The Darug Custodian Aboriginal Corporation have received and reviewed the Tinda Creek survey methodology.

This area is highly significant to the Darug people due to the evidence of continued occupation, within close proximity to this project site there is a complex of highly significant sites. Sites are significant to us for the information that they hold and the connection to Darug people. Aboriginal people (Darug) had a complex lifestyle that was based on respect and belonging to the land, all aspects of life and survival did not impact on the land but helped to care for and conserve land and the sustenance that the land provided. As Darug people moved through the land there were no impacts left, although there was evidence of movement and lifestyle, the people moved through areas with knowledge of their areas and followed signs that were left in the landscape. Darug people knew which areas were not to be entered and respected the areas that were sacred.

Yengo - Wollemi National parks are of extremely high significance due to the sites and dreaming that this area holds, our group has spent time in these areas documenting sites and stories and the significance is all over this area.


Darug custodian Aboriginal Corporation's site officers have knowledge of Darug land, Darug Culture, Oral histories, landforms, sites, Darug history, wildlife, flora and legislative requirements. We have worked with consultants and developers for many years in Western Sydney (Darug Land) for conservation, site works, developments and interpretation/education strategies. We are concerned with the amount of stakeholders listed

on this project and many other projects that we are involved in cultural heritage is not for personal profit, but to provide knowledge to Darug people on the scientific evidence of culture and also for communities to protect sites of significance. Community groups representing Darug people should be the determinates of cultural heritage and the carers of these sites.

Re: Tinda Creek Quarry Expansion – Invitation to registered Aboriginal stakeholder groups for involvement in additional Aboriginal Archaeological Survey and Assessment

Hy-Tec Concrete & Aggregates (Hy-Tec) is currently seeking approval to increase production levels from Tinda Creek Sand Quarry from approximately 125,000 tonnes per annum (tpa) up to 300,000 tpa by increasing the area subject to sand extraction to include additional identified resource domains. The quarry is located on Putty Road, approximately 23 kilometres north of Colo Heights, NSW within Lot 2 DP 628806, though the proposed expansion would include extraction on the adjacent Lots 1 and 3 in DP 628806. Lot 1 (86 hectares), Lot 2 (86.67 hectares) and Lot 3 (86 hectares) are referred to collectively as the 'study area'. The total size of the proposed study area is 258.67 hectares bounded on the north, east and south by Yengo National Park and on the west by Putty Road, several agricultural land holdings and Wollemi National Park.

As a registered Aboriginal stakeholder group for the Tinda Creek Sand Quarry, and in keeping with the Part 6 of the NPW Act 1974 (Aboriginal cultural heritage consultation requirements for proponents 2010), Hy-Tec would like to invite your group to provide a representative for involvement in a survey of four additional resource domains not surveyed previously in 2010. Umwelt (Australia) Pty Limited (Umwelt) has been engaged by Hy-Tec Concrete & Aggregates to undertake the necessary impact assessments and assist in attaining approval for the proposal.

A number of resource domains have been identified on the site (see attached figure), five of which form the subject of the application. Four of these domains will be investigated as part of the Archaeological field assessment (the fifth having been assessed previously).

The following resource domains comprising the proposed extraction area of 58.48 hectares are the subject of this field survey:

- Domain 1 – approximately 17.47 hectare area comprising an indicated product-sand resource of 2.1 Mt;
- Domain 2 - approximately 5.8 hectare area comprising an indicated product-sand resource of 1.1 Mt;
- Domain 3 - approximately 17.49 hectare area comprising an indicated product-sand resource of 2.3 Mt; and

- Domain 4 - approximately 5.06 hectare area comprising an indicated product-sand resource of 0.7 Mt.

The aim of the field survey will be to inspect the four Domain Areas above in accordance with the provided survey methodology (see **Attachments 1 & 2**). It is therefore critical that your representative on the day can both speak on behalf of your organisation in relation to the cultural values of the area and the assessment approach, and is experienced in archaeological survey and artefact identification. If you would like to provide comment on the survey methodology please return **Attachment 2** with the other Attachments (see below).

As the site visit is expected to require a full day, Hy-Tec proposes to pay \$600 ex GST per organisation for attendance, plus \$150 ex GST per organisation for travelling expenses. Should fieldwork be cancelled due to bad weather, your organisation will be notified in advance of the site visit; however, any hours worked by your representative prior to cancellation will be paid at the above hourly rate.



Attachment A –

Proposed Survey Strategy

The proposed extraction domains are the only areas proposed for new impacts. As the proposed impact area is only 45 hectares it is proposed that total (100 percent) pedestrian survey is undertaken of the proposed impact area (survey area). The objective for undertaking total survey on foot is to ensure that participants have the opportunity to inspect all areas proposed for impact and to assess the likelihood that the project has to impact on Aboriginal cultural heritage sites and values.

As shown on Figure 1, the survey area is predominantly composed of low gradient slopes bordering a swamp which is the main topographic feature of the proposed impact area and the low gradient slopes surrounding the existing Tinda Creek Quarry. Most of this area has been substantially cleared and impacted by historic land-use practices however Domain three is located in less disturbed woodland. Sandstone bedrock in this area is reported to be highly weathered and in a state of decomposition.

The project area is within a small parcel of privately owned land bounded to the north, east and south by Yengo National Park (NP) and to the west by the Wollemi NP (both NPs form part of the extensive Greater Blue Mountains World Heritage Area). The topography of the project area, as well as previous regional models for Aboriginal landscape use within the area suggest that the spur and ridge crests would have provided access to, and an easier means of moving through this steeply dissected landscape and to travel from the resource rich swamp country in the valleys to the steeper country the east and west. This is particularly relevant given the Aboriginal cultural importance of Mount Yengo (a declared Aboriginal Place) and other known art (painting and engraving sites), ceremonial sites and grinding groove sites within the adjacent NPs. These sites/places have been recorded as being highly significant to Aboriginal Peoples.

Unusually there is a paucity of artefact scatters (open camp sites) and isolated finds identified within the adjacent Yengo-Wollemi NPs as these are generally one of the more common site types found in NSW. However it is likely that existing information regarding site distribution within the NPs has been biased by the nature and focus of prior investigations which have targeted areas most likely to contain sandstone exposures suitable for engravings and grinding grooves and clifflines likely to have rockshelters with art (painting and engraving). Thus the registered sites in the broader landscape surrounding the project area are dominated by these, usually rarer, site types.

The generally undeveloped nature of the NPs and the known importance of the broader area for ceremonial gatherings indicate that sites such as camp sites (artefact scatters) scarred trees, carved trees, ceremonial sites, stone arrangements and burials may also exist in the broader area. Of these, carved trees, ceremonial sites, stone arrangements and burials are relatively uncommon within the archaeological record generally due to issues of preservation.

Based on the environmental context of the proposed project impact area it is considered that Aboriginal people may have utilised the area periodically for the purposes of hunting and gathering whilst moving through the landscape. Thus, artefact scatters and isolated finds are the most likely site type to occur in this area and are most likely to be located in association with the watercourses and swamp. It is considered that any artefact scatters are likely to be relatively limited in extent when compared with artefact scatters that maybe located in association with more permanent watercourses and the larger swamplands a few kilometres to the north. Grinding groove sites if they occurred in the vicinity would most likely have been associated with the creeklines, however they are unlikely to have survived due to the highly weathered nature of the sandstone bedrock. Scarred trees are unlikely due to the high levels of prior vegetation clearance in the project area. Other site types such as art sites and rockshelters will not be present due to the lack of suitable geology and carved, trees, stone arrangements and burials if ever present are unlikely to have survived disturbance caused from land clearance and other historic use of the area.

Based on the predictive model and on the limited size of the proposed impact area, survey will encompass the whole area proposed for impact with a special focus on the banks of the creek lines, swamp, and vehicle tracks

as these are the most likely areas to have exposures that may have visible artefacts. All sandstone outcrops will be inspected for grinding grooves and engravings and all remnant mature trees will be inspected for scars/carving. No impacts are proposed for any steep terrain or high country.

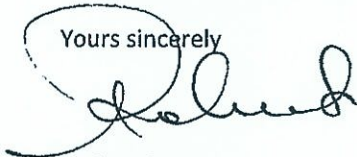

Proposed Survey Strategy

The proposed extraction domains are the only areas proposed for new impacts. As the proposed impact area is only 45 hectares it is proposed that total (100 percent) pedestrian survey is undertaken of the proposed impact area (survey area). The objective for undertaking total survey on foot is to ensure that participants have the opportunity to inspect all areas proposed for impact and to assess the likelihood that the project has to impact on Aboriginal cultural heritage sites and values.

As shown on Figure 1, the survey area is predominantly composed of low gradient slopes bordering a swamp which is the main topographic feature of the proposed impact area and the low gradient slopes surrounding the existing Tinda Creek Quarry. Most of this area has been substantially cleared and impacted by historic land-use practices however Domain three is located in less disturbed woodland. Sandstone bedrock in this area is reported to be highly weathered and in a state of decomposition.

The project area is within a small parcel of privately owned land bounded to the north, east and south by Yengo National Park (NP) and to the west by the Wollemi NP (both NPs form part of the extensive Greater Blue Mountains World Heritage Area). The topography of the project area, as well as previous regional models for Aboriginal landscape use within the area suggest that the spur and ridge crests would have provided access to, and an easier means of moving through this steeply dissected landscape and to travel from the resource rich swamp country in the valleys to the steeper country the east and west. This is particularly relevant given the Aboriginal cultural importance of Mount Yengo (a declared Aboriginal Place) and other known art (painting and engraving sites), ceremonial sites and grinding groove sites within the adjacent NPs. These sites/places have been recorded as being highly significant to Aboriginal Peoples.

Unusually there is a paucity of artefact scatters (open camp sites) and isolated finds identified within the adjacent Yengo-Wollemi NPs as these are generally one of the more common site types found in NSW. However it is likely that existing information regarding site distribution within the NPs has been biased by the nature and focus of prior investigations which have targeted areas most likely to contain sandstone exposures suitable for engravings and grinding grooves and clifflines likely to have rockshelters with art (painting and engraving). Thus the registered sites in the broader landscape surrounding the project area are dominated by these, usually rarer, site types.

The generally undeveloped nature of the NPs and the known importance of the broader area for ceremonial gatherings indicate that sites such as camp sites (artefact scatters) scarred trees, carved trees, ceremonial sites, stone arrangements and burials may also exist in the broader area. Of these, carved trees, ceremonial sites, stone arrangements and burials are relatively uncommon within the archaeological record generally due to issues of preservation.

Based on the environmental context of the proposed project impact area it is considered that Aboriginal people may have utilised the area periodically for the purposes of hunting and gathering whilst moving through the landscape. Thus, artefact scatters and isolated finds are the most likely site type to occur in this area and are most likely to be located in association with the watercourses and swamp. It is considered that any artefact scatters are likely to be relatively limited in extent when compared with artefact scatters that maybe located in association with more permanent watercourses and the larger swamplands a few kilometres to the north. Grinding groove sites if they occurred in the vicinity would most likely have been associated with the creeklines, however they are unlikely to have survived due to the highly weathered nature of the sandstone bedrock. Scarred trees are unlikely due to the high levels of prior vegetation clearance in the project area. Other site types such as art sites and rockshelters will not be present due to the lack of suitable geology and carved, trees, stone arrangements and burials if ever present are unlikely to have survived disturbance caused from land clearance and other historic use of the area.

Based on the predictive model and on the limited size of the proposed impact area, survey will encompass the whole area proposed for impact with a special focus on the banks of the creek lines, swamp, and vehicle tracks

as these are the most likely areas to have exposures that may have visible artefacts. All sandstone outcrops will be inspected for grinding grooves and engravings and all remnant mature trees will be inspected for scars/carving. No impacts are proposed for any steep terrain or high country.
