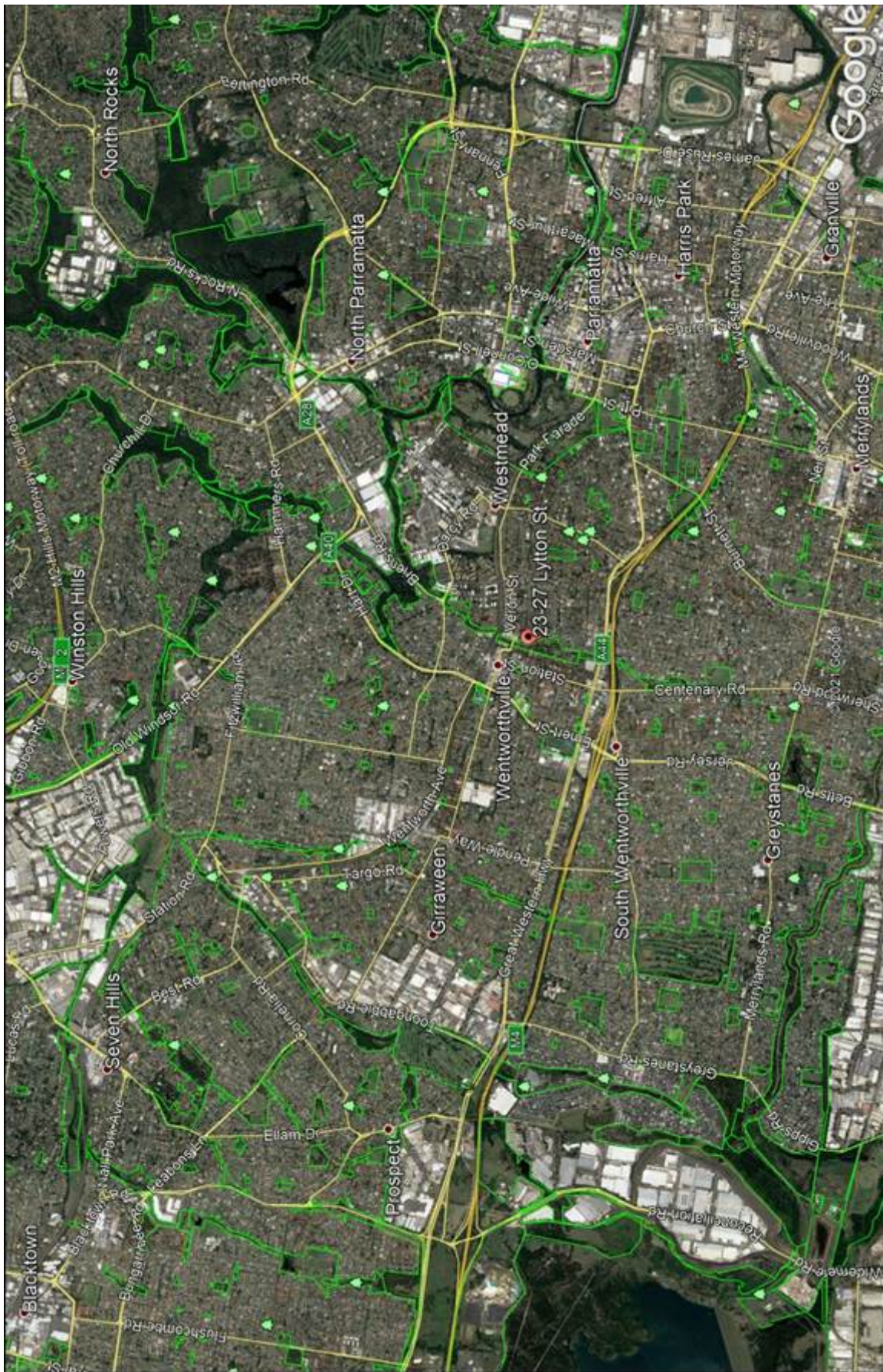

In summary, Ramsay Health Care propose to construct a new building to house wards and consulting rooms on its existing facility at Northside West Clinic, Wentworthville. The clinic is located at 23-27 Lytton Street Wentworthville, 2145 (Lot 1, DP 787784 see figure 1)

The clinic fronts onto Lytton Street. Access to the Finlayson Creek Parklands lies to the south side of the clinic and the parkland extends the length of the site at the rear. Residential housing is located on the northern boundary.

The project will be submitted by Erilyan, on behalf of the Ramsay Health Care, for assessment as a State Significant Development under part 4.1 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979. While the SEARs (Secretaries Environmental Assessment Requirements) have not been issued, standard SEARs for Aboriginal heritage require (Department of Planning, Industry and Environment in December 2020) that an Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment Report (ACHAR) be prepared in accordance with the *Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Consultation Requirements for Proponents* (DECCW 2010) for inclusion in the EIS.

1.1 Background

A due diligence assessment was completed for the study area on 16 May 2021. The aim of the Due Diligence assessment was to assist Erilyan to exercise due diligence when carrying out activities that may harm Aboriginal objects and to determine whether they should apply for consent in the form of an Aboriginal Heritage Impact Permit (AHIP) or State Significant Development (SSD) approval.

The Due Diligence assessment found that there were no recorded Aboriginal sites within 1km of the study area (see Figure 1). Further, no previously unrecorded Aboriginal sites or objects were identified within the study area during the site inspection. After physical examination of the study area and examination of historical aerial photography of the study area, the site was assessed as having nil to low potential to retain intact archaeological deposits because the site had been disturbed by previous construction activity.
