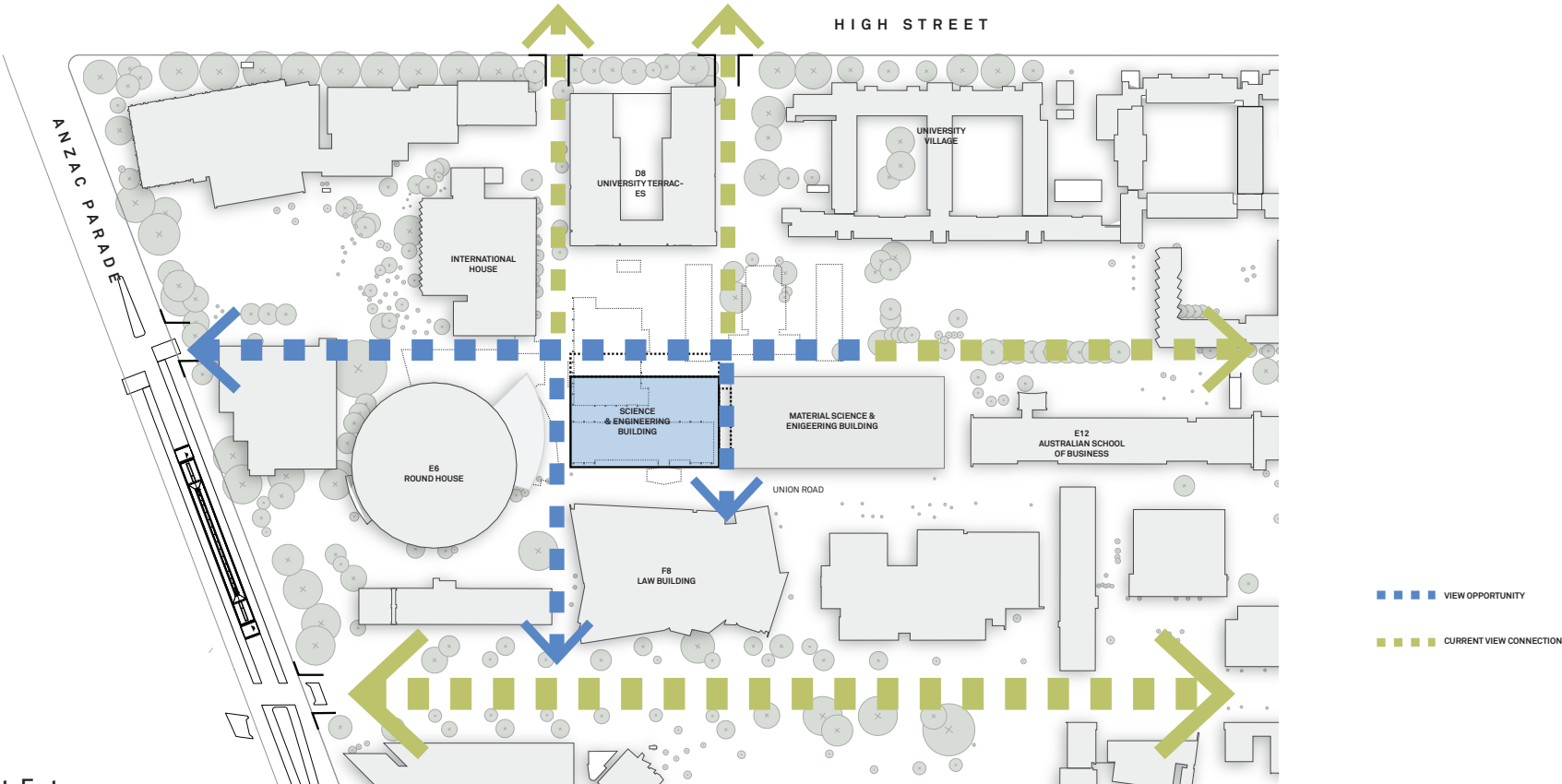
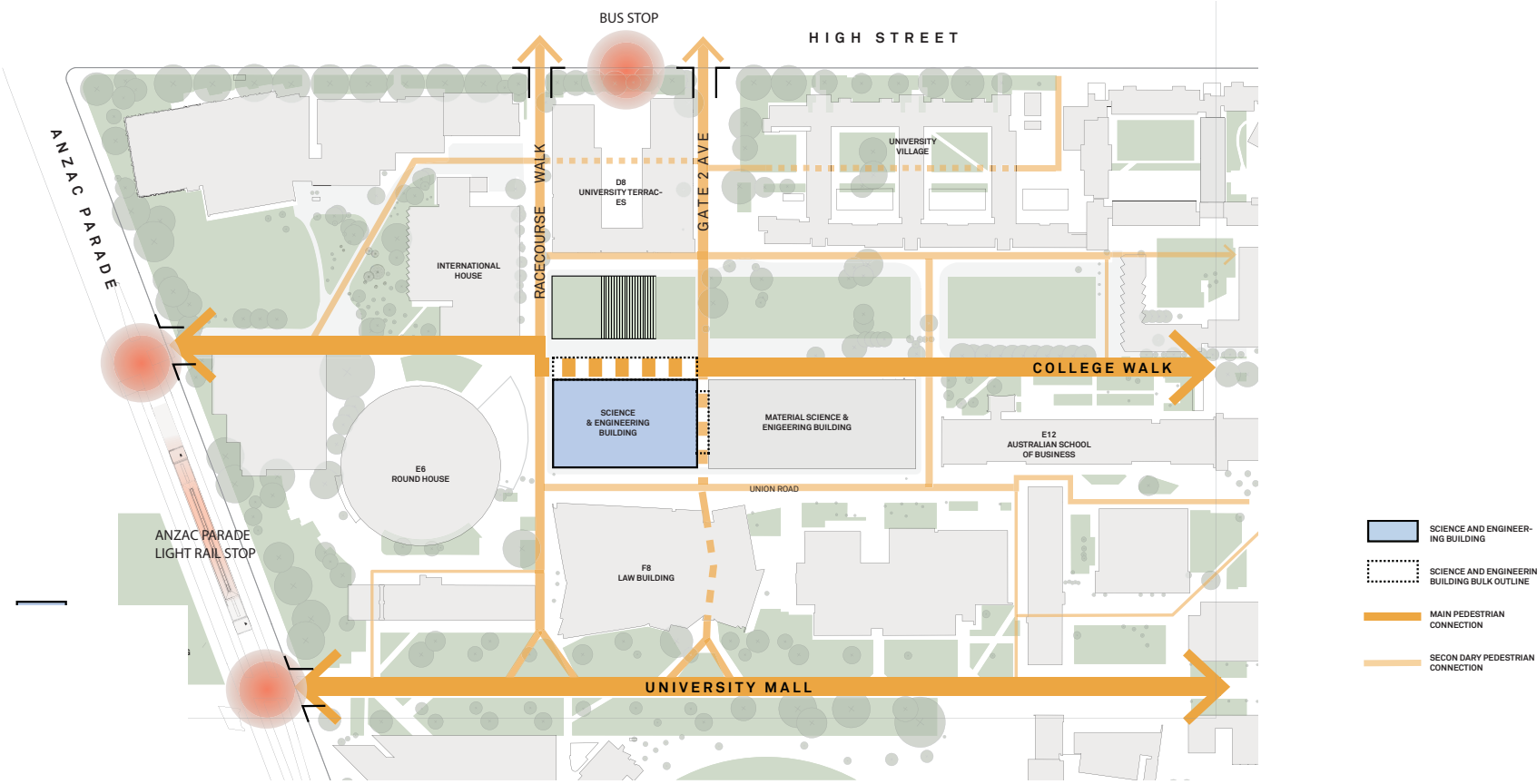

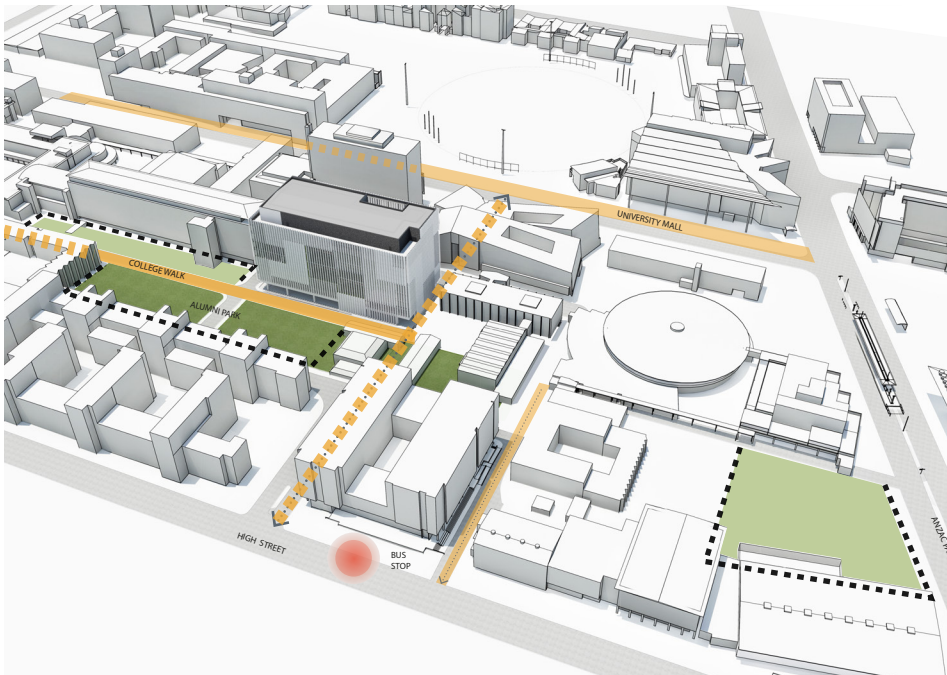
Urban Design Strategy

SITE IN FUTURE CONTEXT - COLLEGE WALK

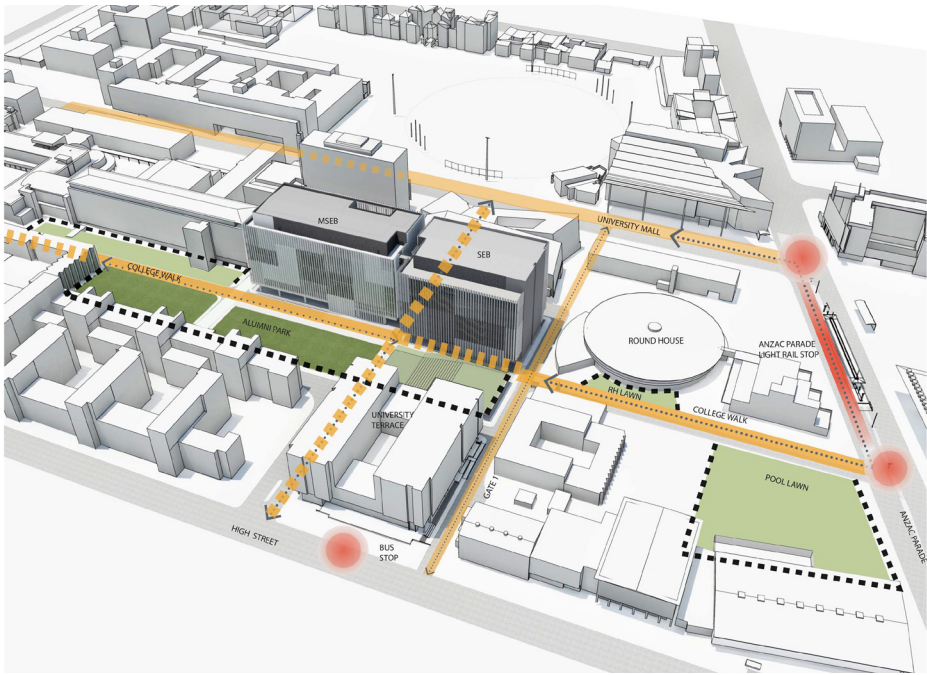
The proposed building fits within a new framework that establishes a clear pedestrian connection from the lower campus to the upper campus along the front of the Australian Business School. Integrated courtyards through the University are a strong heritage feature that contribute to the unique sense of UNSW Kensington campus. Whilst the various landscaped spaces along College Walk differ greatly in size, scale, orientation, and landscape techniques used, they greatly increase the amenity offer to the University's students, academic staff, and visitors alike. College Walk forms the central spine to this area and is unique to the lower campus. The new Light Rail Stop on Anzac Parade will provide the starting point to College Walk that continues through the new development as a colonnade.

Aside from College Walk, access points to the new building will dictate the character and concentration of activity and pedestrian traffic in the new precinct. Accessing the teaching spaces directly from College Walk establishes a strong relationship with the future context while the main building entrance to the East at the interface with the Material and Science and Engineering Building strengthens the collaboration between the research occupants of both buildings. The secondary entrance on Third Avenue provides a designated entry point for theatre guests and enables spatial and acoustic separation from the teaching spaces.

The primacy of College Walk allows a secondary East-West connection from Gate 2 to the Mall. This N-S passage way will be frequently used by students arriving by bus at the high street stop.

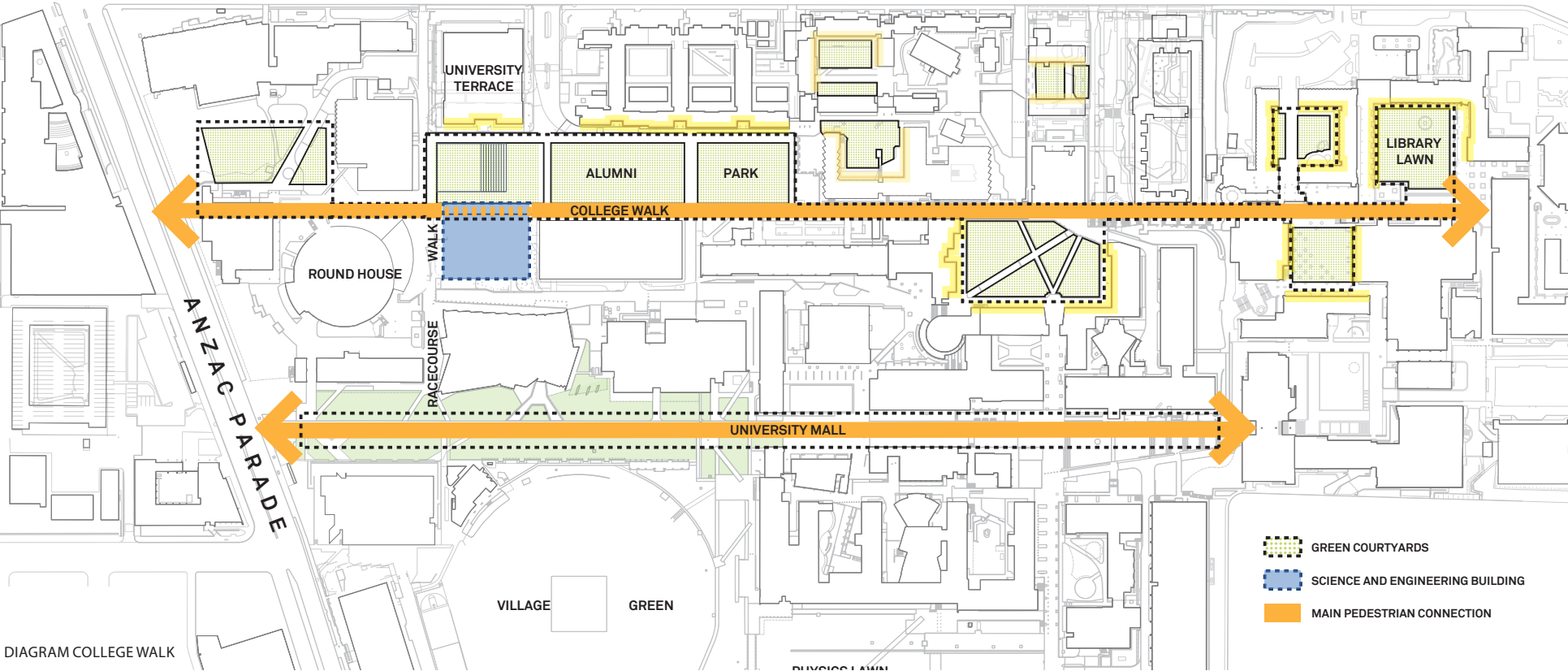
