Dear Mr Collette,

On 12 February 2026, you met with Mr Anthony Lean, Secretary of the Department of Climate Change, Energy the Environment and Water, regarding the NSW Government's position on mine water management and associated environmental responsibilities.

As conveyed by Mr Lean, the NSW Government expects Centennial Coal and EnergyAustralia to resolve the Springvale mine issues, ensuring full compliance with all licences, environmental regulations, and planning consents. Environmental protection is non-negotiable, and the integrity of water catchments must be maintained.

Your organisations have the expertise, resources, and responsibility to develop and implement effective industry-led solutions.

As regulators and assessment agencies, we will support you through our statutory roles by prioritising application assessments and monitoring compliance. We will uphold standards that protect environmental and community outcomes, and expect timely, accurate information in line with your licence and consent obligations.

We look forward to working together to ensure compliance and positive environmental outcomes.
