

West – New Line Road – From the west the range of hills are clearly prominent and form a heavily wooded backdrop to the William River basin. The river basin is generally flat and used for agricultural purposes with scattered rural residential properties. Similar to the existing quarry the new quarry site sits behind a series of foreground ridge lines that mask the excavation operations.

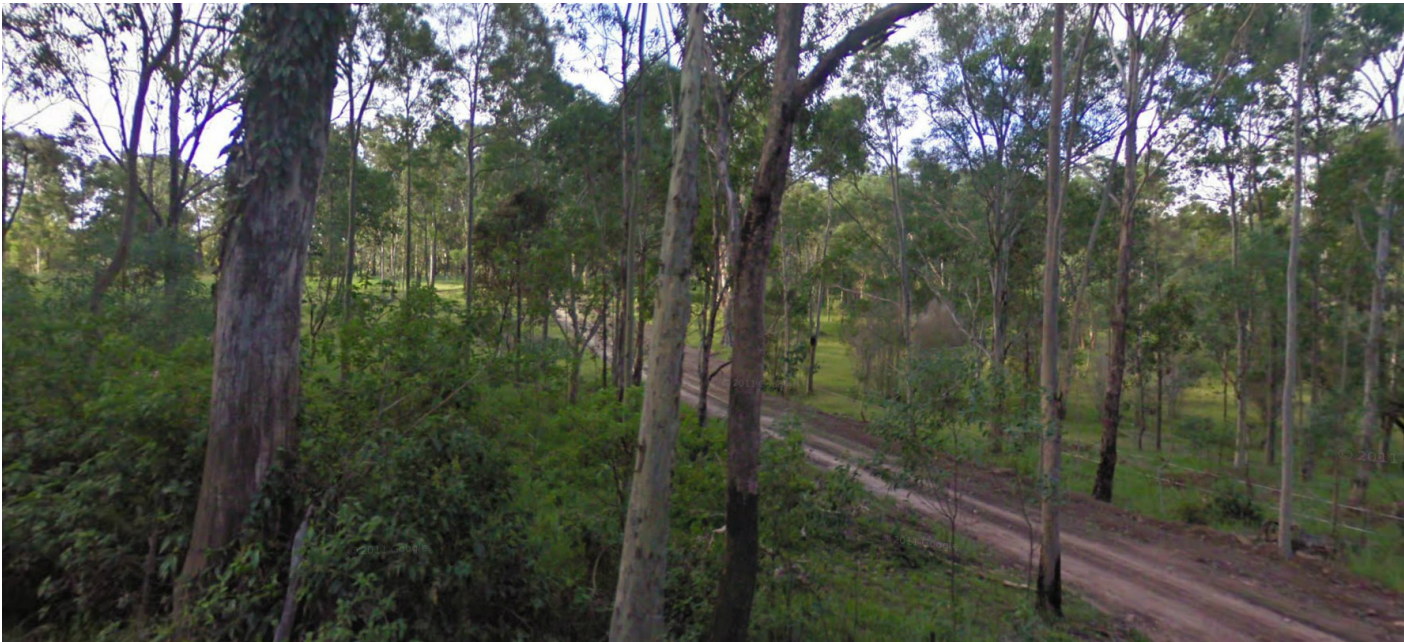


South – Six Mile Road – From the western end of Six Mile Road the hills become intermittently obscured by the rolling topography of the agricultural land. Continuing to the east dense vegetation lines the majority of the road to the Pacific Highway. Vegetation increases up the slopes of the hills within the rural properties.

East – Pacific Highway – The hills are barely perceptible from the Pacific Highway. Dense vegetation along the highway that extends west throughout the adjacent properties masks long views to the site. The site and the hills themselves are essentially hidden from the east and the visual impact of from this direction is basically nil.

North – Italia Road – Topography and dense vegetation do not allow for long views to the site for the length of Italia Road. Only from the entrance to the quarry site can a distant view to a ridge line be viewed.
