1	AM gave a brief overview of the existing and proposed stormwater drainage systems for Campbelltown Hospital particularly noting the connection points to Council's drainage systems.	-	-
2	KR described the engineering works for the hospital redevelopment that are being completed under an REF Approval and those works that are proposed as part of a Development Application (DA). It was noted that the REF works together with the DA both analysis comprise civil engineering and services infrastructure that augment the existing infrastructure works within the Hospital. These works collectively will inform the catchment modelling requirements of the DGR.	-	-
3	KL & GW noted that generally Council has no major issues with the proposed drainage but noted that they would like the capacity of the existing drainage in Parkside Crescent to be verified. It was agreed that this was the intent of the DGR relating to Catchment Modelling. It was agreed that C&M would complete the required analysis and provide a suitable report for submission to Council for review as part of the ongoing consultation process with Council.	C&M	20/2/12
4	KL & GW confirmed that to their knowledge there was no existing flooding or drainage problems in the vicinity of the Campbelltown Hospital site.	Noted	-

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5	It was noted that the proposed stormwater drainage for the hospital included stormwater quality improvement systems and devices. KL indicated that Council has a stormwater quality pollution reduction target policy in their DCP. It was agreed that C&M would verify compliance with Council DCP or otherwise.	C&M	20/2/12
