RE: Proposed Lucas Heights Resource Recovery Park (Proposed Development) – Letter of Support

We understand that SITA Australia (SITA) intend to lodge a major project application in relation to the Proposed Development.

ANSTO is the owner of a significant portion of the land which is the subject of the Proposed Development as shown on the attached figure. ANSTO is currently negotiating with SITA the leasing arrangements that will apply if the Proposed Development proceeds.

Whilst ANSTO will not be in a position to consent to the development application until the leasing arrangements are agreed with SITA, ANSTO has no objection to the undertaking of an EIS for the Proposed Development.

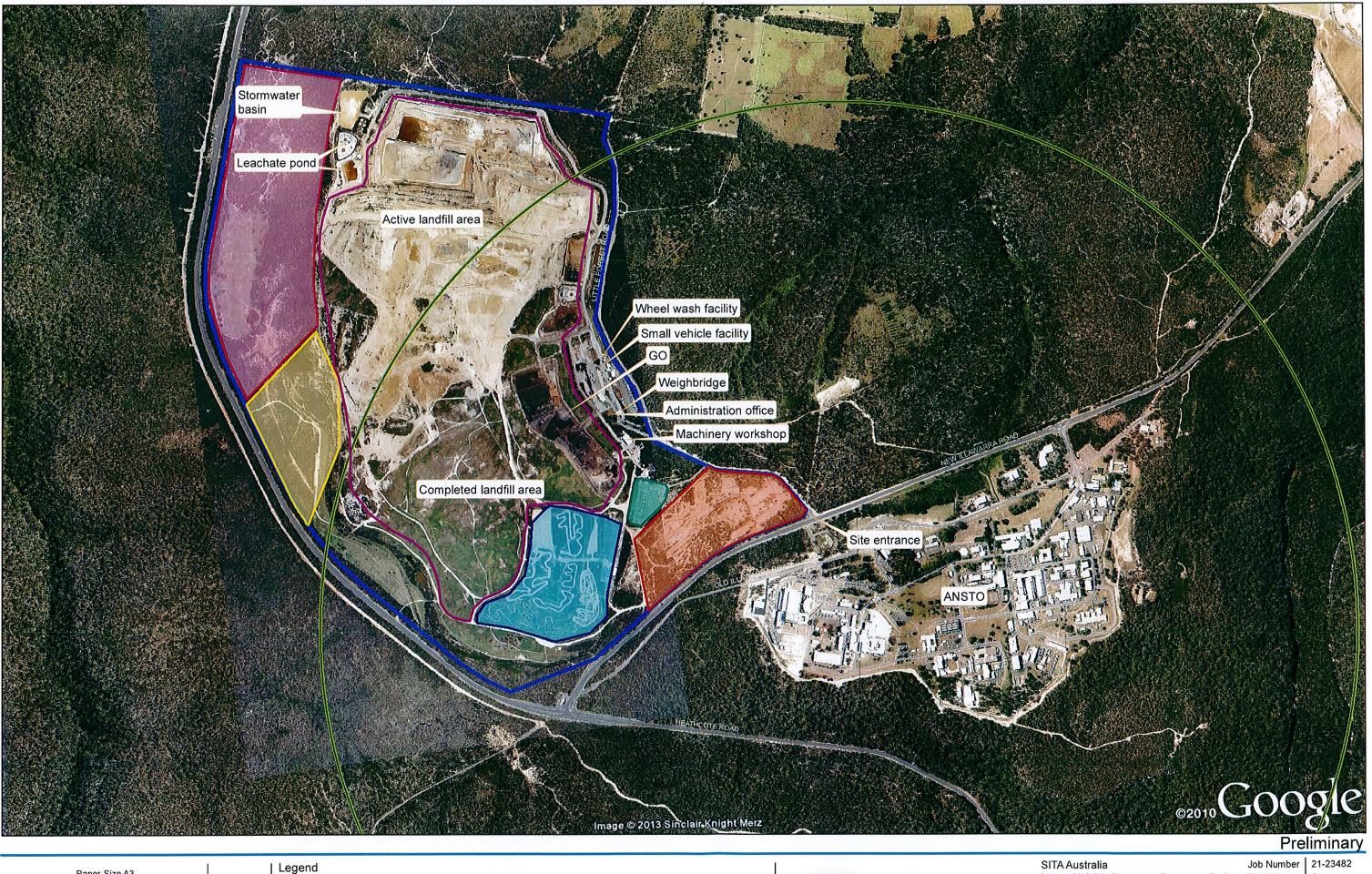
ANSTO anticipates that as a landowner, it would be further consulted during the EIS process and as the results of the environmental impact assessments become available.

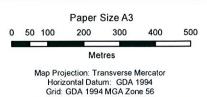
