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Information about this licence

Dictionary

A definition of terms used in the licence can be found in the dictionary at the end of this licence.

Responsibilities of licensee

Separate to the requirements of this licence, general obligations of licensees are set out in the Protection of the Environment Operations Act 1997 ("the Act") and the Regulations made under the Act. These include obligations to:

- ensure persons associated with you comply with this licence, as set out in section 64 of the Act;
- control the pollution of waters and the pollution of air (see for example sections 120 - 132 of the Act);
- report incidents causing or threatening material environmental harm to the environment, as set out in Part 5.7 of the Act.

Variation of licence conditions

The licence holder can apply to vary the conditions of this licence. An application form for this purpose is available from the EPA.

The EPA may also vary the conditions of the licence at any time by written notice without an application being made.

Where a licence has been granted in relation to development which was assessed under the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 in accordance with the procedures applying to integrated development, the EPA may not impose conditions which are inconsistent with the development consent conditions until the licence is first reviewed under Part 3.6 of the Act.

Duration of licence

This licence will remain in force until the licence is surrendered by the licence holder or until it is suspended or revoked by the EPA or the Minister. A licence may only be surrendered with the written approval of the EPA.

Licence review

The Act requires that the EPA review your licence at least every 5 years after the issue of the licence, as set out in Part 3.6 and Schedule 5 of the Act. You will receive advance notice of the licence review.

Fees and annual return to be sent to the EPA

For each licence fee period you must pay:

- an administrative fee; and
- a load-based fee (if applicable).



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The EPA publication “A Guide to Licensing” contains information about how to calculate your licence fees. The licence requires that an Annual Return, comprising a Statement of Compliance and a summary of any monitoring required by the licence (including the recording of complaints), be submitted to the EPA. The Annual Return must be submitted within 60 days after the end of each reporting period. See condition R1 regarding the Annual Return reporting requirements.

Usually the licence fee period is the same as the reporting period.

Transfer of licence

The licence holder can apply to transfer the licence to another person. An application form for this purpose is available from the EPA.

Public register and access to monitoring data

Part 9.5 of the Act requires the EPA to keep a public register of details and decisions of the EPA in relation to, for example:

- licence applications;
- licence conditions and variations;
- statements of compliance;
- load based licensing information; and
- load reduction agreements.

Under s320 of the Act application can be made to the EPA for access to monitoring data which has been submitted to the EPA by licensees.

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1 Administrative Conditions

A1 What the licence authorises and regulates

A1.1 This licence authorises the carrying out of the scheduled activities listed below at the premises specified in A2. The activities are listed according to their scheduled activity classification, fee-based activity classification and the scale of the operation.

Unless otherwise further restricted by a condition of this licence, the scale at which the activity is carried out must not exceed the maximum scale specified in this condition.

A3 Information supplied to the EPA

A3.1 Works and activities must be carried out in accordance with the proposal contained in the licence application, except as expressly provided by a condition of this licence.

In this condition the reference to "the licence application" includes a reference to:

- a) the applications for any licences (including former pollution control approvals) which this licence replaces under the Protection of the Environment Operations (Savings and Transitional) Regulation 1998; and
- b) the licence information form provided by the licensee to the EPA to assist the EPA in connection with the issuing of this licence.

2 Discharges to Air and Water and Applications to Land

P1 Location of monitoring/discharge points and areas



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P1.1 The following points referred to in the table below are identified in this licence for the purposes of weather and/or noise monitoring and/or setting limits for the emission of noise from the premises.

3 Limit Conditions

L1 Pollution of waters

L1.1 Except as may be expressly provided in any other condition of this licence, the licensee must comply with section 120 of the Protection of the Environment Operations Act 1997.

L1.2 Any water that has come in contact with waste, or any hardstand area of the Premises must not be discharged from the Premises at any time.

L1.3 The licensee must ensure that there is sufficient water storage capacity to prevent the discharge of water from the Premises in the event of rainfall.

Note: The licensee must ensure that sufficient water storage capacity is maintained in order to comply with the conditions of the licence. This may include disposal of waste water to liquid waste treatment facilities if required.

L2 Waste

L2.1 The licensee must not cause, permit or allow any waste to be received at the premises, except the wastes expressly referred to in the column titled “Waste” and meeting the definition, if any, in the column titled “Description” in the table below.

Any waste received at the premises must only be used for the activities referred to in relation to that waste in the column titled “Activity” in the table below.

Any waste received at the premises is subject to those limits or conditions, if any, referred to in relation to that waste contained in the column titled “Other Limits” in the table below.

This condition does not limit any other conditions in this licence.

L2.2 The authorised amount of waste permitted on the premises cannot exceed 8,000 tonnes at any one time.

L2.3 The quantity of material to be received at the Premises must not exceed 199,000 tonnes in any 12 month period.



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L3 Noise limits

L3.1 Noise generated at the premises that is measured at each noise monitoring point established under this licence must not exceed the noise levels specified in Column 4 of the table below for that point during the corresponding time periods specified in Column 1 when measured using the corresponding measurement parameters listed in Column 2.

L3.2 The LAFmax limit for Day is further limited by condition L3.7 of this Licence.

L3.3 For the purposes of condition L3.1:

- a) Morning Shoulder means the period from 6am to 7am Monday to Saturday and the period from 6am to 8am Sunday and public holidays.
- b) Day means the period from 7am to 6pm Monday to Saturday and the period from 8am to 6pm Sunday and public holidays.

L3.4 The noise limits set out in condition L3.1 apply under the following meteorological conditions:

Morning Shoulder Period	Stability Categories A, B, C and D with wind speeds up to and including 0.5m/s at 10m above ground level

L3.5 For those meteorological conditions not referred to in condition L3.4, the noise limits that apply are the noise limits in condition L3.1 plus 5dB.

L3.6 For the purposes of condition L3.4:

a) The meteorological conditions are to be determined from meteorological data obtained from the meteorological weather station identified as NSW Office of Environment and Heritage automated weather station in Chullora.

b) Stability category shall be determined using the following method from Fact Sheet D of the Noise Policy for Industry (NSW EPA, 2017):

i. Use of sigma-theta data (section D1.4).

L3.7 To assess compliance:

a) with the LAeq(15 minutes) or the LAmax noise limits in condition L3.1 and L3.4, the noise measurement equipment must be located:

(i) approximately on the property boundary, where any residence is situated 30 metres or less from the property boundary closest to the premises; or where applicable,

(ii) in an area within 30 metres of a residence façade, but not closer than 3 metres where any residence on the property is situated more than 30 metres from the property boundary closest to the premises; or, where applicable,

(iii) in an area within 50 metres of the boundary of a National Park or Nature Reserve,

(iv) at any other location identified in condition L3.1,

b) with the LAeq(15 minutes) or the LAmax noise limits in condition L3.1 and L3.4, the noise measurement equipment must be located:

(i) at the reasonably most affected point at a location where there is no residence at the location; or,

(ii) at the reasonably most affected point within an area at a location prescribed by condition L3.7(a),

c) the LAFmax noise limit applicable during the daytime in L3.1 must not be exceeded by more than one instance during any daytime period as defined in condition L3.3.

L3.8 A non-compliance of conditions L3.1 and L3.4 will still occur where noise generated from the premises is measured in excess of the noise limit at a point other than the reasonably most affected point at the locations referred to in condition L3.7(a) or L3.7(b).

NOTE to L3.7 and L3.8: the reasonably most affected point is a point at a location or within an area at a location experiencing or expected to experience the highest sound pressure level from the premises.

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L3.9 For the purpose of determining the noise generated from the premises, the modifying factor corrections in Table C1 in Fact Sheet C of the Noise Policy for Industry (NSW EPA, 2017) may be applied, if appropriate, to the noise measurements by the noise monitoring equipment.

L3.10 Noise measurements must not be undertaken where rain or wind speed at microphone level will affect the acquisition of valid measurements.

Noise Management and Traffic Management

L3.11 The Licensee must prepare and implement a Noise Management Plan that covers all premises based activities and transport operations. The plan must include (but need not be limited to):

- a) all measures necessary to satisfy the limits in Table L3.1 at all times;
- b) a system that allows for periodic assessment of Best Management Practice (BMP) and Best Available Technology Economically Achievable (BATEA) that has the potential to minimise noise levels from the premises;
- c) effective implementation of identified BMP and BATEA measures, where considered feasible and reasonable;
- d) measures to monitor noise performance and respond to complaints;
- e) measures for community consultation including site contact details;
- f) noise monitoring and reporting procedures.

L3.12 A Traffic Noise Management Strategy (TNMS) must be developed by the Licensee and provided to the EPA within 21 days of the issuing of this Licence, to ensure that feasible and reasonable noise management strategies for vehicle movements associated with the premises are identified and applied, that include (but are not necessarily limited to) the following:

- driver training to ensure that noisy practices such as the use of compression engine brakes are not unnecessarily used near sensitive receivers;
- best noise practice in the selection and maintenance of vehicle fleets;
- movement scheduling where practicable to reduce impacts during sensitive times of the day;
- communication and management strategies for non licensee owned and operated vehicles to ensure the provision of the TNMS are implemented;
- a system of audited management practices that identifies non conformances, initiates and monitors corrective and preventative action (including disciplinary action for breaches of noise minimisation procedures) and assesses the implementation and improvement of the TNMS;
- specific procedures for drivers to minimise impacts at identified sensitive receivers;
- clauses in conditions of employment, or in contracts, of drivers that require adherence to the noise minimisation procedures and facilitate effective implementation of the disciplinary actions for breaches of the procedures.

Note: Additional definitions

- Noise Policy for Industry - the document entitled "*Noise Policy for Industry*" published by the NSW Environment Protection Authority in October 2017.
- Noise – 'sound pressure levels' for the purposes of conditions L3.1 to L3.12.
- LAeq (15 minute) - the value of the A-weighted sound pressure level of a continuous steady sound that, over a 15 minute time interval, has the same mean square sound pressure level as a sound under consideration



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with a level that varies with time (Australian Standard 1055:2018 *Acoustics: description and measurement of environmental noise*).

- LAFmax – the maximum sound pressure level of an event measured with a sound level meter satisfying Standards Australia 2004, AS IEC 61672.1:2004 *Electroacoustics – Sound level meters – Part 1: Specifications* set to ‘A’ frequency weighting and fast time weighting.

L4 Hours of operation

L4.1 Activities at the premises may only occur at the following times:

4 Operating Conditions

O1 Activities must be carried out in a competent manner

O1.1 Licensed activities must be carried out in a competent manner.

This includes:

- a) the processing, handling, movement and storage of materials and substances used to carry out the activity; and
- b) the treatment, storage, processing, reprocessing, transport and disposal of waste generated by the activity.

O2 Maintenance of plant and equipment

O2.1 All plant and equipment installed at the premises or used in connection with the licensed activity:

- a) must be maintained in a proper and efficient condition; and
- b) must be operated in a proper and efficient manner.

O3 Other operating conditions

Air Quality

- O3.1 The premises must be maintained in a condition which minimises or prevents the emission of air pollutants, including dust, from the premises.
- O3.2 All operations and activities occurring at the premises must be carried out in a manner that will prevent and/or minimise the emission of air pollutants, including dust, from the premises.

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- O3.3 Emission of air pollutants from combustion of diesel in plant and equipment must be minimised as far as practical.
- O3.4 Any mobile diesel combustion plant and equipment purchased after the date of issue of this Licence must achieve a particulate matter emission performance consistent with US EPA Tier 4 (or better), unless not feasible and otherwise approved in writing by the EPA.
- O3.5 Material received at the premises must be stored within bunkers that are enclosed on three sides.
- O3.6 Material storage pile height must be no greater than the height of the lowest side of the stockpile bunker.
- O3.7 No crushing or screening of material is permitted to be undertaken at the premises.
- O3.8 The Licensee must not cause or permit the emission of offensive odour beyond the boundary of the premises.

Note: Section 129 of the *Protection of the Environment Operations Act 1997* provides that the Licensee must not cause or permit the emission of offensive odour beyond the boundary of the premises but provides a defence if the emission is identified in the relevant environment protection licence as a potentially offensive odour and the odour was emitted in accordance with the conditions of a licence directed at minimising odour.

No condition of this licence identifies a potentially offensive odour for the purposes of Section 129 of the *Protection of the Environment Operations Act 1997*.

Code of conduct

- O3.9 The Licensee must comply with the Code of Conduct established for the premises, dated 18 February 2020 (EPA ref: DOC20/128797).

If the staff members listed in the Code of Conduct change in the future, the Licensee must provide an updated Code of Conduct to the EPA within 5 business days.

5 Monitoring and Recording Conditions

M1 Monitoring records

- M1.1 The results of any monitoring required to be conducted by this licence or a load calculation protocol must be recorded and retained as set out in this condition.
- M1.2 All records required to be kept by this licence must be:
 - a) in a legible form, or in a form that can readily be reduced to a legible form;
 - b) kept for at least 4 years after the monitoring or event to which they relate took place; and
 - c) produced in a legible form to any authorised officer of the EPA who asks to see them.
- M1.3 The following records must be kept in respect of any samples required to be collected for the purposes of this licence:
 - a) the date(s) on which the sample was taken;
 - b) the time(s) at which the sample was collected;

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- c) the point at which the sample was taken; and
- d) the name of the person who collected the sample.

M2 Recording of pollution complaints

- M2.1 The licensee must keep a legible record of all complaints made to the licensee or any employee or agent of the licensee in relation to pollution arising from any activity to which this licence applies.
- M2.2 The record must include details of the following:
- a) the date and time of the complaint;
 - b) the method by which the complaint was made;
 - c) any personal details of the complainant which were provided by the complainant or, if no such details were provided, a note to that effect;
 - d) the nature of the complaint;
 - e) the action taken by the licensee in relation to the complaint, including any follow-up contact with the complainant; and
 - f) if no action was taken by the licensee, the reasons why no action was taken.
- M2.3 The record of a complaint must be kept for at least 4 years after the complaint was made.
- M2.4 The record must be produced to any authorised officer of the EPA who asks to see them.

M3 Telephone complaints line

- M3.1 The licensee must operate during its operating hours a telephone complaints line for the purpose of receiving any complaints from members of the public in relation to activities conducted at the premises or by the vehicle or mobile plant, unless otherwise specified in the licence.
- M3.2 The licensee must notify the public of the complaints line telephone number and the fact that it is a complaints line so that the impacted community knows how to make a complaint.
- M3.3 The preceding two conditions do not apply until 24 hours after the date of the issue of this licence.

M4 Noise monitoring

- M4.1 Attended noise monitoring must be undertaken in accordance with Condition L3.7 and must:
- a) occur quarterly for a period of one year in the first reporting period and every six months in each reporting period thereafter;
 - b) occur during each day and morning shoulder period as defined in the Noise Policy for Industry for a minimum of:
 - 30 minutes during the day; and
 - 15 minutes during the morning shoulder period.

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c) occur for three consecutive operating days.

6 Reporting Conditions

R1 Annual return documents

R1.1 The licensee must complete and supply to the EPA an Annual Return in the approved form comprising:

1. a Statement of Compliance,
2. a Monitoring and Complaints Summary,
3. a Statement of Compliance - Licence Conditions,
4. a Statement of Compliance - Load based Fee,
5. a Statement of Compliance - Requirement to Prepare Pollution Incident Response Management Plan,
6. a Statement of Compliance - Requirement to Publish Pollution Monitoring Data; and
7. a Statement of Compliance - Environmental Management Systems and Practices.

At the end of each reporting period, the EPA will provide to the licensee notification that the Annual Return is due.

R1.2 An Annual Return must be prepared in respect of each reporting period, except as provided below.

Note: The term "reporting period" is defined in the dictionary at the end of this licence. Do not complete the Annual Return until after the end of the reporting period.

R1.3 Where this licence is transferred from the licensee to a new licensee:

- a) the transferring licensee must prepare an Annual Return for the period commencing on the first day of the reporting period and ending on the date the application for the transfer of the licence to the new licensee is granted; and
- b) the new licensee must prepare an Annual Return for the period commencing on the date the application for the transfer of the licence is granted and ending on the last day of the reporting period.

Note: An application to transfer a licence must be made in the approved form for this purpose.

R1.4 Where this licence is surrendered by the licensee or revoked by the EPA or Minister, the licensee must prepare an Annual Return in respect of the period commencing on the first day of the reporting period and ending on:

- a) in relation to the surrender of a licence - the date when notice in writing of approval of the surrender is given; or
- b) in relation to the revocation of the licence - the date from which notice revoking the licence operates.

R1.5 The Annual Return for the reporting period must be supplied to the EPA via eConnect *EPA* or by registered post not later than 60 days after the end of each reporting period or in the case of a transferring licence not later than 60 days after the date the transfer was granted (the 'due date').

R1.6 The licensee must retain a copy of the Annual Return supplied to the EPA for a period of at least 4 years after the Annual Return was due to be supplied to the EPA.

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- R1.7 Within the Annual Return, the Statements of Compliance must be certified and the Monitoring and Complaints Summary must be signed by:
- a) the licence holder; or
 - b) by a person approved in writing by the EPA to sign on behalf of the licence holder.

R2 Notification of environmental harm

- R2.1 Notifications must be made by telephoning the Environment Line service on 131 555.

Note: The licensee or its employees must notify all relevant authorities of incidents causing or threatening material harm to the environment immediately after the person becomes aware of the incident in accordance with the requirements of Part 5.7 of the Act.

- R2.2 The licensee must provide written details of the notification to the EPA within 7 days of the date on which they became aware of the incident.

R3 Written report

- R3.1 Where an authorised officer of the EPA suspects on reasonable grounds that:
- a) where this licence applies to premises, an event has occurred at the premises; or
 - b) where this licence applies to vehicles or mobile plant, an event has occurred in connection with the carrying out of the activities authorised by this licence,
- and the event has caused, is causing or is likely to cause material harm to the environment (whether the harm occurs on or off premises to which the licence applies), the authorised officer may request a written report of the event.
- R3.2 The licensee must make all reasonable inquiries in relation to the event and supply the report to the EPA within such time as may be specified in the request.
- R3.3 The request may require a report which includes any or all of the following information:
- a) the cause, time and duration of the event;
 - b) the type, volume and concentration of every pollutant discharged as a result of the event;
 - c) the name, address and business hours telephone number of employees or agents of the licensee, or a specified class of them, who witnessed the event;
 - d) the name, address and business hours telephone number of every other person (of whom the licensee is aware) who witnessed the event, unless the licensee has been unable to obtain that information after making reasonable effort;
 - e) action taken by the licensee in relation to the event, including any follow-up contact with any complainants;
 - f) details of any measure taken or proposed to be taken to prevent or mitigate against a recurrence of such an event; and
 - g) any other relevant matters.
- R3.4 The EPA may make a written request for further details in relation to any of the above matters if it is not satisfied with the report provided by the licensee. The licensee must provide such further details to the EPA within the time specified in the request.

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R4 Other reporting conditions

Noise Monitoring Report

- R4.1 A noise compliance assessment report must be submitted to the EPA within 30 days of the completion of the monitoring in M61. The assessment must be prepared by a suitably qualified and experienced acoustical consultant and include:
- a) an assessment of compliance with noise limits presented in Condition L3.1 and L3.4; and
 - b) an outline of any management actions taken within the monitoring period to address any exceedances of the limits contained in Condition L3.1 and L3.4.
- R4.2 The EPA will evaluate the need for a daytime LAFmax noise limit in L3.1 following a review of the quarterly noise monitoring reports at the end of the first reporting period.

7 General Conditions

G1 Copy of licence kept at the premises or plant

- G1.1 A copy of this licence must be kept at the premises to which the licence applies.
- G1.2 The licence must be produced to any authorised officer of the EPA who asks to see it.
- G1.3 The licence must be available for inspection by any employee or agent of the licensee working at the premises.

8 Special Conditions

E1 Financial assurance

- E1.1 A financial assurance in the form of an unconditional and irrevocable and on demand guarantee from a bank, building society or credit union operating in Australia as "Authorised Deposit-taking Institutions" under the Banking Act 1959 of the Commonwealth of Australia and supervised by the Australian Prudential Regulatory Authority (APRA) must be provided to the EPA within 5 days of the issuing of this Licence. The financial assurance must be in favour of the EPA for a total amount to be held by the EPA of three hundred and fifty thousand dollars (\$350,000.00). The financial assurance is required to secure or guarantee funding for works or programs required by or under this licence. The financial assurance must contain a term that provides that any monies claimed can be paid to the EPA or, at the written direction of the EPA, to any other person.
- E1.2 The EPA may claim on a financial assurance under s303 of the POEO Act if a licensee fails to carry out any work or program required to comply with the conditions of this licence.
- E1.3 The financial assurance must be maintained during the operation of the facility and thereafter until such time as the EPA is satisfied the premises is environmentally secure.

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- E1.4 The financial assurance must be replenished by the full amount claimed or realised if the EPA has claimed on or realised the financial assurance or any part of it to undertake a work or program required to be carried out by the licence which has not been undertaken by the licence holder.
- E1.5 The EPA may require an increase in the amount of the financial assurance at any time as a result of reassessment of the total likely costs and expenses of rehabilitation of the premises.

E2 Environmental obligations of Licensee

- E2.1 While the licensee's premises are being used for the purpose to which the licence relates, the licensee must:
 - a) Clean up any spill, leak or other discharge of any waste(s) or other material(s) as soon as practicable after it becomes known to the licensee or to one of the licensee's employees or agents.
 - b) In the event(s) that any liquid and non-liquid waste(s) is unlawfully deposited on the premises, such waste(s) must be removed and lawfully disposed of as soon as practicable or in accordance with any direction given by the EPA.
 - c) Provide all monitoring data as required by the conditions of this licence or as directed by the EPA.
- E2.2 In the event of an earthquake, storm, fire, flood or any other event where it is reasonable to suspect that a pollution incident has occurred, is occurring or is likely to occur, the licensee (whether or not the premises continue to be used for the purposes to which the licence relates) must:
 - a) make all efforts to contain all firewater on the licensee's premises,
 - b) make all efforts to control air pollution from the licensee's premises,
 - c) make all efforts to contain any discharge, spill or run-off from the licensee's premises,
 - d) make all efforts to prevent flood water entering the licensee's premises,
 - e) remediate and rehabilitate any exposed areas of soil and/or waste,
 - f) lawfully dispose of all liquid and solid waste(s) stored on the premises that is not already securely disposed of,
 - g) at the request of the EPA monitor groundwater beneath the licensee's premises and its potential to migrate from the licensee's premises,
 - h) at the request of the EPA monitor surface water leaving the licensee's premises; and
 - i) ensure the licensee's premises is secure.
