Technology

A strong public domain offer recognises the broadening requirements of workplaces. Both inside and outside of work hours, the landscape surrounding workplaces are an immeasurable asset, which seeks to attract the most innovative companies to the precinct.

One of the primary objectives of the public domain, therefore, is to create places which facilitate innovation and the ability to promote working and socialising in the landscape. Flexible and engaging landscape elements such as garden rooms, open areas of turf and deck, work booths amongst planting and loose furniture under shade canopies provide workers and the wider community a diverse and unique range of opportunities for recreation and work activities.

The co-location of work and non-work related programs foster creative and new ways of working and socialising.

Richness of landscape experiences is also key, with a focus on high quality materials and creating a variety of versatile spaces which cater for varied uses. Individual tables, large communal benches, wi-fi and power are located within key open spaces – Innovation Plaza, Village Square and along Locomotive Street.

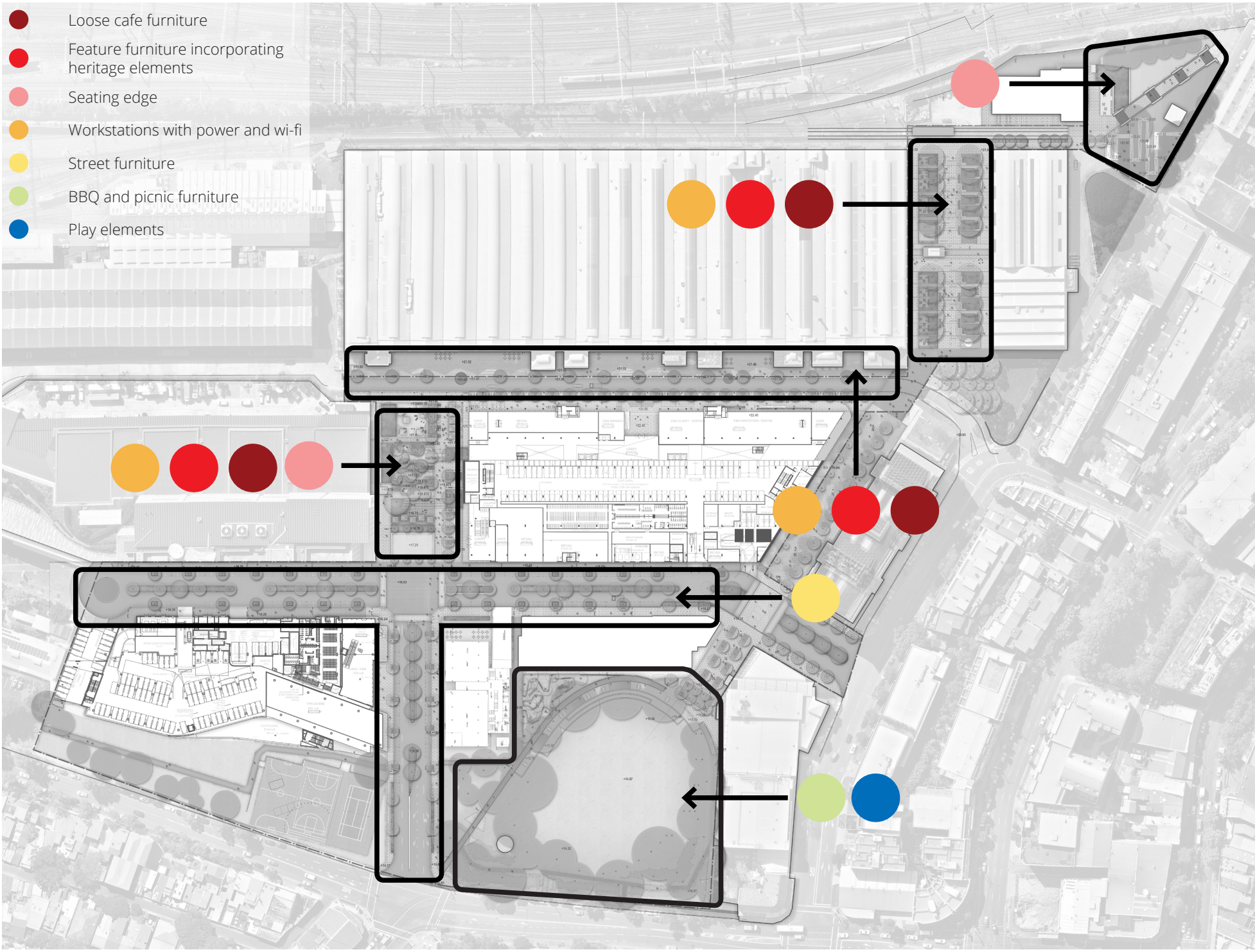

Public Furniture



Public furniture is critical to the proposal - allowing the site be activated and programmed throughout the week, in and out of working hours.

A generous public furniture overlay includes fixed and loose cafe seating, street furniture and feature furniture showcasing the site's heritage assets. Outdoor working is encouraged and facilitated through outdoor wi-fi, integrated power-points in communal tables and shade structures.

Heritage Interpretation



The rich heritage character of the site provides many opportunities to celebrate the Locomotive Workshops and the site's industrial character through incorporating the following principles;

- Incorporate heritage artefacts in a **meaningful** way, **encouraging engagement** with the site's history
- **Complement and amplify** the site's heritage material palette through new selections
- Utilise existing and heritage artefacts to showcase the site as a place which has **developed** over time

The potential heritage interpretation ideas will be carefully considered with the advice of various heritage archaeological consultants to ensure interpretation is done in a manner which celebrates and pays homage to the heritage significance of ATP. We also see this as an opportunity to work with public artists so that interpretation is done in a creative and unique manner.

Heritage Interpretation | Opportunities
