Erected by builders and brickmakers John Bakewell and William Bakewell in 1885 as part of the terrace between No. 124 and 131 Darlington Road, the house remained in the ownership of the Bakewell family until 1922 when it was transferred to grocer Walter Richard Mannall. Mannall also acquired the other houses in the terrace at this time. In 1926 the house together with the other houses in the terrace was acquired by labourer Joseph Mainey. The tenants in this period were Edward A Goggin (1886), George Hooper, clerk (1887-88), John E Bates (1889), Robert Bultitude, constable (1890-96), James Perryman (1900), Thomas Wrigley (1901), William Lawson (1902-04), Charles Lowe (1907), John Bligh (1909), Mrs Constance Bligh, domestic duties (1910-16), Mrs Mary Field (1917), Arthur Billin, public servant (1918-26), M. Green (1928-29) and Hector Joyce (1930-32). The 1947 electoral roll suggests the premises was a boarding house given the multiple occupancy of Quida Margaret Baker, process worker, Frank Gordon, labourer and his wife Florence, William Henry Lohmann, motor mechanic and his wife Barbara and George Gordon Manning, process worker.

In 1950 the house, together with the other houses in the terrace, was acquired by widow Pearl Lillian Corrin of Ascot Vale, Victoria. The University of Sydney purchased the property in 1971 as part of its acquisition of the whole terrace.

In 1947 the house was the home of the owner of the terrace, Joseph Mainey, labourer, and his wife Mary.

In 1950 the house, together with the other houses in the terrace, was acquired by widow Pearl Lillian Corrin of Ascot Vale, Victoria. The University of Sydney purchased the property in 1971 as part of its acquisition of the whole terrace.

### **Physical Description**



Erected by builders and brickmakers John Bakewell and William Bakewell in 1885 as part of the terrace between No. 124 and 131 Darlington Road, the house remained in the ownership of the Bakewell family until 1922 when it was transferred to grocer Walter Richard Mannall. Mannall also acquired the other houses in the terrace. In 1926 the house together with the other houses in the terrace was acquired by labourer Joseph Mainey. The tenants in this period were James McMurtie, linen draper (1886-89), Mrs Bundy, nurses home (1890), Mrs White (1891-93), Mary Du Higg and Miss T. du Higg, dressmaker (1894), William Garner (1895-97), Mrs G. 
