Hard copies of the EIS are also on display at Stockton and Newcastle Library.

Submissions

Possible themes of objection

UNACCEPTABLE RISK. Nowhere in the industrial world will you find two plants, producing industrial explosives, side-by-side and less than 1 kilometre from residents. ✓

NOISE. 24 hour noise levels from Kooragang are already impacting many residents. ✓

POLLUTION. IPL's plant will add to increasing levels of dust, emissions and Nitrogen Oxides (NOx gas). ✓

HOUSE PRICES. Increasing the risk profile will potential impact house prices and less new families will be attracted to suburbs close to the proposal. Incitec's EIS **does not** address this issue. ✓

POLLUTING THE HUNTER RIVER. The Hunter estuary is an internationally recognised protected wetland that is home to many important migratory bird species and used by many local fishermen. ✓

INADEQUATE COMMUNITY CONSULTATION. Many residents from Stockton, Carrington, Tighes Hill and Mayfield have been left in the dark on this project. ✓
