We have a letter dated 15 January 2014, regarding the information packet that you sent out. We responded to the expression of interest as per the community consultation guidelines within the required 14-day time frame. We are now trying to ascertain how a native titleholder group can be excluded from such a project, which lies within our traditional boundaries. Our understanding of the guidelines that encumber myself as a traditional knowledge holder, your firm and industry, the PCWP is granted the unwavering ability to make culturally relevant decisions on country, above all other consultants, stakeholders & RAPS. The extent of the native title boundary that is registered and lodged on the NNTT website was going to be included but we didn't expect to have to do OEH's job. When the consultation process began, you send an enquiry to OEH to determine if there are any registered claim/s. It doesn't matter whether or not the process began before the claim was registered the new guidelines are still accepted as the consultation process was still open. There seems to have been some mis-guidance, negligence or just plain ignorance during the process. It quite clearly outlines in our expression of interest the correct legislation that now MUST be followed by all of us involved in future projects. Surely we don't need to provide a definition for legislation.

Thank you for providing MCH with a written outline of your concerns regarding the consultation process for the above named project. As discussed on the phone on 13<sup>th</sup> February 2015, MCH have not excluded Tocomwall from the Dolwendee. Below outlines the consultation and proof that Tocomwall have not been excluded, but rather MCH have attempted to include Tocomwall on a number of occasions and it has been Tocomwall's choice not to respond or participate in a positive consultation process.

- 9/12/14: Tocomwall sent MCH notification of registration in the project. Tocomwall had received notification from NTSCORP and registered before MCH wrote to all groups listed by the various Government departments.
- 10/1/15 MCH sent all registered Aboriginal stakeholders an information packet outlining the project and asking for CVs, rates of pay etc.
- Tocomwall did not respond or provide any information.
- 7/2/15 MCH sent letters of invitation to the survey to all registered Aboriginal stakeholders, including Tocomwall.
- 13/2/15 Tocomwall calls MCH and accuses MCH of excluding Tocomwall from the project and threatens legal action. MCH states that Tocomwall were included and were in fact invited to the survey.
- 16/2/15 Tocomwall write to MCH again claiming exclusion from the project.

MCH and the proponent have followed the Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Consultation Requirements for Proponents (2010).

Hi Penny,

Danny has forwarded me your letter from today.

The work package that you sent is a document that is in opposition to the OEH guidelines (and I have not seen it but if it is the same document that you have sent in the past for other jobs you would recall we refuse to complete a document that is discriminative. It allows people to assert positions without supplying any proof and Tocomwall has complained about this document several times before. MCH clearly has no understanding nor does OEH if it totally ignores the following;

*Speaking for Country under the NPW Act regulations for development*

*Who speaks for Country when it comes to heritage? The NPW Act regulations require that Aboriginal people are consulted wherever an Aboriginal Heritage Impact Permit (AHIP) is required. Consultation with Aboriginal people is also encouraged when a person or company proposing to undertake development is unsure whether it may harm Aboriginal heritage.*

*The OEH publication Aboriginal cultural heritage consultation requirements for proponents 2010 (www.environment.nsw.gov.au/resources/cultureheritage/commconsultation/09781ACHconsultreq.pdf) provides guidance on how Aboriginal consultation is to be undertaken during the development process, under the NPW Act regulations. The requirements specify that the right people to consult with are primarily 'the traditional owners or custodians of the land that is the subject of the proposed project'. The requirements also acknowledge that Aboriginal people with historic ties to the area, but whose traditional Country is elsewhere, may have important knowledge about historic heritage places and that they should be involved in consultation for other reasons.*

*In the first instance 'traditional owners or custodians' are to be identified as native title holders, registered native title claimants, and Aboriginal Owners registered under the Aboriginal Land Rights Act 1983. Where native title has been determined to exist for an area, only the native title holders or the relevant prescribed body corporate need to be consulted under the NPW Regulations. Otherwise, as well as contacting native title claimants and Aboriginal Owners, the person or company is also required to seek input more broadly from a range of organisations, including the regional office of the OEH, the Local Aboriginal Land Council, Catchment Management Authorities, Native Title Services, and also to place a notice in the local newspaper.*

- Kindly provide evidence that Tocomwall was sent and also received the information package for this project such as proof of collection of registered mail.
- Regardless of when the claim was lodged, until registration why is it the case that MCH chooses to ignore it's significance and importance and in turn reference to it to the clients of MCH. Several other firms in the claim area have made it a point of notification to their clients that the claim was lodged and was being considered for registration.
- It is clear to Tocomwall and the PCWP that both MCH and OEH (based on emails from MCH) has a clear view that is contrary to the above, their own guidelines and regulations. The problem that this presents is the proponent and the the owner may find themselves brought before the Land and environmental court, and/or possibly the Federal court of Australia with regard to interlocutory proceedings.
- MCH state that Tocomwall threatened legal action. This was not a threat but a conclusion to both MCH and OEH failing to advise properly with regard to their interpretation of the current consultation guidelines.
- As there is now differing positions on this project and so Tocomwall on behalf of the PCWP demand mediation under the said guidelines and until this occurs we request that all activity is stopped to ensure our position is dealt with via mediation.

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



I'm trying to contact either you (I left a message on your mobile) and Adam (I've been told that he's off sick today when I contacted the KMH office this morning) with regards to the borehole data.

As I've mentioned to Adam via email (I have not been successful in speaking with him directly despite several phone calls last week), I do not need the hard-rock geology data, just the unconsolidated sediment/soil data, i.e there is no conflict of

interest in relation to any commercially sensitive information. The commercially sensitive data would only relate to the hard rock geology – sandstone and conglomerate.

Can you please let me know by 1pm today what the scenario is in regards to the geotechnical data? I am at a loss to explain why this data has not been provided and more importantly, how anyone can make an assessment in regards to subsurface conditions across the project area in the absence of any review of boreholes!?!

Hi Adam,

Thanks for getting back to me. As I explained on Monday, I'm not interested in the hard rock geology, only the unconsolidated Quaternary deposits overlying the bedrock. As the quarry is for the extraction of sandstone and conglomerate, this should not be a problem. For example, you can email a copy of the upper part of the stratigraphic sequence detailing the unconsolidated Pleistocene and Holocene deposits, removing or blanking out subsequent details of hard rock geology below. Or alternatively, we can arrange a confidential agreement or, I could come to your office and review the borehole data there?

Archaeology is, in essence, a stratigraphic exercise and the MCH report does not provide any detail on subsurface conditions. For example, potential depths of soils, buried soils and/or palaeosols. Without this data, **no one** can make an assessment with regards to actual or potential archaeological deposits. In other words, the report does not adequately assess subsurface conditions.

The alternative is to commission a borehole study aimed at the upper (unconsolidated) sequence. Or, provide access to MCH and allow them to review and present the data.

I hope that clarifies things a bit.

Please get back to me as soon as possible in regards to this matter.

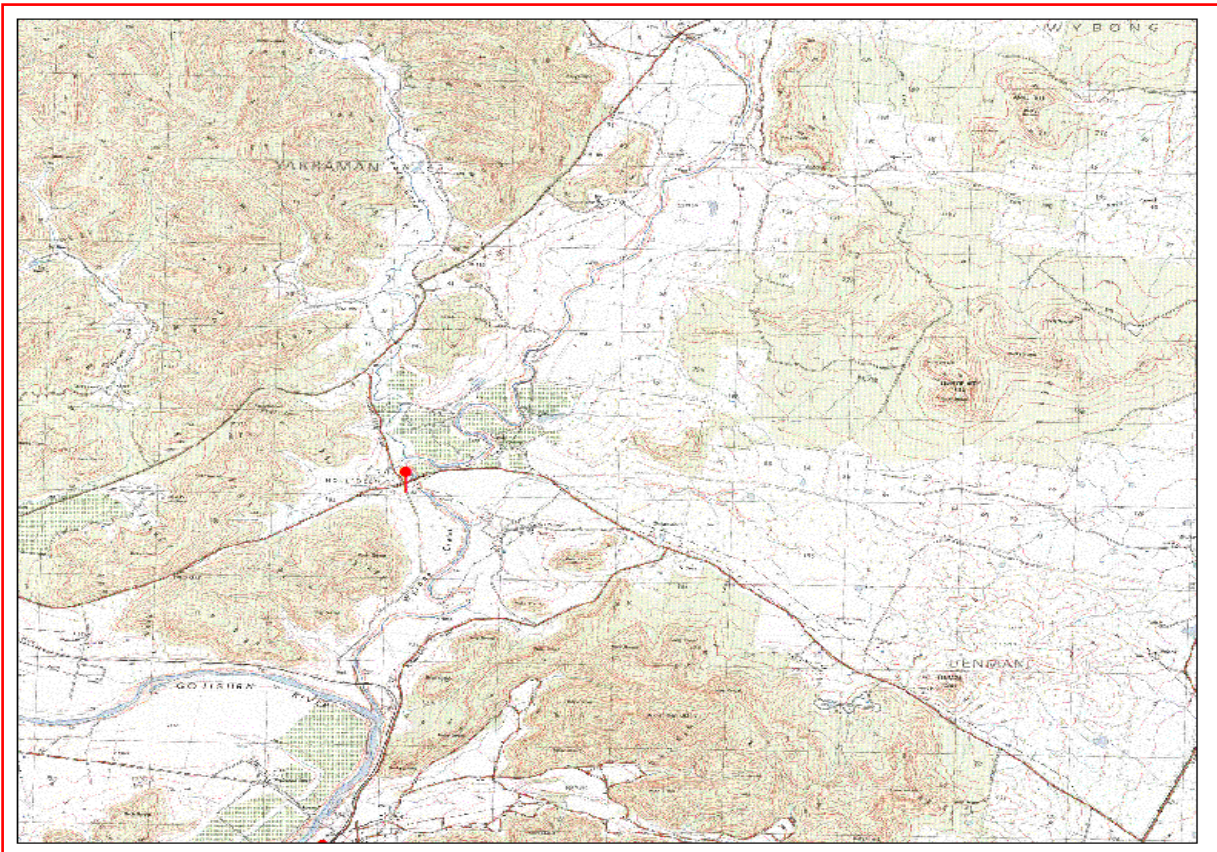
