Understorey Planting



A variety of native and exotic plants are used within the precinct as low understorey street planting in verges or blisters, and mass planting within garden areas of parks and plazas.

The selection of plant palette is based on low water use, hardiness to local climatic conditions, of low height to maintain sightlines, and colour and seasonal variation through flowers/ foliage.

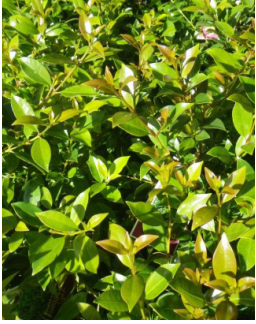
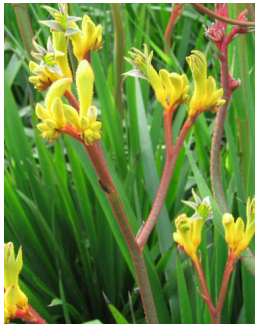
- Type 1** - Low, hardy mass planting to base of trees

- Type 3** - Sensory childrens garden with fragrant and textural planting

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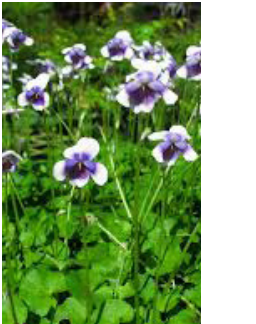
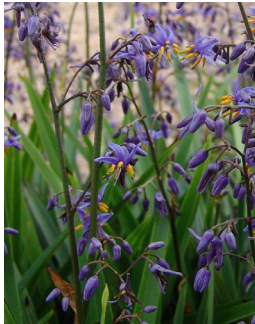

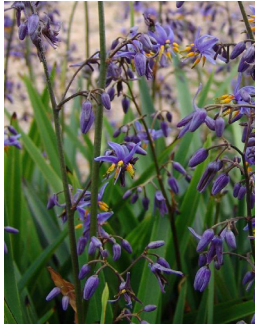

Village Square

Village Square is the primary outdoor work hub within ATP, with generous upgrades to the existing terraced landscape. A variety of scales of spaces within Village Square allows for a range of groups to gather. The landscape rooms encourage progressive work-place practices; work pods incorporate external wi-fi and power outlets, bleacher seating and flexible stage area allow for outdoor meetings and presentations and seating edges amongst planting allow for respite from the office.

Outside of the working week, Village Square offers a unique recreational space with table tennis tables and a garden retreat within the precinct and greater local area.

The existing landscape, primarily over basement, is upgraded to include a new tree canopy of feature trees, a range of recreational and outdoor working furniture and lush planting.

Village Square landscape elements include;

- Small garden rooms with timber decking (1) and outdoor cafe furniture (2)
- Lush planting within timber, concrete and steel walls (3), timber seating edges (4) and new feature trees (5)
- Existing lawn area with lounge seats and shade umbrellas (6)
- Outdoor work pods including communal tables (7) with integrated power and wi-fi set amongst lush planting (8)
- Outdoor dining spilling out from adjacent cafe (9)
- Timber amphitheatre seating (10) for large presentations, meetings and events with flexible timber stage (11)
- Large feature tree (12)
- Raised turf area with seating edge (13)
- Existing brick paving (14), planters with trees (15) and brick stairs (16)
