Ausgrid notes that the proponent has not attempted to address the utility requirements in the EIS and does not appear to have made any enquiries regarding the capacity of utilities to supply the site.

Infrastructure and utilities The EIS must consider and address:

- the existing capacity of the site to service the proposed development
- required utility augmentation to accommodate the proposed development
- any requirements of the Infrastructure SEPP in relation to development on or adjacent to utilities and infrastructure.
